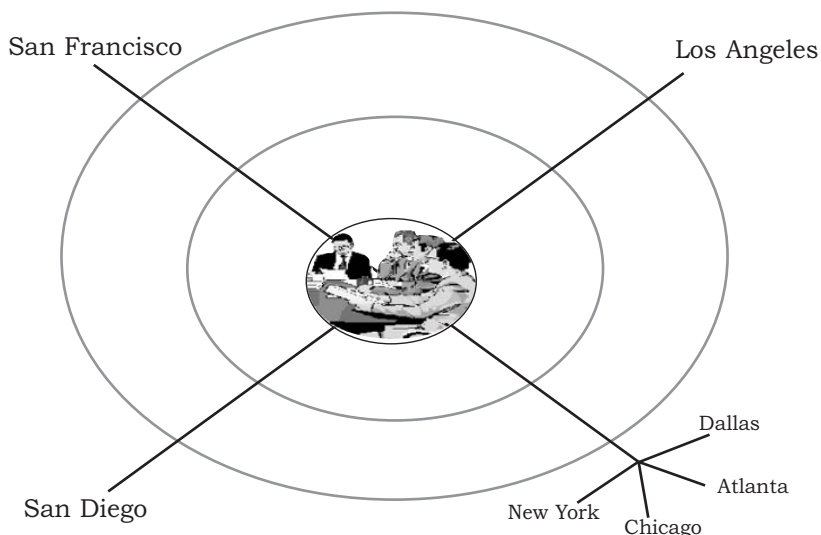

## Driver of fatal car crash in Setian case released from prison yesterday

Lane Garrison, driver of the car crash that killed 17-year-old Beverly student Vahagn Setian was released from the California Correctional Institute in Tehachapi, California Wednesday morning according to the Associated Press.

The Prison Break television show actor, whose three-year, four-month sentence began November 2007, is allowed an early release after serving less than half of his sentence by earning good behavior credits, where he is working as a peer mentor for other inmates.

"As far as getting out early or getting out at all doesn't change anyone's perspective," said Jonathan Pony, a classmate of Setian. "Nothing is fair and nothing is going to bring him back."

Calls to Harlan Braun, attorney for Garrison, were not returned by press time.

The lawsuit brought by the parents of Setian, sought damages from Garrison for wrongful death and gross negligence. Garrison pleaded guilty in the case.

Two female passengers were also in the vehicle. Michelle Ohana, who was 15 at the time of the crash, sought payment for medical bills, lost wages and home nursing care.

Garrison agreed to a financial settlement with the victims and their family members involved. Settlement amounts were not released.

## Court says "anti-SLAPP" statute does not apply to Goldman's case with Beverly Hilton owner

The Los Angeles Superior Court

denied Kenneth Goldman's motion to strike the lawsuit with Oasis West Realty as a SLAPP case last week, as the violation said by courts is ethical breach.

According to court documents, "the anti-SLAPP statute does not apply to this action for breach of an attorney's ethical duties."

Goldman, who is an attorney at Reed Smith, has been accused of working against

client to disclose his potential personal interest. Goldman's violation was the "acceptance of the adverse engagement (of Oasis) without providing the necessary written disclosure of his personal relationship with the City of Beverly Hills as a res-

The proposed resolution will increase the taxes, fees, and service charges that are charged to the public for the various activities and services as set forth in the schedule for fiscal year 2009/2010. The majority of the fees and charges would be increased by 1.1% based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for November 2008. In some cases, the fees were adjusted to reflect a change in service level, more equitable distribution of costs, or to obtain full-cost recovery, rather than by the CPI. The new fees would become effective on July 1, 2009. Fees for development applications, per State law, become effective 60 days after adoption of the adjusted fee schedule, which is July 13, 2009.

ident and active citizen which he reasonably should have known would affect his representation," court documents said.

However, the complaint also said "Oasis alleges that it selected Goldman in part because he was reputed to be an expert in civic matters, and was a well-respected leader who was extremely active in Beverly Hills politics."

This means Oasis West understood Goldman's position and connection to the city when he was hired, and chose him specifically for it. This would go against the court's decision last week that Goldman didn't disclose information about his personal interest.

The difference however, might be the technicality of failure of proof in the form of a written document.

"The decision is curious. It might be

form over substance, because Oasis admits they knew who he was," said Doug Mirell, an attorney at Loeb & Loeb not affiliated with this case.

Goldman's alleged ethical breach involved loyalty and confidentiality to Oasis, not the act of collecting signatures, support of the citizen's group, and speaking at City Council meetings, according to court documents.

According to the California Rules of Professional Conduct, "a member of the State Bar shall not represent conflicting interests, except with the written consent of all parties concerned."

The obligation to represent Oasis with fidelity does not end with the matter in which the lawyer may have been employed, court documents said.

Since the "anti-SLAPP" motion has been denied, the case will likely move on as

"breach of ethical duty or a malpractice lawsuit," said Mirell.

There are various scenarios that could occur. Mirell said it is hard to tell at this point.

"Goldman may argue that he did disclose the information of his personal interest, and/or that his actions did not cause damage," said Mirell. "The case could settle, it could go to trial, and after parties have conducted discovery, there could be a summary judgment motion that could dispose of the case," said Mirell.

What is still unclear is why Goldman and Oasis West terminated their relationship. Because of the prior attorney-client relationship, the "anti-SLAPP" statute does not apply. Because of sufficient information, the case will move forward.

"We feel it is inappropriate to comment on ongoing litigation," said Marie Garvey, spokesperson for Oasis West Realty.

Goldman said he was very surprised and disappointed that the strike was denied.

"We will appeal the ruling," said Goldman. "We are confident that we will prevail on the appeal, and certainly will prevail if the case goes to trial."



### Spadaro's legal trouble continues

Former Beverly Hills councilmember and Mayor Charlotte Spadaro (1984-88), who faces multiple civil and criminal cases in both San Bernardino and Riverside Counties, will begin trials in the next few months.

Spadaro's criminal case began May 12, 2005 when Rialto officials served a search warrant where Spadaro was running an animal-rescue operation. The City of Rialto seized over 184 dogs and cats from Spadaro four years ago.

"The house was filthy with animal feces, diarrhea and vomit as well as rodent droppings," court documents said.

The case included two counts, one for alleged cruelty to animals, the second for allegedly destroying evidence. According to the San Bernardino County case report, Spadaro's son, Jonathan Paul Spadaro was also a defendant in this particular case. Johnathan was later dismissed from the case in 2006 due to insufficient evidence according to District Attorney Jim McGee.

## Dr. Cheryl Saban



Dr. Cheryl Saban will release her new book, "What is Your Self Worth? A Woman's Guide to Validation" on May 1. The psychologist, philanthropist, and family advocate, is on a mission to help

women all over the world celebrate their own self-worth.

Saban attended San Diego State before earning her PhD in 2005. She has written numerous articles about women, children, marriage, parenting, and socio-political issues. 100 percent of proceeds from the book will benefit multiple philanthropic funds in the US and all over the world, many of them under the Women's Funding Network. A celebration for the launch of Saban's new book was held at the Pacific Design Center last week.

### Tell us about your family.

We have a multi-generational family first of all. I have four children. My parents who are in their 80s live with us, my mother in law who is 99, lives in Israel. We are really lucky to have our folks around us still. Our children range from ages 37 to 18. Two daughters, Tifanie [Chaney] is 37, and Heidi [Stills] 35, both have little families of their own. My son Ness [Saban] is 20, and Tanya [Saban] is 18. I have four grandchildren.

My adorable husband Haim [Saban] and I will have been married 22 years on September 13. Were madly in love, and we still chase each other around like kids.

I was twice divorced by the time I was 34, I had some not so great relationships prior to meeting my husband. But part of that journey had to do with my own recovery, or discovery, of my own self worth. By the time I met Haim, I had figured myself out. I didn't need a man to save me, fix me, or complete me.

### Your daughters attended Beverly, tell us about that.

Tifanie was involved with musical theatre, and Heidi actually went directly from high school onto an NBC show. She landed a lead role in an ensemble show called California Dreams. My sister Debra Joseph is currently a teacher [technical arts chair] at Beverly.

### What inspired you to write your first book?

My first book, Miracle Child, [1993] was inspired by my own life story. I had illness and disease when I was very young and I had a hysterectomy at 27 after my two daughters were born.

They left me with a piece of an ovary, because they figured they could save my hormones. Years later, I looked into all different avenues of having children, surrogacy was one of them, and adoption was one as well. At that time, surrogacy, especially gestational surrogacy was sort of like witchcraft. People didn't trust it, didn't know what it was, and they were fearful. I kept looking into it and we discovered that my piece of an ovary was producing enough hormones to produce a follicle so I would be able to produce eggs. So that's what we did. Despite all odds, because even with IVF, (InVitro Fertilization) there's only about a 20 percent chance of success, I was optimistic.

Our son Ness was the eighth in the world born using this method. When we had Tanya, two years later, she was the 40th. It was pretty significant. I kept a diary of the whole process, about what emotional things we went through, and I wrote a book about it.

### Of all your articles and books, which was the most challenging?

This one. This was a combination of elements. I did a lot of research; it took me a couple years to write it. By this time, I had achieved a PhD in psychology and I was interested in human behavior.

I'm particularly interested in women, perhaps because of my own life story. I had

some difficult experiences that really led to lots of insecurities for me and caused me to doubt my own self worth for quite a long time. Divorce can be very marginalizing for women, and I was raped when I was 18. When a woman is abused, raped, battered, and sexually assaulted, all of those things cut to a different place in a woman's psyche. Not all women can talk about it and recover from it. At the time this occurred in my life, there weren't the kind of support groups and environment of compassion that there is now. So I basically went into hiding for years.

So this book was a compilation of the research I did. I put questionnaires on my website and I got hundreds of responses from women all over the world who shared their views on worth and their stories. They're sprinkled all over the book. It's a combination of research, statistics about where women stand now, how women have progressed, and my personal stories.

### What inspired you to write this book?

I met Haim when my two older daughters were 12 and 14. So both girls had to deal with some of the dysfunction and chaos that occurs in a world where divorce exists. And those were struggles for them, and I think it took them awhile just like it took me, to find themselves and be ok with all of that. They are both really strong, they're incredible mothers and they inspire me. They're taking their challenges in life with a sense of strength and grace that I'm really proud of.

### Who is this book aimed towards?

Any age. The younger the better. Girls in high school should read this book. Because one of the things we don't teach young girls is the concept of self worth, independence, and the sense of freedom that you get when you recognize who you are. It's about having respect and positive feelings for yourself.

You can see from what's going on in the world today, more than 10 million girls and women suffer from eating disorders. We need to give young girls a positive outlook on life.

What is the first step for someone who has issues with self esteem?

There are five steps in my opinion. The first is to find your voice. That may take some personal introspection and assessment. Get to know yourself. Everyone has a unique story to tell, and we should learn and practice telling our stories and have a narrative that we can share.

The second is learning financial responsibility. Young girls need to learn how to manage their money, and their bank accounts. Kids are getting credit cards before they even know how to deposit a check. Credit card debt is horrible. Statistics show that 80-90 percent of women will be responsible for their own finances. It's an important life skill.

The next thing I would suggest is, stop engaging in bad habits and dysfunctional behavior. We know what they are. And that includes feeling helpless for example. There is help out there. It's important for us to reach for support if you feel like you're in a downward spiral. Bad habits and dysfunctional

## Police Chief To Stay

### Snowden Denies Rumors

In a telephone interview late Tuesday, Police Chief **David Snowden** emphatically denied reports he was about to resign refuting rumors that had been circulating since City Manager **Rod Wood** announced his retirement last week.

Immediately following our conversation, Snowden sent an email to division heads, police association leaders and others not only denying the retirement rumors, but confirming that he intends remaining as chief and that his retirement would not come until "mid-2010 or later."

Some members of the city council apparently also believed that Snowden would leave with Wood. The two are very close and Snowden had been quoted in another newspaper that he would leave if and when Wood departed. But Wood's resignation was unexpected and Wood strongly urged Snowden not to resign.

At least one councilmember, **Barry Brucker**, had assumed Snowden would soon leave and even suggested bringing in a

recently retired senior department official as "interim chief." Brucker, who also had praise for Snowden, told this column he was convinced Snowden would time his leaving with Wood.

On a side note, and considering the furor caused by Wood's surprise announcement, Brucker told us that he had met with Wood and assured him there "are not three votes to ask for your resignation."

As for Wood's departure, the response has been overwhelming: Every email we received urged Wood to reconsider. His support came from a very broad cross section of civic leaders including key backers of all five councilmembers.

Wood told us Tuesday that he would not reconsider his resignation although he had nothing but good feelings about Beverly Hills. He said, "I have had the good fortune to meet and make friends among many valued colleagues, with some wonderful councilmembers, and with so many exceptional community leaders."

relationships and work history of the men and women in the department except by learning and from personnel files. In a sense, it "wipes the slate clean" and that is not always helpful.

Equally important, there needs to be realistic incentives for staff members to feel they too could one day lead the department. If senior leaders are not advanced, the whole ladder of promotion remains static.

The department has some stars, each with their own talents and abilities. **Mitch McCann** and **Ed Kreins, Jr.**, are the two most obvious choices and both have excellent credentials. They lead different divisions: Kreins does field services and McCann administration. Both know the city, have strong support among the rank and file and have developed good community relations as well.

Not yet at the top of administrative jobs, but **Tony Lee** who handles communications and **Theresa Taylor**, who recently led a successful effort for federal funding, are two rising stars in the department. Both are excellent communicators and know the community. And there are many others who could also step into the top position.

Although we don't allow unions to pick their boss, or teacher's union president **Chris Bushee** would be superintendent of schools, the police association must be a major player in the selection process for the next chief.

Snowden has an excellent working relationship with the police association and that has to be continued if and when Snowden retires. The association should not pick a chief, but any strong objection they might have to a replacement must be given considerable weight. This is a very responsible union and rank and file confidence in the top brass is imperative. (And Bushee might not be a bad super.)

Historical note: The current fire chief, **Tim Scranton**, was once president of his union.

Other police issues, and this comes as a surprise. Despite assurances that the police

Wood said the council should move quickly to select a successor. He said the recruitment should be very open, include people now working for the city, but also highly qualified candidates from outside. "The really good city manager candidates are always in high demand and we would lose many if the selection process is too lengthy," he said.

Although refusing to reconsider his resignation, Wood said he would be willing to delay his retirement for a very brief time to make the transition as smooth as possible

Of course, there is a back story. However, giving any credence to the report that Wood was leaving because of a power play by someone outside city government is not even remotely true. Wood is not exactly someone who can be pushed around.

Back to Snowden and the police department. Our chief is a perfect fit for Beverly Hills. Tough on law and order, protective of the men and women in his department, Snowden is also a strong defender of human rights and civil liberties. He and wife Ellyn have become very active in Beverly Hills as have Wood and his wife, Gina.

So, while I accept Wood's reasoning on seeking the best possible replacement for city manager both from within and outside the city and although Snowden is clearly one of the most able chiefs in our history, and he too came from another agency, there are very compelling reasons why the next chief should come from the department. Fortunately there is no lack of leadership talent within the Beverly Hills Police Department.

It has been many decades since we promoted from within, and that does affect morale and continuity.

An outside chief would not have the benefit of really understanding the inter-personal

would not be impacted by the real financial crisis the city faces, there will be cuts in department funding. Although it is unlikely we will lose any current jobs, there will probably be a freeze on hiring and normal attrition will mean less cops.

However, the most serious reductions will be in overtime pay. It didn't help when another newspaper reported that there were department salaries in the \$200,000 range without explaining the very special circumstances: Critical work on time sensitive investigations.

If and when most overtime is curtailed, some pressing police work will suffer. A hot, pending investigation can not wait for regular business hours and often needs intensive department work with detectives doing double shifts to meet prosecution deadlines and avoid losing investigative opportunities.

Cutting overtime is not in the interest of community safety.

Who selects the chief of police and all other department heads? The city manager. The only personnel choice the council makes legally are city clerk, city attorney – now a contract post, and the city manager. However, since the police chief's job is so community sensitive and Wood is unlikely to be here when Snowden does retire, the council will be consulted. I would also think no replacement should even be considered without Snowden's stamp of approval. Fortunately, this isn't going to happen soon.

"Charlotte's first count [alleged cruelty to animals] has been reduced from a felony to a misdemeanor and the second count has been dropped at the discretion of the office," said McGee.

Spadaro said the City of Rialto handed a false police report to the District Attorney.

"We didn't have the pictures as evidence for a year. But even the D.A. admitted the police report was false," said Spadaro.

McGee did not refer to the evidence as false, but said they were insufficient.

Spadaro said she does not understand why the case has not been dismissed.

"I asked the judge for the specifics of what I did wrong," said Spadaro. "He responded by saying he didn't want to be too specific so I wouldn't change my story."

The next court hearing is scheduled for June 5.

In a civil case in San Bernardino County, Spadaro is suing four City of Rialto employees, saying two dogs were stolen from her property during an inspection in January 2005 according to court docu-

ments. Before Rialto officials raided Spadaro's home in May 2005, inspections were conducted in the months leading up to the seizure of the animals. This case will go to trial July 27.

Spadaro, who in 2006 took over Grisco's Kennel in Riverside, also faces a criminal case in Riverside County on more than 400 citations issued by county animal control services.

The citations, largely for not having licenses or proof of vaccinations for 242 dogs at the Riverside kennel, were written after an inspection in February this year. A hearing is set for May 8.

Spadaro declined comment on this case. Spadaro, who is an attorney, is representing herself in all of the cases. According to the California State Bar website, Spadaro's status is active and has no record of discipline since she was admitted in 1970.

### Mandarin Chinese to be added to foreign language at Beverly

The BHUSD Board of Education is moving forward to include Mandarin Chinese as

a foreign language option for students at Beverly beginning this fall.

Board of Education member **Brian Goldberg** said he is interested to see how many students choose to take Chinese as a foreign language course.

"I support providing as many educational opportunities as possible for our students and believe this is an important goal for the district," said Goldberg. It is also important to provide resources for core academic programs and determine student support before we commit limited resources to additional course offerings like Chinese."

Mandarin Chinese will be offered in addition to Spanish, French, and Hebrew. Latin will be offered only to second and third year students who have already taken the first year course.

Students must complete two years of foreign language to meet the high school graduation requirement and it is recommended that students complete at least three years of the same foreign language to meet entrance requirements for four year colleges and universities.

Students are currently being surveyed for interest. Based upon student interest, staff will determine costs for staffing and resources needed to offer the course.

The Board of Education is committed to offering three years of the course if there is enough student interest.

A part time position for a certified teacher for Mandarin Chinese has been posted.

According to Assistant Superintendent **Ilene Straus**, once final student interest is obtained, a report will be made to the Board of Education in May indicating student

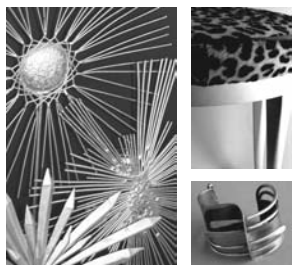


### Mayorkas nominated by Obama for key administration post

behaviors keep us in an endless cycle of pain.

The next thing is to really love and validate yourself first. Women and girls often are the community makers. We like to make everyone around us feel good. If you love yourself and you can validate yourself, you're in a much better position to attract that kind of love from the world around you.

The last thing is to pay it forward. To share what you know. One of the critical elements of being able to express your self worth is giving back to society. Volunteering and community activism. It's one of those things that builds your self esteem.

### What's your favorite thing about living in Beverly Hills?

I love to live in Beverly Hills. I have lots of dear friends here. Beny Alagem from the Hilton, [planning commissioner] Lili Bosse is a dear friend of mine, and Vicky Mense of Xi'an restaurant. We've lived in Beverly Hills for quite some time. It's so beautiful here, the greenery, the trees. It's nice to have a village-community feeling. This city is planned well.

I owned a store in Beverly Hills for a while. It was called "A Child's Room," on the corner of Charleville and Beverly. I closed it after the Gulf War in 1991, at that moment when we were watching SCUDS fall in Israel, it was frightening. I just couldn't sustain it

anymore, but it was a lovely store that I had for several years. I was a member of the Chamber of Commerce, and it's just a really great environment here.

### What other projects are you working on?

I'll be involved with women's issues for a while. This is a top priority for me. I started a foundation specifically for this, called Self Worth Foundation, where the book's proceeds will go. Our family foundation [Saban Family Foundation] is dedicated to making a difference in the lives of children, and has spread to families, senior citizens, and global health. We're very connected to Israel, so we have committed resources to Soroka Medical Center, a very special hospital in Beersheba.

We also support Children's Hospital Los Angeles, the Saban Free Clinic, and we've given over the years to Cedars Sinai as well.

I think it's important to be able to advocate for things when you have a voice and the ability to put it out there. Community service and giving back doesn't have to be financial. We can share our talent and time, and all of these things are extremely important. If what you can do is advocate by talking or writing, I think that you should do that. I think that we all participate in the way we can, and if we do, our society is enhanced. Because we can't do anything about the quantity, but we can certainly affect the quality.

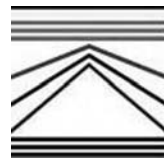

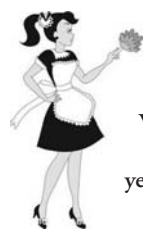
