BHUSD's Christiansen's contractor's license expired in 2005

The BHUSD's facilities manager Karen Christiansen, who will oversee the \$334 million school bond if passed Nov. 4, no longer holds a valid California general contractor's license. According to documents obtained by the Weekly, Christiansen's license expired in December 2005, about a year after she was hired by the District.

According to the California Contractors Licensing Board, Christiansen's general contractor's license was issued to Facility Program Resources in El Dorado Hills, Calif. in 2003. It expired in 2005.

The first record of her license is for K2K Inc., from 1999 to 2003 also in El Dorado Hills.

The job description for the facilities manager position at BHUSD does not require a general contractor's license. A survey of facilities manager job descriptions for other California public school districts showed that a general contractor's license, while helpful, is not necessarily a requirement.

According to Christiansen's contract amendment, "Program Management is defined as the services related to managing the General Obligation Bond program in its [sic] entirety and the strategic development of methods and means of tracking all bond funds in accordance with the bond language. This includes budgeting and financial oversight, reporting, directing the activities of other consultants such as architects, engineers, and other professions necessary to develop projects in accordance with bond

language. This service will also encompass seeking out, fling [sic] applications for supplemental funding sources.

"Project management is defined as the oversight and strategic development of individual project. [sic] Including design development oversight, project budgeting, bidding, construction oversight and project closeout through various agencies. It will also included [sic] oversight of any additional funding sources in accordance with applicable regulation."

If the \$334 million general obligation bond (Measure E) is passed in November, Christiansen's company Strategic Concepts, LLC, which oversaw the majority of 2002's Measure K school bond, will receive 2 percent of the overall bond project budgets and 4.5 percent of the construction value of each bond project. The company would also receive the equivalent of three months of payment in the event of early contract termination.

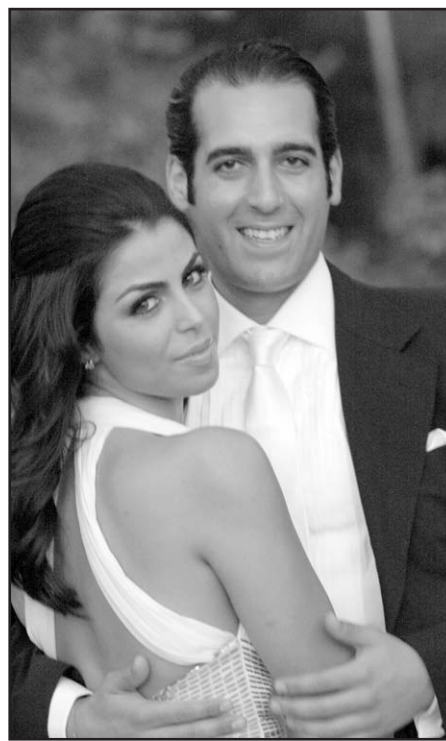
Christiansen declined to comment for this story.

BHFD pitches in to stop Valley blaze

Seven members of the Beverly Hills Fire Department were dispatched to help battle the Marek fire at 7 a.m. on Sunday morning, according to Fire Department Chief Tim Scranton.

The firefighters returned home around 5 p.m. that evening when the fire died down. Only 13 hours later, four additional Beverly Hills firefighters were called back to assist when the blaze gained momentum, burning over 2,100 square feet of the San Fernando Valley by Wednesday.

The firefighters were still out in the field Tuesday evening. Some were working to protect the Olive View Medical Center in

The Beverly Hills Fire Department has lent its services to other cities or counties in need eight times this year via California's Master Mutual Aid program that keeps emergency service departments across the state on-call in case of crisis, Scranton said.

Scranton said that it's possible Beverly Hills could face a fire of its own in this dry and windy season.

After dispatching our firefighters, "we felt the need to increase our staffing levels here in Beverly Hills for our own personal protec-

tion," said Scranton. "It's a proactive effort" against a "red-flag warning."

BHFD has posted no parking signs in the hills on the north side of the city to ensure fire engines — which dispatch in pairs in the dry season — could navigate the streets quickly and easily in case of an ignition.

"We have all these canyons and when we have the Santa Anas [winds], they blow right down those canyons and if [a fire] starts in that area, it will march down that canyon" as fast as 20 miles an hour, Scranton said.

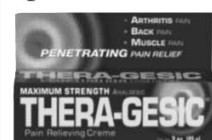

Three former Board of Education members circulate letter against Measure E

Three former members of BHUSD's Board of Education sent out 14,000 letters opposing Measure E to Beverly Hills residents on Friday.

The letter distributed citywide, titled "An Open Letter to Beverly Hills Voters: Why We Oppose Measure E," argued that the \$334 million bond amount is "enormous" and that the measure provides "no accountability and no transparency" on how the money will be spent.

Former Board members Mel Spitz (1971-79), Herbert L. Young (1971-75) and Gerald Lunn (1997-2001) all signed the letter and paid for its distribution.

On the other side, the bond has received the endorsement of the Beverly Hills City Council, Chamber of Commerce, Beverly Hills Education Association and other Beverly Hills organizations and residents.

"I would never have voted for this" when I was a Board member, said Spitz.

According to the letter, "The amount, one-third of a billion dollars, equates to ten thousand dollars per Beverly Hills resident. That is about 4-1/2 times greater than the per capita amount of the \$700 billion federal finance industry bailout!"

The former Board members are concerned that the bond's projects are too vague and that the money is not necessarily going to the places in dire need of more funding.

"It is also critical to note that not a penny of these borrowings will pay for teachers or for improving the educational program," the letter reads.

BHUSD to take another look at 'open

access' AP and Honors class policy

Beverly High's new Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors class 'moderately open access' policy is receiving mixed reviews from the school's teachers as it unfolds in its first year of implementation. The district administration is working to schedule a meeting with teachers to discuss the policy.

After Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) visited Beverly High for accreditation last year, they recommended the school take a more open access approach to AP classes. Technically, the policy is 'moderately open access' but teachers have been calling the policy 'open access' citing the 'parental override' clause that allows any student who wants to take an advanced course to enroll without or despite qualifying tests or grade point average.

Proponents of the policy say it allows more students the ability to take advanced courses and thus become more competitive for college admissions. Opponents say some students aren't ready for the rigorous coursework that often forces them to drop the class or receive low marks.

AP European history teacher Pete Van Rossum says the open access policy has made his class size jump from 75 students to nearly 120. This has increased the number of students who are struggling in his course, he says.

"You have to stay true to the course. The kids who aren't doing well can come in after hours for help on essays [etc.] but the fundamental problem is that for a lot of these kids it goes beyond simply them having more hands-on time with the teacher. It's a situa-

tion where they aren't intellectually developed to the point of getting these ideas. You are asking a 15 year old to think like a 22 year old. If they're not ready to do that—and if they are normal, they aren't going to be able to do that—and there's nothing you can do to get them over that hump," said Van Rossum.

AP environmental science teacher Sarah Utley says she favors the new policy but it's not new for her class.

"I made the choice to go open access five or six years ago. I wanted to the main motivator to take environmental science to be an interest in environmental science," said Utley, whose AP course's only prerequisite is the "successful completion" of biology and chemistry.

If a student has great math and science skills but struggles with English or history, that student's GPA might not be reflective of those science skills that would thrive in an AP science course, said Utley.

BHUSD assistant superintendent of educational services Ilene Straus said that there has definitely been an increased number of students taking AP classes this year but had no specific figures.

"We're [only] in the seventh week of school and will be looking at the program this year," said Straus.

The district and site administration are working on nailing down a time to meet with Beverly High teachers to discuss how the policy has been working in their classes this year.

BHUSD may create continuous enroll-

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ment policy

In its first in a series of three scheduled study sessions, the BHUSD's Board of Education recommended offering continuous enrollment in the district as one step toward updating the inter- and intra-district permit policy on Tuesday afternoon.

Narrowing down an extensive list of permit problems to discuss, the Board was able to sift through at least three issues facing intra-district permits—a highly emotional topic in the district this year after some permit students were displaced from their 'home' schools to make way for new resident enrollees after predictions of declining enrollment proved inaccurate.

The first tentative decision was to make school enrollment continuous with different deadlines for resident enrollment and permit requests.

Under the new tentative policy, residents who enroll in the district by March 1 would be guaranteed a spot in their home school the following September.

Both Board President Dr. Myra Demeter and Board member Dr. Brian Goldberg recounted their experiences trying to enroll their respective children in their home schools after first moving to Beverly Hills. Demeter and Goldberg's children were placed in BHUSD schools out of their zones because they were told their home school was "full."

"Is that fair for a resident who expects to attend a particular school?" asked Demeter.

The new policy would ensure all residents could attend their home school if they enroll by deadline. The issue of encouraging resi-

dents to want to attend their home school was a reoccurring theme for the night.

"Neighborhood kids should be going to the same school," said Board member Steven Fenton. "Without a compelling reason, no intra-district permits should be granted."

Students who request intra-district permits would have to do so by July 15 to be considered, save for extraordinary circumstances, and submit a documented "compelling reason" for the request.

Those compelling reasons tentatively would include the reunification of siblings, family tenure at the school or an environmental (i.e., medical) cause, according to the Board's discussion. The details of each of those categories will be left to a future conversation.

The Board directed staff to research the legal issues pertaining to such policies. California state law holds that a student can attend any school in his or her district where space is available, however districts are permitted to set their own rules for admitting transfers.

Should this policy be approved, the Board stressed the importance of widely advertising the deadlines in the community.

The Board also began discussing enrollment priorities, which included residents and the children of BHUSD and City of Beverly Hills employees.

The next Board study sessions will be held on Nov. 13 and Nov. 20.

City appoints members to Design Review and Human Resource commissions

The Beverly Hills City Council on

Tuesday appointed Susan Strauss as a new member to the city's Design Review Commission and reappointed Yar Meshkaty and Carol Goldsmith to the Human Relations Commission.

Strauss will serve a two-year term with Meshkaty and Goldsmith serving four-year terms.

In a mailer sent out by Maas, she stated, "During the past year, I have attended numerous City Council and Planning Commission meetings, solidifying my understanding of the topics of importance to our City. I am confident that I am ready to address the important issues that will affect Beverly Hills for many years to come."

Maas served on the Board of Education from 1995 to 2003 and was president in 1997-98 and 2001-02 school years.

Current Mayor Barry Brucker announced his run for another term on the City Council last month. Former Board member Willie Brien, who served with Maas, is also running.

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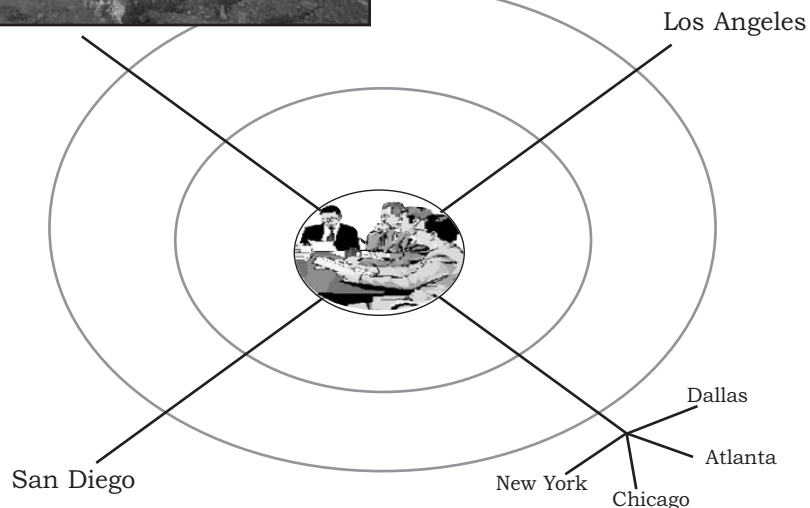

We Give You The Next President

And schools and Debbie Reynolds

(Before you read any further, and this is something that would normally appear at the end, my readers should know that part of this column will be about the school bond election. I am professionally involved, although most the decisions are made by a campaign committee. I had a previous role in two other bond elections, including the very first.)

Back to the election, and I wanted to share some thoughts. Despite what the candidates promised at the start, this has been a nasty, divisive and ugly election. I am most surprised by the demeanor of **John Mc Cain** – his anger, his lashing out and his willingness to appeal to the more base emotions of the voters is not what we expected. I hope this is not the real John Mc Cain.

Barack Obama was not my first choice. I felt his lack of experience did matter and I was very uncertain on his core beliefs. I had hoped that Gov. **Bill Richardson**, the candidate with the most impressive resume and tested character, would emerge from the

early pack, but that never happened.

Then I hoped **Hillary Clinton** would define herself not only as a national, independent leader, but as someone who would, at the same time, embrace the good part of **Bill Clinton's** presidency while carving out her own vision on our country's needs. I also felt strongly that her candidacy would give new meaning to young women in their own struggles for equality. Her campaign took too long to find its core and she lost to Obama.

Now, the choice is not that difficult. Obama has emerged as far more mature, more sensitive to the middle ground on major issues and more astute on his core message than **Mc Cain**. He also made a far better choice in running mates, reaching out to **Joe Biden** who had been a sharp critic during the campaign. Does anyone really doubt that Biden would be a better veep than **Sarah Palin**?

As for facing the quagmire of economic uncertainty, **Mc Cain** simply doesn't get it. I

am more confident in Obama's ability to bring in the sharpest minds possible to put reality back into fiscal needs and restore leadership and control over the financial institutions. More important, the nation will have, under Obama, a new optimism of hope and not fear and a continuation of policies that created the boom and bust era.

On international issues, Obama still has to prove his grasp of balancing our security and the need to confront America's enemies. On the other hand, more wars can not be the only answer – we need a new approach to a more peaceful world while protecting our own nation.

Even on law enforcement, Obama has been willing to support the importance of federal backing of money for local communities to enhance police protection. Somehow, some candidate, hopefully Obama, will end our tolerance of gang dominance in so many urban centers of our country.

Now, back to Beverly Hills.

In our history, our community has always understood the importance of excellence in education as an integral part of what makes our city so unique. Early settlers sacrificed much to make that happen. Just consider the purchase of the land needed to create our five schools, some in the most expensive real estate in our city, as one contribution that we

must always remember when we look to new generation's responsibilities.

Schools, along with first class protective services, probably the best in the nation, our fine residential areas, our outstanding core business districts and a citizenry that does care and gives back, and you have the ingredients of why this is such a wonderful place to live, work and educate our children.

However, the education mix has changed. Today, fewer residents have children in schools, there are new cultural challenges and opportunities and schools rely on the state for most of their funding. Continuing excellence is simply not as simple as it once was.

Also, because we are so involved in our community, there are often differences on educational policies and needs – not on the importance of support or first rate schools, but on how best to improve and move forward.

Mostly, those discussions are healthy and show involvement. Sometimes, they become divisive and regressive.

Now there is another choice to make: Shall we approve the largest bond proposal in our history?

Let me give my reasons why I think we must. We simply can't give lip service to excellence in schools without supporting public education when it is critical to do so. If there ever is a real deterioration in school services, the whole mix of our image as a city of "excellence" would suffer, not the least of which would be high property values. Think schools, three minute police and fire response time, and you have two reasons people want to live here.

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What will the bonds do, not only for our schools, but our whole community?

For all five of our schools it means making them safer and more secure. How can we claim excellence when the plumbing and electrical systems of the schools are in critical need of repairs? Don't we want schools that are safer in case of an earthquake?

I almost hesitate to put this in writing, but the high school has little or no means to prevent unwanted entry. For the first time, with passage of the bonds, the high school will have the ability to lock down the school in an emergency situation, which we hope never happen, but is so critical to a feeling of safety.

There is something important for the whole community in the bond program:

Each of our five schools are designated shelters in case of any disaster, including earthquakes. Not just for the kids, but for all of us, including our seniors.

What is most heartening is how the school board itself has come together in support of Measure E, the bond issue. The same is true of our city council, the police and fire officer's associations, the president of the teacher's union, the Beverly Hills Chamber of Commerce and hundreds of community leaders who may frequently disagree on land use matters, but unite when the schools need our support. In fact, I have never seen a more broadly based coalition in any city campaign.

When **Max Salter, Richard Stone, Robert K. Tanenbaum, Dr. Charles Aronberg, Allan Alexander, Fred Hayman** and many more with strong opinions on other civic needs, all come together in support of our

schools, this community should be comfortable about adding their votes and their voices for Measure E. It does mean safer, more secure schools.

This is one election when urging people to vote probably won't be needed, but do your duty to your country and your community and return that absentee ballot or march to your polling place on November 4. Of our 21,205 registered voters, a minimum of 14,500 are expected to vote this year. Compare that to the 3,325 that actually voted in the last and hotly contested school board election.

The Roxbury Auditorium was standing room only last Friday for **Debbie Reynolds** in performance, and what a show she did. One more reason why we need the Annenberg Performing Arts Center, far more people could have been there for a really incredible evening.

Debbie sang, joked about her marriages, and reminisced about her career with film clips of movies such as "Singing in the Rain" and "The Unsinkable Molly Brown." She also sang along with herself on the screen.

THE WORLD ACCORDING TO SAM

Entrepreneur Sam Nazarian talks about growing up in Beverly Hills as he prepares to emcee BHAAA's upcoming Hall of Fame dinner

Beverly High grad Sam Nazarian ('93) has been called the "Emperor of Cool" by BusinessWeek and a "nightclub impresario" by the Wall Street Journal — for understandable reasons. With the proceeds from real estate investments he made as a young man, 33-year-old Nazarian has created some of L.A.'s most posh nightclubs and a chain of luxury boutique hotels nationwide via his company SBE Entertainment. Nazarian has been an executive producer of several major motion pictures, appeared as himself in hit television shows and recently purchased the Sahara Hotel & Casino in Las Vegas. The list could certainly go on.

But, Nazarian hasn't forgotten his roots, he says. This month, Nazarian will emcee the Beverly Hills Athletic Alumni Association's Hall of Fame Dinner on Oct. 18. It's not the first time Nazarian, who played on Beverly's basketball and baseball teams during his high school tenure, has given back. He donated several thousands of dollars to Beverly High's Swim Gym; the basketball court is now titled 'Sam Nazarian Court.'

The Weekly caught up with Nazarian in Beverly High's Swim Gym, appropriately, to find out what it is about Beverly High that keeps him coming back.

BH Weekly: Your Beverly High basketball coach Jason Newman said that you were the "ideal person to have on a team." He said that your "happy-go-lucky attitude" made you a unifying factor on the team and your hardworking attitude was infectious and helpful to team success. What do you think about that?

Sam Nazarian: We had such a strong bond and chemistry on that team because we all kind of grew up together, varsity and junior varsity and the second year varsity. [Coach Newman] was such a laid back coach but then there was an undertone of really kinda he was like a father figure to a lot of us. He wasn't in your face and screaming but when you did screw up, he would. And when he did it on such a level that we all never wanted it to happen again.

Why did you decide to get involved with the Beverly Hills Athletic Alumni Association?

I can tell you, one of the major things about me actually supporting the [Beverly High Athletic Alumni Association] is, to me, I think any child at that stage in their

life, whether they come from a great home or a broken home, sports or music or the arts are really, between the age of 14 and 17, are one of the ways you have a sense of consequence and a sense of responsibility. I knew at that stage, because I was an athlete my whole life, that if I didn't get good grades, it wasn't that I'd upset my

somehow to be on the practice court in 15 minutes fully dressed half a mile away. That's why to me, Beverly Hills school district has had its challenges since I've been here. Right now, you see a lot of these private schools emerging that have amazing fundraising organizations and boards, with beautiful facilities.

parents, I just wouldn't play basketball or play baseball. If I didn't have good conduct, I wouldn't play basketball. If I showed up late to practice, I wouldn't play basketball. That sense of discipline was instilled in me and in a lot of my friends who [were athletes too]. I noticed with a lot of my friends who didn't have that when 1:30 came and the bell rang [those] kids ran off with nothing to do. When 1:30 came, I had 15 minutes to get in uniform and at practice. We weren't sitting around having lunch and getting into bad things. We were rushing and trying to find a way

Unfortunately, our public schools don't have that.

Last year, when [BHAAA founder and Board of Education member] Steven [Fenton] called me and said would I be interested in helping in any way, I had already been thinking about it. Because I think, look what a beautiful facility we have here. Nobody has this facility as far as the swim gym. Our athletic department, you know, they haven't had uniforms in 10 years; they haven't had buses. The facilities have deteriorated to a point where it almost wasn't inspiring kids to

have that great varsity jersey, which I remember that I felt so proud of the varsity jacket walking around school.

People who've taken advantage of this school, of this school district, A) they don't give back, but B) there hadn't really been a vehicle to force them to give back or allow them to give back. That to me was what I was trying to do and that's the reason I publicly used my name and I'm gonna be the master of ceremony this year. [The reasons are] really [to say to] the community as a whole, 'Listen, thousands and thousands and thousands of us came from this school district. My two sisters went to school here. I went to school here. A lot of my friends went to school here and we've got to get the school district back to a point where, you know, I want to send my kids here. And the current environment with budget cutting, it's tough to do so.' You know, you can send [your kids] to Brentwood, or send them to Crossroads or to the Beverly Hills school district. Unfortunately, a lot of people are making the decision to send them to these really expensive private schools, which is a shame especially because we all grew up in this environment. I think it's important for everybody, especially a huge demographic of the Beverly Hills school district as whole not just the high school is Iranian, Iranian immigrants, Iranian Americans, first generation and second generation Iranians.

I'm excited about [the Hall of Fame dinner on Oct. 18] and I hope everybody comes out to support it.

What skills did you take away from the sports program at Beverly that have been helpful to you in your professional career?

I think one thing that athletics does, especially with a great coach, is really push you to a point where you break. And the confidence it gives you when you think you can't run another drill and they force you to do it. All the sudden as a 16 or 17 year old kid, which is generally a unique time in anybody's life, it really instills a sense of confidence in you and a sense of belonging. And that translates as you're more impressionable and really have the opportunity of making bad choices when you go to college. Then, all of the sudden you have this freedom that you generally hadn't had when you're in high school, when people go away to school like I did when I went to NYU. And that stuck with me and that's why I stayed on the path [like] a lot of people who are in sports or things that [teach] accountability. When you give kids accountability, no matter how cool a parent you are, when you're 15, 16 you think your parents are from a whole different world. The people who you do bond to are people like your coaches, like your team mates because you have no choice — you have to whether you like your coach or not or whether he had a bad day and yells at you or not. I remember there was a fear that I had, that if I didn't perform I wouldn't be on the team. That was the only conse-

quence that I had in that time in my life and that discipline stayed with me within my early 20s and really gave me the confidence to know that I could push myself one step further than I thought I could, which is important for a lot of kids who are just going through high school [otherwise] they just settle.

Who are some of those coaches you remember?

[Coach Jason] Newman was definitely one of them. Ben Bushman who was our principal. I had a very unique relationship with the principal. I'd be going down hallways and give him a big hug and, you know, it was just like here's this junior walking through and hugging the principal and I was very kinda fun guy in that respect and he was also obviously. He encouraged it.

Coach [Dick] Schreiber was another guy we had here. He was a bulldog and he was great, a no nonsense kinda guy but every once in a while his funny personality would come out.

Coach [Jack] Dyck was here when I was here. He actually left my senior year. And [there was] coach [Bill] Erickson on the baseball team.

When I think about it, I really think about the athletic side of it but we had some great teachers and I did relatively well. I did well enough to get into the business school at NYU as a freshman. I was in student body and all that other stuff. But I mean it all really comes back to [the fact that] the memories I have of high school

are in this gym and that's why I thought it was appropriate to support it and bring it back to life. It's been here since 1933, I think.

Coach Newman said that it doesn't surprise him that you are "giving back" to your old school. He said, "power and money change a lot of people, not for the good, but you can tell Sammy is grounded and his parents raised him right. Success is what he does, not who he is. He is a great guy first and a successful guy second." How would you respond to that?

That's great for people to think that. I try to be. But I give the credit to my parents and the upbringing that [my sisters and I] had. My father's been a philanthropist his whole life and when you see that in your house you have a tendency of understanding the value of it. You give not to be recognized for the most part. It's great when you are and it's great when you inspire other people to [give]. I think that's what the whole goal of this alumni association is. There are so many people who do want to give back; they just don't know how [and] they haven't had the vehicle. I think this [BHAAA Hall of Fame dinner will provide that] every year. Hopefully it will get bigger. Last year, we had 400 people and raised a lot of money the Konheim family and I gave a big chunk but this year hopefully we're looking to get some bigger opportunities and to really teach the city, especially the educational departments, the fact that they need to start com-

paring themselves to these private schools because that's their competition. Obviously, [BHUSD] has state funding and local funding but we have to raise the bar on our public schools and expect more. Also, the community has to support it. You can't just expect—oh, the school system sucks so I'm just gonna send [my kids] to private schools—what are you gonna do to change it?

It would have been a lot easier to make this donation to another cause or if people say, 'oh well the Beverly hills school district doesn't need money,' just by its name. At the same time, I'm working with [Los Angeles] Mayor [Antonio] Villaraigosa in donating a couple basketball courts in Watts and East L.A. [I'm] working on that with Antonio, which is a kinda mandate I have with him through our company S.B.E. Entertainment and we're doing a lot of stuff on that front too. But I figured I ran so many drills here [at Beverly High] and sweat so much sweat and got yelled at so much that I might as well have a place. I wanted to name it after my company because I wanted to inspire kids to follow what we do but the bylaws of the city wouldn't allow it so they conned me into putting my name on it, which isn't bad. It's fun to see.

Who do you stay in touch with from Beverly Hills?

One of my best, best friends is a guy who played baseball and basketball here and I'm in touch. And obviously when you grow up your circle of friends become

who you work with.

But a lot of my closest friends are people I've known from elementary school at El Rodeo or at Beverly High like Behzad Malmed, a guy named John Akhavi and a whole list of people I talk to once in a while.

If you could give any advice to current athletes (or students) at Beverly High, what would it be?

The only advice I could tell them is that high school is the best time in your life. As much as you want to rush and grow and go to college and get away and get your drivers license, the best times ever in my life where when I was in high school and in college. So really enjoy it; don't hurry to grow up. People said that to me when I was 16, 17, and I'm like 'you're crazy I want to get the hell outta my house.' But this is really the most amazing time. As soon as graduation day happens and you leave high school, that camaraderie you have with your class and your classmates and your year, that just goes out the window. And it becomes a whole new game. So really enjoy it because it will be something that one day you'll look back on and say no matter what everyday I came back and there were 600 people in my class who I knew by first and last name and that changes, so enjoy it.

Beverly Hills Athletic Alumni Association's (BHAAA) second annual Hall of Fame dinner, held at the Beverly Hilton on Oct. 18, will honor five Beverly High graduates who went on to become outstanding or professional athletes.

**AN OPEN LETTER TO THE COMMUNITY
FROM
FORMER MAYORS ROBERT K. TANENBAUM AND RICHARD A. STONE**

October 7, 2008

Dear Neighbors,

We are voting **NO** on proposition “H” and have been asked by some of our friends and neighbors to put down in words the reasons why we believe that the proposed Hilton project is **NOT** in the best interests of our city. At the outset, please understand that we do not oppose a “conforming use” project, i.e., one consistent with the letter of the Municipal Code and spirit of our City’s General Plan, which might generate additional revenues for our City and add to and, hopefully, enhance the aesthetic quality of the project locale.

Our devotion to our City can best be summed up as a commitment to maintaining and enhancing our quality of life by encouraging and supporting smart, economically sound and code conforming development. We are inspired in this letter to critique the Hilton expansion project because of its unsound financial estimates, its generation of destination gridlock traffic, its inadequate on-site parking, its massive high rise towers, its 5 to 7 years of construction phasing, its generation of toxic and unmitigatable adverse environmental impacts and its negative precedent setting example.

Gridlock Traffic
Beverly Hilton/Waldorf Towers Expansion

In our judgment the single most aggressive breach of our City’s General Plan and Municipal Code height and density standards, and with the potential to alter adversely and permanently the nature and character of our City, is the Hilton/Waldorf Towers expansion project. Directly across the street from residential homes and the El Rodeo School, the Hilton expansion provides for the construction of a 150 foot tower, the proposed site of the 170 room Waldorf Towers Hotel, at the intersection of Wilshire and Santa Monica Blvds, already the busiest and most heavily trafficked corner in the L.A. area!

In addition, the Hilton plans to construct two high-rise condominium towers located at both ends of Merv Griffin Way, one tower 18 stories high on the Santa Monica Blvd. side and a 100 foot tower on the Wilshire Blvd. side. Both towers, taken together, will comprise a total of 90 condo units.

This Hilton project presents our City with a massive expansion plan. The expansion will increase the total square footage (s.f.) from 543,537 s.f. to 970,620 s.f. Notwithstanding that the proposed expansion will increase in size by almost double the square footage, the Hilton experts assert that the Hilton’s proposed expansion will not increase traffic!

Inadequate On-Site Parking

The Hilton is presently under parked. In recent years the Hilton used the Robinsons-May parking facility, but that parking will no longer be available. According to our Municipal Code, if the Hilton were a new project it would require 3,433 parking spaces. Yet, the Hilton is proposing a total of 1,422 parking spaces, or 41% of that which the code requires.

Moreover, the Hilton has no planned on-site free parking for its approximate 700 employees. Given the inadequacy of the Hilton’s on-site parking, please feel free to conclude where Hilton guests and its employees will park in the ordinary course, everyday, and especially, when the Hilton has planned special events. Would it offend your common sense to suggest that our neighborhood streets will become an adjunct parking venue for the Hilton?

Unsound Financial Projections

Hilton expansion advocates aver that the new hotel towers and accompanying existing hotel condo development will substantially increase revenues to the City. So, they argue, even if there is enormous discomfiture inherent during the construction phasing, significant parking deficits, severe height and density issues, increased traffic and unmitigatable adverse environmental impacts, they are all trumped because the City needs the money.

This financial needs and economic project argument is illusory, creating false reliance and expectations. Here’s why: First, the Hilton claims that the expansion project will provide the City with several additional millions of dollars in added revenue:

1. \$6.1 million from the new Waldorf Towers hotel;
2. \$1.6 million from the existing Hilton Hotel, and
3. \$2.55 million from the 90 proposed condos.

Let’s examine each projection to determine whether it satisfies sound financial analysis and simple common sense. In our judgment, the Hilton’s economic assumptions are unsound and profoundly misleading. Each of the cited projected revenue sources lacks the financial capacity to generate the revenue stream that the Hilton alleges. Let’s see precisely why:

2. **Waldorf Towers** — the \$6.1 million contribution to the city is an estimate that the Hilton claims will flow from the 19% transit occupancy tax

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(TOT). In order for the Waldorf Towers to spin-off \$6.1 million from a 19% TOT, the Waldorf Towers will have to generate \$32 million in gross room revenue. We assume an average of 75% hotel occupancy yearly; then with 170 rooms, the hotel will have to average a charge of \$700 per night for each hotel room! How many hotels in the L.A. area not only charge \$700 a night for a room, but average \$700 a night year round?

- Hilton Hotel alleged contribution**—The \$1.6 million in additional revenues that the Hilton claims it will add to the City's treasury is equally illusory. In order for the Hilton to generate the \$1.6 million from the TOT bed tax it will have to increase its existing room revenue in the amount of \$11.4 million. The reason is that the TOT at 14% for the existing Hilton Hotel, which is 5% less than the proposed Waldorf Towers, will yield \$1.6 million assuming the Hilton adds \$11.4 million in room revenues at an average 75% occupancy. The thorny problem here is that the Hilton expansion to accommodate, in part, the new Waldorf Towers hotel will reduce its room capacity from 588 rooms to 371 rooms, a net loss of 217 rooms for the Hilton Hotel. So, here's the rub: with a decline of 217 rooms and without making any new improvements, the Hilton wants us to believe that it will increase its room revenue in the amount of \$11.4 resulting in a \$1.6 million TOT, bed tax, contribution to the City. Isn't it fair to say that it is much more likely than not that this Hilton economic forecast is a bit far-fetched?
- Hilton Condo Property Tax estimate**—The Hilton asserts that the 90 residential condo units will yield \$2.55 million in additional property tax to our City. Again, let's do the math: We know that the property is taxed at 1% of its asset value. We also know the City receives 18% of property taxes paid. So, for the Hilton to provide the City with its stated \$2.55 million in property taxes annually from its condo units, those 90 condo units will necessarily be required to have an asset value of \$1.4 billion with an annual composite property tax of \$14 million— 18% of the \$14 million will yield the \$2.55 million in alleged contribution to the City. To accept the Hilton's estimate, that is based upon a \$1.4 billion asset value of its 90 condos, the average market value of each condo is \$15.5 million! Would it offend common sense to suggest that the Hilton's economic projections are seriously wanting in reality and are more the creation of manipulation and political spin than sound credible economic logic?

Construction Phasing

Rather than close down the Hilton Hotel in order to expedite the massive construction, the Hilton wants to phase in the construction over many years. Experienced observers suggest that the construction will occur over a period of 5 to 7 years. The Hilton projects that construction will take 4 years. During these years of construction, serious concerns arise:

- Construction Concerns:** With the Hilton Hotel open during the construction of the Waldorf Towers and the two condo tower structures, where will all the trucks carrying cement, rebar, steel, window glass and all, park? We already know that the Hilton has provided no on-site free parking for its 700 employees. Where will they park? In addition, where will the hundreds of construction workers park? Where will all the construction trucks and other apparatus be placed during construction since there is no Hilton Hotel on-site place to mobilize for this massive engagement?
- Public Health:** The Environmental Impact Report (EIR) informs that air pollution, vibration, and noise from the project will exceed standards and cannot be mitigated. Residents, school children and personnel at El Rodeo School are directly across the street. When the toxic air quality reaches dangerous proportions, who will notify and protect all these people? Is this Hilton expansion project so important that it justifies putting at risk so many of our people to these serious adverse environmental impacts?

Conclusion

Lately, we have been put on notice by its owner that if the Hilton project does not go forward, he will not come back with a smaller, modified version. Of course, implicit in that warning is the notion that the City will lose out on the alleged projected millions the Hilton estimates will flow from its development. Yet, if the Hilton, which just a couple of years ago invested allegedly \$80 million in a major renovation, did NOTHING, NO expansion, and with its projected rate of growth, the estimated revenue to the City in 2012 will approximate in excess of \$11 million.

- In 2003, the Hilton reported its revenues to the City = \$3.6 million;
- In 2006, the revenues to the city = \$6.2 million (Projected out to 2012 at this rate of reported revenue growth, the City will receive in excess of \$11 million). So, with NO Hilton mega expansion, our City receives basically an equivalent amount of revenue from the existing newly remodeled Hilton Hotel, and we are spared years of severe construction discomfort, increased gridlock traffic and adverse quality of life impacts.

Precedential Effect: The precedential effect of this enormous expansion project in terms of generation of destination gridlock traffic, high-rise towers, high density build-out with inadequate parking, and toxic health issues, will adversely impact our residential community in devastating fashion. For example, what will prevent the Beverly Hills Hotel, The Peninsula Hotel or others similarly situated in residential neighborhoods from constructing 150-foot towers or ones similar in nature and design?

In our judgment, if this mega expansion is finally approved, we'll regrettably witness the Westwoodization of our City. We do not want to sit idly by and witness our City degenerate into a high-rise, asphalt cavernous extension of the Wilshire Corridor. Our fate rests with our fellow residents who care about our quality of life. We respect planned, fiscally sound development that enhances our quality of life. This project does not meet those criteria. For these reasons, we have decided to vote NO on Prop "H".

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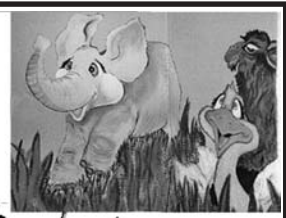
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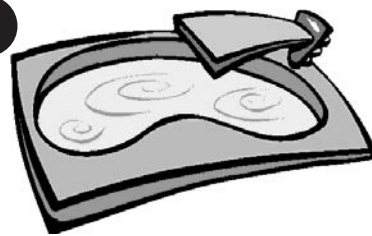
