“Is Open Access good for kids?” [issue 396]

We all agree that any student who can handle an AP or honors class should be able to take that class, but I have often wondered why so many people see total open access as the only way to address this issue. Why couldn't fine-tuning existing placement practices serve the same purpose? When I first came to BHHS 26 years ago, approximately 10-15% of the students took AP English. Changes in our placement policies more than doubled that number to 31%, higher than some schools that have open access.

The truth is that open access is not really designed to insure that any student who can handle an advanced class is in one. Rather, it is based on the mistaken “one-size-fits-all” notion that AP classes are better for everyone. However, recent research suggests that average students do not benefit significantly from participation in AP classes and that students who earn high grades in regular, college preparatory classes actually perform better in college than students who earn low grades in honor and AP classes. In

addition, significant questions have been raised about whether overloading students with advanced classes is a developmentally appropriate practice.

There is a significant risk that raising adolescent stress level beyond a certain point can lead to significant psychological and even physical problems.

We should constantly be refining our placement policies to insure that we are allowing entry to students who can really benefit from honors and AP classes. Yes, we could let everyone in and then kick out those students who don't perform well, a practice cited in the article, but at best that approach has the same result as a more limited access would have had in the first place.

At worst, such a practice sets the ejected students up for problems in the regular class which they are

entering five or six weeks late.

We must always remember that in education, one size does not fit all.

Proposed oil drilling stopped cold by Council

Council cites concerns over oil leak at another location

The Beverly Hills City Council voted 4 to 1 to deny Breitburn Energy Company's request for permits to re-drill two oil wells at the outer edge of the city on May 1. The decision was considered by some to be beneficial to the environment while to others it is detrimental to their pocketbooks.

The financial impact of the drilling halt raised concerns among the council because the wells generate revenue for the city. One barrel of gas from a Beverly Hills well selling at \$65 a barrel provides the city with \$0.12 in production and fees for the application. The total revenue generated by Breitburn's Beverly Hills oil wells last year was equivalent to about \$29,000.

"We had to decide if \$29,000 is worth the potential risk that we may placing on our city and future council that may lead to future drilling requests," Vice Mayor Barry Brucker said.

However, the city's revenue is not the only income affected by the halt. According to Gregory C. Brown, Executive Vice President and General Counsel at Breitburn, the company has nearly 800 royalty owners that live in Beverly Hills, collecting revenue to the tune of \$600,000 annually and this halt will reduce their royalties significantly. Royalty recipients

are current and former land owners who own the mineral rights to the land between Whitworth and Olympic Blvd.

"The royalties go to private land owners who own the minerals under their houses," Brown said. "We regularly mail out 800 checks to Beverly Hills land owners. Most of our operations are in LA. There are thousands there who are also negatively impacted if we aren't allowed to drill. Last year royalties paid to BH residents was about \$600,000 dollars. \$29,000 goes to the city from tax on the production and fees for the application."

Concerns arose over the possibility of a safety hazard from the drilling when Brucker noted fears that the February 20, 2006 surface leak at the Saint James Oil Company wells in downtown Los Angeles could be repeated in Beverly Hills.

The St. James leak was caused by corroded oil casings that, according to Brucker, should have been noticed by California Department of Conservation, Division of Oil, Gas and Geothermal Resources (DOGGR). The site of the leak, as well as the oil well sites in Beverly Hills, are under the supervision of DOGGR.

"[DOGGR] governs the quality control of oil wells and they are so incompetent and ineffectual that [the council] didn't have confi-

dence that they could truly regulate these facilities," Brucker said. "The St. James oil company was under DOGGR's regulations and they missed. It was what they called gross neglect and mismanagement. If DOGGR missed the problems downtown I don't have the confidence that they would protect Beverly Hills."

Brown noted that out of the approximately 75,000 oil wells currently operating in California, the incident in downtown LA was a one time event and would not likely occur in Beverly Hills.

Former Beverly Hills Mayor Mark Egerman also represents Breitburn on matters dealing with the city and spoke before the council.

Breitburn is one of three oil companies with licenses to drill under Beverly Hills. A recent lawsuit involving health concerns over Venoco Oil Company's well at Beverly High served to heighten apprehension in the community as to the safety and environmental impact of these wells, despite the suit's ruling in favor of Venoco.

"Real life suggests oil companies violate health and safety regulations," Ambassador Drive resident Jody Kleinman said at the meeting.

Jack West, the city's petroleum geologist, reported that he found no evidence that the proposed wells would endanger the property or safety of those living in Beverly Hills. A statement echoed by councilmember Linda Briskman.

"I think [the council's decision to halt the drilling] was more an emotional stand by the City Council," Briskman said.

Councilmember Briskman was the only council member to vote in favor of the proposed drilling.

"I voted for approval of the Breitburn permit because there was no scientific justification or safety question in my mind to cause me to deny it," Councilmember Briskman said. "This region is oil rich and loaded with

wells and reducing our dependence on foreign oil is a sound objective if it is safe."

The site in question technically lies in Los Angeles, located at the North side of Pico Blvd between Oakhurst and Doheny Drives, but at a depth of 5,500 feet for one well and 6,350 feet for another, they cross into Beverly Hills city limits.

Breitburn proposed plans to the council to re-drill the wells, first drilled in the late 1960's, to continue to utilize them before eventually abandoning the lower part of the well bores and replacing them in a different location.

The council's vote successfully blocked future drilling from occurring at the Breitburn site, which pleased some council members.

"This decision is quite significant," Brucker said. "Technically we blocked two new drilling sites, the effect of that is such that we are going to be delivered an ordinance at a future council meeting that would essentially block any new drilling. This council made a statement that we believe we are following the wishes of the community that feels like oil pumping may not be compatible with our long term goals."

The proposed ordinance to block all new drilling in Beverly Hills will be presented to the council by staff in a month or so.

"We're definitely hoping that the council will change its position as they look at this further and hear from residents that are negatively impacted," Brown said. "I think it is largely a matter of education to get them to change their minds. In the past these approvals have been very routine matters."

The vote taken by the council May 1 was in essence preliminary; the resolution to make the decision final is currently scheduled for the May 15 council meeting.

"I believe we haven't heard the end of this issue from our residents or Breitburn," Briskman said.

Liz Claman

You may recognize Beverly High class of '81 graduate, Liz Claman when you catch an episode of MSNBC's "Morning Call," but now the Emmy and Golden Mike Award-winning business reporter can add another occupation to her resume: author. Claman has written a book, *The Best Investment Advice I Ever*

"My friends would say to me, 'You are so lucky. You sit by extremely rich people every day and get advice on money'" Claman said. "And I thought why do I have access to this incredible advice when they don't?"

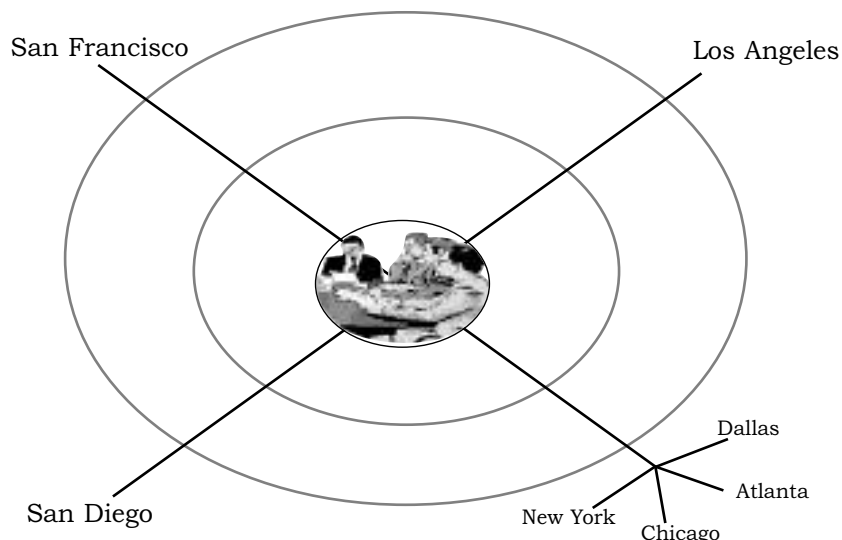

HAWTHORNE MURAL REMOVAL NIXED

Board of Education says city codes don't apply to schools

In a unanimous vote the Board of Education voted late Tuesday evening that the mural at Hawthorne School, which some North Rexford Drive residents feel is an eyesore, should remain intact.

In total two items were placed on the meeting's agenda regarding the issue, one to vote on the mural's removal and the other to set up a system of guidelines and requirements for signage at Beverly Hills schools in the future possibly aligning them with city requirements.

The item concerning a system of visual guidelines for school sites was never heard by the board because none of the Board members were willing to move or second the item, causing it to die on the agenda.

"The thing I said in my comments is that we don't discuss these things ahead of time but I thought it was an inappropriate motion and that

the schools wouldn't subject ourselves to city codes," Board of Education President John Millan said. "No one else [on the board] made comments, I'm assuming because no one really felt they had anything different to say than I."

It is rare for the board to deny to move and second an agenda item, at least providing for discussion.

"It is very dangerous for a board to be so insular and secretive," said North Rexford Drive resident Betsy Myers, who is spearheading the movement to remove the mural. "This raises the question of how persons or a group can put anything they want on school buildings or property as long as they get someone to go along with it without the board's knowledge or consent. That is a very dangerous precedent."

Myers spoke for three minutes before the board noting that there are the numerous com-

munity members who dislike the bright blue and yellow painting that faces her home, the mural's violation of city signage requirements, as well as the PTA and Board of Education's allegedly improper creation of the mural. At one point, Myers even volunteered to raise herself the money to pay for the mural's removal.

The mural in question was not approved by the Board of Education, violating school board policy 3312, which lists that business and non instructional operations contracts must "to be valid or to constitute an enforceable obligation against the District, all contracts must be approved or ratified by the Board of Education."

However the policy also states that "the Board may, by majority vote, delegate the power to enter into contracts on behalf of the District to the Superintendent or designee." The mural was approved by then interim superintendent John Fitzpatrick.

Millan noted during deliberations that the district had consulted their attorney who had informed them that school property does not need to follow any guidelines set forth by the city.

"We are a different government organization than the city," Millan said. "For instance when we build we are not subject to city building codes but we are to state building codes which have strict guidelines for school facilities. We are a separate government entity. The city is not subject to our rules and we are not to theirs."

The Board then read aloud over ten comment cards submitted before the meeting from several PTA parents in support of the mural. When Myers attempted to counter by reading the comments of residents who support the mural's removal, she was told to stop. No comments

from community members who do not support the mural were read at the meeting.

"Comment cards are to be submitted before the meeting," Millan said. "She is not there to provide testimony, the rules have always been the same if someone wants to submit something she needs to submit it to the front desk and I will read it. She can't read them aloud but she can submit them. The rules are posted. We don't make up these rules as we go. We try not to engage in a debate up there."

In the Weekly's previous coverage of the Hawthorne mural debate [issue #395], Mayor Jimmy Delshad, who coincidentally lives across the street from Hawthorne, said he felt the mural was "not fitting for Beverly Hills."

"I didn't feel like we needed to revisit that statement," Millan said of the mayor's comment, which was not read aloud at the meeting.

The City of Beverly Hills gives BHUSD approximately \$7 million a year to supplement their budget under the city's Joint Powers of Agreement with the Beverly Hills Unified.

"It's really a question of how the board views the community and their concerns," Myers said. "Apparently the board feels that they're not part of the community and they have a lack of respect for questions raised in the community. Considering that the city gives them \$7 million in tax money every year it is kind of a slap in the face."

Believing that they have done all they can with regard to the mural issue, the board stands by their decision.

"There are some people that you just can't make happy," Millan said. "If we had removed the sign we could possibly have had 650 angry students and 1300 angry parents on our hands."

Some are off and running

When **Adlai Stevenson** made his first try for President in 1952, being divorced became somewhat of an issue. However, in France candidates can have children without benefit of clergy, change mistresses in full public view and marry and separate all in the midst of campaigns for the presidency without significant impacts on their vote results.

What was fascinating in the exit polls in the recent French election was the number of women, a majority, who apparently did not vote for the first serious woman candidate for president. A sophistication on separating private lives from issues and ability, yes, but not on gender loyalty.

Our European allies seldom vote in philosophical sync with America. When England turned to the Left and Labor, America was about ready to vote Republican. Now, when the voters give Democrats a congressional majority, French voters tilt to the right.

Are there any implications for this in Sen. **Hillary Clinton's** campaign? Will female voters help make the upcoming election an histori-

cal event? Whatever else the former first lady brings to the political table, her election would give young women an enormous sense of what is really possible in a changing America.

It does seem that there is no respite in campaigns, the day after the election is now the starting gun for the next, in campaigns for the presidency down to and including local races.

We just completed a fairly bruising city council election and now we are about to begin campaigns for school board, and this one could be lively. Two years ago, there was no election. One incumbent and one contender filed and no one stepped forward to offer an alternative.

The November school board election could be quite different. Three incumbents, **Alissa Roston, John Millan** and **Myra Lurie's** terms expire. Roston would be seeking her third, Lurie and Milan their second. Their most serious challenger is likely to be **Steven Fenton**.

Millan and Roston had earlier told this column that they would seek reelection and Lurie told us this week she too would file, ending many weeks of speculation.

As board president, Mrs. Lurie inherited some very challenging problems, not the least of which was the loss of many school administrators including the superintendent and several principals. Her calm, professional leadership made the transitions almost seamless and she also earned high praise for progress in completing school renovation.

What may have caused delays in her decision on whether to run, was the urging she was receiving from many in the community to seek a seat on the city council in 2009.

You may not have noticed, but this is the first council in years without a lawyer-member. All lawyer jokes aside, there are many times when having an attorney on the council is critical. We have, in **Larry Wiener**, one of the best city attorneys in the state, but explaining the legal consequences of council actions is often facilitated by having a lawyer colleague.

Lurie is a lawyer, one of the reasons many wanted her to run for council. Her decision to campaign for a second board term does not automatically mean she could not make a race for council in two years and that should not be an issue in the election.

As for Fenton, he has demonstrated a commitment to public education, is very involved in school programs and feels there are problems that need fixing. He too was urged to wait two years and run for council. Although it is generally assumed that his father, Frank, will not run

again, the "dynasty" issue concerned him. Why should it? If Fenton is qualified, why would it matter if he is willing to serve? It's his name and not Judie or Frank that will be on the ballot.

In fact, he may have a far more difficult campaign for school board. All three incumbents have strong credentials and excellent records as board members. It may be impossible to convince the voters, and the education community, that there are compelling reasons why all three should not win another term.

On the other hand, Fenton will make it a very interesting election and can count on a strong list of supporters from his own contacts and Judie's mammoth "A" list. Steven is a good leadership resource, it's just that his talents may be more needed on the council than the board. In two years, the council election would be very open. **Barry Brucker** is certain to seek a second term, **Linda Briskman** is probably not running for a third and **Frank Fenton** will probably retire after many years of public service: School board member and president, recreation and parks commission and elected city treasurer.

Speaking of elections, and we usually do, some more read it here first news: Our former state assembly member **Paul Koretz**, whom I met quite by accident at the Peninsula's Belvedere this week, told me he is definitely going to run for Los Angeles City Council. Fifth District Councilmember **Jack Weiss** who represents the area surrounding Beverly Hills, is termed out. Weiss will likely be a candidate for Los Angeles City Attorney.

The field of candidates for that office opened up considerably when **Michael Waxman** recently moved to Washington, D.C. The younger Waxman's father is Congressman

Henry, probably the most powerful political leader in our area, and the name would have been a strong asset if Michael had remained here and decided to seek election to the Los Angeles City Council. Michael also resigned as member of the Los Angeles Community College Board of Trustees.

Although the field may be crowded, one possibility for the contest could change many political aspirations. Newly elected assembly member **Mike Feuer**, a former councilman for the same district, could be having second thoughts about serving in Sacramento. The time away from home, the frustrations of being a freshman legislator and the realities of term limits could make the council seat very attractive for Feuer who easily won both the primary and general elections last year. If he decides to run, it would be a "free ride" meaning he would not have to give up his assembly office.

Koretz represented much of the city council district when he was in the assembly and is a proven vote getter. His early efforts in lining up key endorsements and the difficulty Feuer would face in so quickly wanting to leave an office he just won, could inhibit Feuer. Also, Koretz' endorsement of Feuer over West Hollywood mayor and councilmember **Abbe Land** was one of the reasons Feuer did so well. Side note: If Feuer runs and wins the council seat, look for Land to make another bid for that office. Land is a fine example of good public service not translating into a well organized campaign.

We're grateful to all our readers who saw our geographical error last week when we rearranged the design of the Hilton plans and moved the proposed Waldorf Astoria to the western section of their property. The Waldorf

Astoria, if approved, would be at the intersection of Wilshire and Santa Monica – the same area which was home to Trader Vic's, now moved inside the hotel next to Circa 55. That is east, not west. One of the more kindly emails was from former planning commissioner and Rodeo Drive pioneer, **Jerry Magnin**.

For all you Trader Vic's fans, if there is sufficient demand or support for the bar area being converted into a condensed version of the historic eatery, the hotel management could possibly convert their Circa 55 to a new Trader Vic's. The bar area will only have some of the food and cocktails of the original, not the whole menu.

This item needs far more than one or two paragraphs, and we'll do that later this month, but a marvelous party is being organized honoring our city legend: **Fred Hayman**.

Along with the **Don Tronstein**, the Carroll and Mahboubi families and others such as **Jerry Magnin**, Hayman was a pivotal mover in the creation and reinvention of Rodeo Drive with all that has come to mean for Beverly Hills.

More than that, Hayman is a style setter, innovative thinker about city needs, generous supporter of charities and the arts and a great friend. He, with wife Betty, truly merit any honors we can bestow, so it's certain to be a marvelous event. Former mayor **Vicki Reynolds**, the Peninsula's **Ali Kasiki** and publicist **Katy Sweet** are co-chairs.

The Beverly Hills Police department has asked the community to fly the American flag at half staff on May 15 during National Police Week, (May 13 to May 19) in honor of the five Beverly Hills officers who lost their lives in the line of duty, the first in 1929 and the last on June 6, 1953.

That would also be a good time to have a

national dialogue on police-community relations. The example Beverly Hills has given in how community support improves protective services and understanding could well be followed in other cities, including Los Angeles.

While awaiting the results of the investigation of what caused the incidents in Mac Arthur Park, and obviously the Los Angeles police will need to go much further in training of crowd control, there is also a lack of balance in placing blame.

The organizers of the protest rally in the park should have been prepared for rowdy behavior. It was the bottle throwing at police and other spectators that triggered the overreaction of the cops, however excessive that became.

The images we see each night on the tube is only of the police action, not the dangerous bottle throwing that preceded.

Improve police training? Yes, but also instill an awareness of mutual responsibility for pro-

fessional protective services. It's really basic: Show support and appreciation, and that's what you will receive in return. Police are people with all the same problems of societal life we all face

When our own police were under attack many years ago, this community, one of the most sensitive in the nation on questions of civil liberties, tied yellow ribbons of support on city trees. We turned a negative into a great positive lesson on police community relations. The police were right, and we knew it.

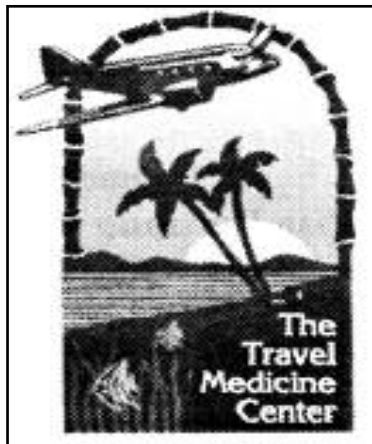

Beverly Hills Planning Director 1974 -1988
Clearlake, CA



It was a combination of circumstances. One, after having served as Director of Connecticut's Housing, Planning and Redevelopment program, I realized I had no place to go so I decided to consider other alternatives. Two, there was a fierce ice storm on December 17, 1973 and I decided that I wasn't prepared to spend another winter in New England. So I thought if I was going to be casting about I might as well cast some place warmer. I read the professional journal at the time and saw a listing in Beverly Hills and they ended up bringing me out for the job. Only years later did I realize what a courageous thing it was for them to reach across the country to bring me out to be their planning director. The laws and litigation in California were unique so it was risky for them to bring someone in from the east coast.

Who were the people running the city at the time?

The City Manager was George Morgan and George was a very special human being. He was very much New England even though he had been out of New England for many many years, highly professional. He would walk to work and every day and everyday he would walk a different route. He would compile a list of things he felt needed to be improved in the city and he would work on that list. He was an absolute professional and a pleasure for me to work with. He had been Palo Alto's city manager before he came to Beverly Hills. I think he was City Manager during a turning point in Beverly Hills' existence in many ways. He

influenced the city in many ways. That was when the fifth and sixth floors of the city hall tower were still in use, overlooking the world.

The Mayor at the time was [the late] George Slaff, a very colorful very strong personality. Also a very special person.

How did you get into planning?

When I went to Brooklyn College, it was called urbanism at the time, and I had gone though the book majoring in everything else, so I finally ended up with urbanism. I thought it would embody everything that I was interested in art, architecture, and building.

For graduate school I went to Columbia and got my degree in city planning.

What were the major planning issues in Beverly Hills at the time?

In Beverly Hills, one of the things that makes the city special is that it was the right place at the right time, and they got to decide what their future could be. They could have been industrial, commercial, anything. But they opted for focused, modest scale development. A Culver City official had told me that the development policies of Beverly Hills helped dictate development opportunities in Culver City. Beverly Hills strength was very strong market demand and selectivity in what it wanted to be and how it wanted to grow. Its restraint was an important part of its strength. It restrained itself in the sense that it had height limits and limits on the type and intensity of development. It said "this is the character we want" and it was able to draw upon the investment initiative of those people who wanted to come in and develop. Its restraint really created the kind of community the city today.

Who worked in planning with you?

The Deputy Planning Director planner was Ruth Nadel, who took over after I left. She ran a very different organization than I did. Among the Commissioners I worked with were [the late] Don DeWitt, Winston Millet, [former mayor] Ed Brown, Stan Furman, Bud Wittenburg, [former mayor] MeraLee Goldman, and Dick Carroll. Beverly Hills is fortunate to have had very talented people serving on the Planning Commission. I am fortunate, as I still have a lot of friends in the community.

What did you love about Beverly Hills when you were here?

One of the things I loved about Beverly Hills was that it was a place where you could dream up new things and do things that had never been done before. Beverly Hills had the ability to be innovative because it is a proud community and a small community with the resources to do special things. There were two city projects that were most fun for me to work on. The senior housing project on [North] Crescent is one of them. It was a Department of Housing and Urban Development Section 8 housing project that was conceived on a tennis court. The idea took hold, but was controversial - bringing in a HUD project into Beverly Hills. We ended up winning awards for that project like National HUD and Urban Land Institute Awards. The housing is built on air rights. We didn't sell the property because the land was far too valuable to sell. It was a mixed-use project with parking, commercial development and housing. Because of its proximity to the Business Triangle, we put substantial public parking underneath it, as well as parking for the commercial development and separate parking for senior residents. But the leasing of the air rights was done over the objections of the developer and the HUD area office, but the city by and large pulled together. There was the political will to do it. Annabelle Heiferman was mayor at the time and was instrumental in the project.

The other project that was really memorable was the Civic Center competition. The mayor at time was Ben Stansbury. We invited architects to submit designs and paid them to submit. It was a blind competition and we hired a jury. The quality of the jury was such that any one of the jurors could have been a competitor, they were all so qualified. We put up all the boards for the people to view and make their feelings known before the Jury even voted. Before the contest we interviewed the different departments in city to find out what there growth needs were that needed to be incorporated into the designs. The community, jury and council all lined up and all agreed on the winner of the project. But before that, people were having fun guessing which architects designed the various submissions. John Dreyfus was the architecture critic for the [Los Angeles] Times at the time. And the Civic Center design had these arches that gave it a Spanish feel. So he came in, viewed the submissions and wrote about this Moorish design. Turns out he had realized who the winning designer was - Charles Moore. People came from all over the world to the gallery where the designs were being exhibited. And we also won an AIA award for that.

In an interview with departing Planning Director Mahdi Aluzri [in issue 377], he said that the best way for the community to be involved in the planning process is to show up for the public workshops and Town Hall meetings. Do you agree?

Yes. In 1985, we assembled a citizen Task

Force and conducted a community-driven planning process called "Vision 2020" that defined the goals to guide the community's future. The Task Force met again several years later to evaluate progress in achieving these goals. Beverly Hills has always been a community that was very much involved in the decision making process.

Former Planning Director Max Strauss recently passed away. What are your memories of him?

Max preceded me. He was a very practical, down to earth guy. I was always more of the dreamer than Max. We were very different animals. The City hired me after he left. We would get together every so often over at the Farmer's Market on Fairfax for coffee. We would occasionally email each other. He was someone I enjoyed being with. I can't tell you what his philosophy of planning was. He was not trained as a planner he had gone to Brooklyn Tech, and was trained as an engineer, I believe. That was his discipline. I truly liked Max.

What did you do when you left Beverly Hills?

I worked my way into a niche consulting role where I was interim planning director in various communities. What I liked is that I functioned as staff, even though I was sometimes staff sometimes consultant. I had the department staff to work with I would be on site for six, eight or four months. I was always in different communities, meeting new people, finding new situations and challenges, always trying to get people to be the best they could be. I worked in Pasadena, Diamond Bar, West Hollywood. Then I got a call to work in Bay Area, in Orinda. That is what brought me to Northern California. They liked me and offered me the job permanently. Because I enjoyed being the lone ranger I put it off for a while, but finally they prevailed and I took the job. I was there for about five years before I moved on. As the interim, I was deputy town manager for community development in Woodside and planning director in Saratoga. Now I am on leave from San Jose serving as the interim planning director in Clearlake. It is a small town with serious problems and around 13,500 people in an incredibly beautiful location, on the shore of the largest natural lake in California. I am trying to make sure that they deal with their growth wisely. Growth there is imminent. It will be hit with a lot of development and development pressures. Like Beverly Hills, they will be confronted with tough choices. Growth is going to happen it can happen its way or Clearlake's way. My mission is to see that it happens the Clearlake way.

Beverly Hills has recently appointed a new planning director, Vince Bertoni. Do you have any advice for him?

I wish him wisdom and courage.

HOME INVASION ROBBERY STRIKES NORTH REXFORD

BHPD say suspects are still at large

On April 27 at approximately 1:00 a.m. two men and one woman entered into an unlocked dining room door of a house the 800 block of North Rexford Drive.

The three intruders allegedly walked upstairs to the master bedroom where a man and woman were sleeping.

The suspects grabbed the man and violently hit him with a hammer, bound him up and forced him from room to room, all the while demanding money.

They were in the house for approximately 15 minutes before fleeing the scene in what police believe was a grey four door Toyota or Nissan with over \$10,000 in stolen cash and property.

Beverly Hills Police received an emer-

gency phone call from the residence at 1:18 a.m. and two minutes later were at the scene. The male victim refused to go with the paramedics who responded to the call, but later visited a hospital on his own with minor injuries.

"We are still following up on leads and don't want to give too much out on the case," Lt. Mitch McCann, Beverly Hills Police Department Spokesperson said. "We don't want to give out evidence that the suspects might recognize."

The three suspects, now wanted for burglary, robbery and kidnapping, are believed to be Hispanic and in their mid to late 20's. There are no composites available.

Although the victim was not taken from

his home, police believe a kidnapping charge still holds in the case.

"When a suspect holds a gun to your head and tells you go to point A to point B it counts as kidnapping," McCann said. "They didn't force the victim to leave the house but they went from room to room. The victim was taken by force to another area and that is kidnapping."

Police believe the victim went to bed and left some doors unlocked or perhaps open. The suspects then entered the home, because of the easy entry, no home alarm was activated.

"This is a good opportunity to remind residents to lock doors and keep alarms activated," McCann said. "I think once again that even though it is a safe city everyone needs to take precaution to keep doors locked. In this case officers arrived within minutes, every bit of assistance we get helps. In this case the suspect was there for approximately 15 minutes. If there had been an alarm, our response would have been down to three minutes and we could have caught them."

Other North Rexford Drive residents are in disbelief of the incident, while some were not even aware that the crime took place.

"I must say I think it's horrendous,"

North Rexford Drive resident Arthur Barens said. "I would think with community watch and the residence being within a few blocks of police station that this kind of thing wouldn't occur, but criminals defy every effort to made by police in order to avoid them. I feel very bad for that family."

Although shaken up by the incident,

North Residents Association President Alan

Kaye believes the city is still of the safest in the state.

"I am pleased to know that these types of incidents are few and far between we have such a wonderful reputation for an efficient and effective police department," Kaye said

This break-in was one of three in Beverly Hills from April 24 through April 30 involving the burglary of an unlocked location.

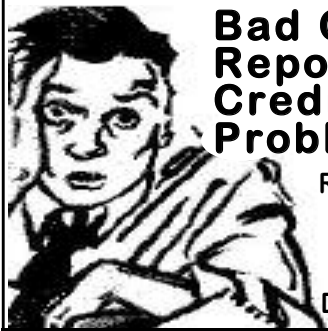

ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS EXTENDING THE TERMS OF TWO MEMBERS OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council finds:

1.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code, the City Council duly appointed Kathy Reims and Stacy Marks to the Planning Commission on October 2, 2001 and November 8, 2001, respectively, to serve initial terms of two (2) years.

1.2 In accordance with the provisions of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code, the City Council reappointed both Commissioners Reims and Marks to second terms such that each would serve an additional four (4) years. Therefore, Commissioners Reims and Marks' terms are set to expire on October 1, 2007 and November 7, 2007, respectively.

1.3 Pursuant to Section 2-2.105(b), Planning Commissioners who serve two (2) successive terms are not eligible for reappointment to the Planning Commission, and, accordingly, Commissioners Reims and Marks may not be reappointed to serve on the Planning Commission. A member, may, however, serve beyond the expiration of his or her term until such time as a successor is appointed pursuant to Section 2-2.105(c).

1.4 The election of Commissioner Nancy Krasne to the City Council in March 2007, and the subsequent resignation of Commissioner Shahram Melamed from the Commission has created two vacancies on the Planning Commission. With the appointment of two (2) new Commissioners and if Commissioners Reims and Marks' terms expire in 2007, the Planning Commission would be comprised of four (4) members with relatively little experience as Planning Commissioners. The City Council is concerned about the effect of this potential lack of experience on the Planning Commission in light of the projects that will be considered by the Commission in the coming year, and desires to extend the term of Commissioner Reims through and including March 2009, and the term of Commissioner Marks through and including the earlier of the date on which the Planning Commission completes its review of the General Plan update project, or February 29, 2008.

1.5 The City Council duly considered this matter at a noticed public meeting and concludes that it would be in the best interest of the City to extend the terms of Commissioners Reims and Marks on the Planning Commission as set forth in Section 1.4 above.

Section 2. The term of any successor the City Council appoints to fill Commissioner Reims' position on the Planning Commission shall not begin prior to April 1, 2009, and, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2-2.105(c) of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code, Commissioner Reims shall continue to serve as a member of the Planning Commission until such time as a qualified successor is duly appointed by the City Council and takes office.

Section 3. The term of any successor the City Council appoints to fill Commissioner Marks' position on the Planning Commission shall not begin prior to the earlier of the day after which the Planning Commission completes its review of the General Plan Update or March 1, 2008, and, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2-2.105(c) of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code, Commissioner Marks shall continue to serve as a member of the Planning Commission until such time as a qualified successor is duly appointed by the City Council and takes office.

Section 4. To the extent necessary, this Ordinance amends the provisions of Beverly Hills Municipal Code, Title 2, Chapter 2, Article 1 to allow the City Council to grant an extension of the terms of Planning Commissioners under the circumstances described in this Ordinance.

Section 5. The City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation published and circulated in the City within fifteen (15) days after its passage, in accordance with Section 36933 of the Government Code; shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause this Ordinance and his certification, together with proof of publication, to be entered in the Book of Ordinances of the Council of this City.

**ORDINANCE NO. 07-O-2514
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING ARTICLE 1 OF CHAPTER 2 OF TITLE 2 OF THE BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO ABSENCES BY MEMBERS OF COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES**

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2-2-106.B of Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 2 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"B. If a commission or committee regularly meets once per month, membership shall terminate automatically if a member is absent from four (4) regular meetings within a twelve (12) month period unless the City Council determines, in its sole discretion, that the absences were due to health reasons or for other unusual hardship that justifies the absence. Additionally, the City Council may consider removing any member who is absent from three (3) meetings within a twelve (12) month period.

Section 2. Section 2-2-106.C of Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 2 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"C. If a commission or committee regularly meets at least twice per month, membership shall terminate automatically if a member is absent from eight (8) regular meetings within a twelve (12) month period unless the City Council determines, in its sole discretion, that the absences were due to health reasons or for other unusual hardship that justifies the absence. Additionally, the City Council may consider removing any member who is absent from six (6) meetings within a twelve (12) month period."

Section 3. It is the intent of the City Council that this ordinance be applied retroactively and apply to any absence by a member of a commission or committee beginning on January 1, 2007.

Section 4. Publication. The City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation published and circulated in the City within fifteen (15) days after its passage, in accordance with Section 36933 of the Government Code; shall attest and certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause this Ordinance and the City Clerk's certification, together with proof of publication, to be entered in the Book of Ordinances of the Council of this City.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall go into effect and be in full force and effect at 12:01 a.m. on the thirty-first (31st) day after its passage.
