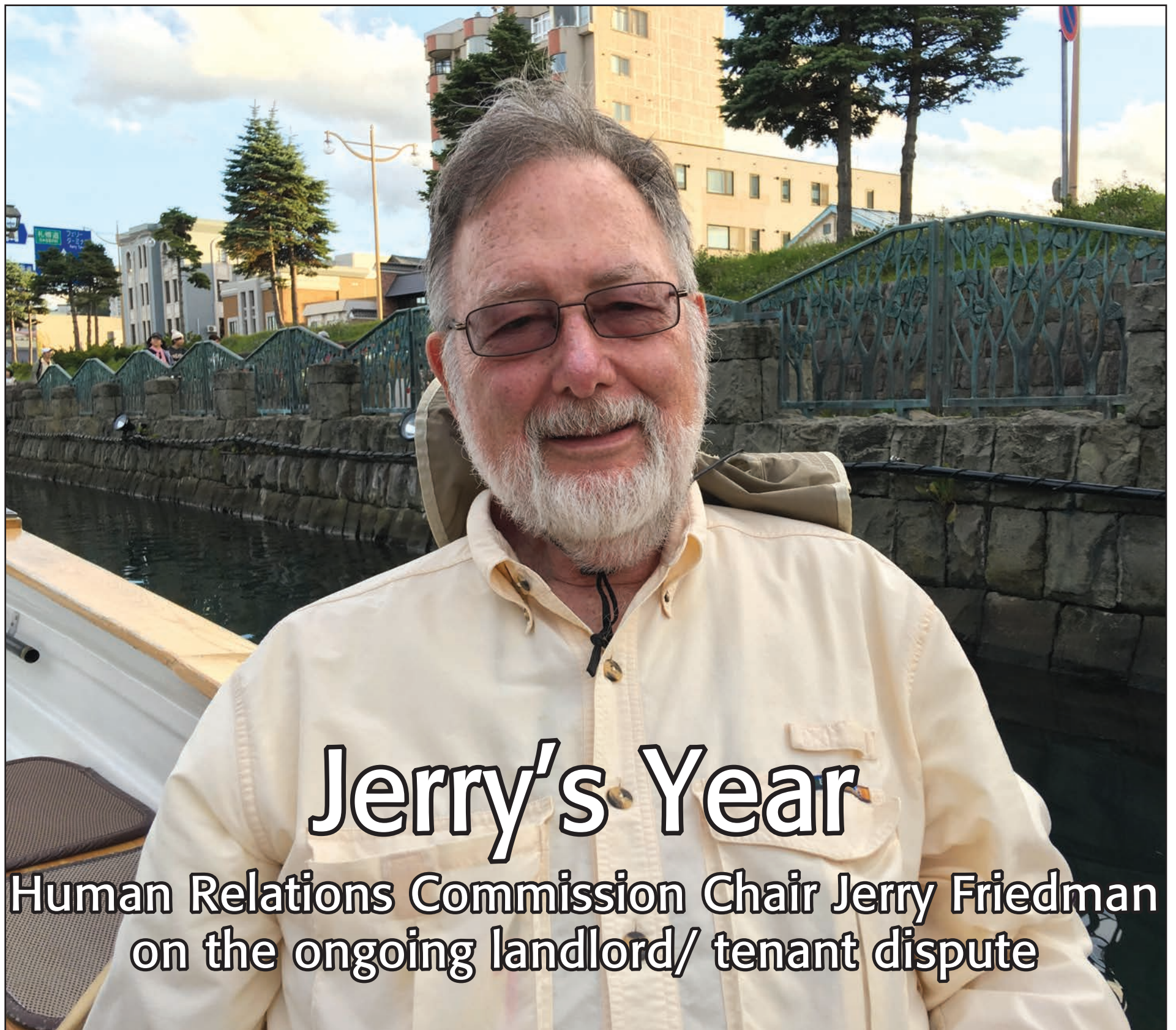

Prior to the most recent update, there were 26 unsigned vote-by-mail ballots received by the County before Election Day, according to City Clerk Byron Pope. Pope also indicated there is a "curing" process, and these 26 ballots were signed by the registered voters were eligible to be counted in yesterday's update.

The County indicated that this is the last tabulation of election results. All city results were certified by the end of the day on Tuesday.

The new Council will be installed on March 28, 7:00 p.m. at the Academy of Arts and Sciences Samuel Goldwyn Theater. Councilmember Lili Bosse is expected to be the next mayor.

Goldberg continues to pursue lawsuit against BHPD years after his arrest

Former Board of Education member Brian Goldberg filed a second complaint on Thursday, March 9 alleging the Beverly Hills Police Department falsely arrested him without a warrant and probable cause.

Goldberg was arrested on March 9, 2015 by the BHPD on battery charges. The then-Board president reportedly shoved 18 year old Nahal Yashar, knocking her to the ground inside the Tower Drive condominium building where they were both residents.

After the incident, a lawsuit was filed against Goldberg on behalf of Yashar. The Los Angeles County District Attorney's office dropped the charges against Goldberg.

Goldberg brought forward his initial lawsuit against the BHPD and Yashar last March.

The 2017 complaint does not name Yashar as a defendant.

City attorney Larry Wiener explained to *the Weekly* filing two complaints, instead of a motion to amend the initial complaint, is not standard protocol.

"Filing a new complaint two years after the incident is procedurally irregular," Wiener said. "Normally, one would bring a motion to amend the complaint and the court would rule on the motion. We will address this procedural irregularity with the court, but in the end it doesn't change our opinion regarding the merits of this case."

The new complaint also indicates Goldberg believes his arrest was directly correlated to the Board of Education's denunciation of then-Police Chief David Snowden's involvement with Evidence Based, Inc.

"[Goldberg] called attention to and exposed the appearance of corruption and collusion involving the BHPD and [EBI].

[Goldberg] exposed payoffs by EBI to [Snowden], and the refusal of the BHPD to provide on-campus security services to the school district," according to a copy of the complaint obtained by *the Weekly*.

Attorney Arthur Barens, representing Snowden, called Goldberg's accusations

"total fiction."

"For years Mr. Goldberg has been making false charges that the BHPD retaliated against him. There is no evidence of that. That is total fiction. He has some obsession with the [police department] and a need for vindication, which he's not going to get with false [accusations]."

Barens also asserted that the new complaint brought forward by Goldberg and his attorneys earlier this month does not alter the alleged series events of events that initially triggered the arrest.

"The fact that he's refilled [the lawsuit] doesn't change the facts of what happened here, the police proceeded on [a citizen's complaint] that he violently pushed a woman, those facts aren't going to change because he's filed lawsuits. He's made a fool of himself before and now he gets to repeat that."

Attorney Gregory Smith, representing Goldberg, did not return *the Weekly's* call in time for comment.

Community Development to take over for Human Relations Commission on rent stabilization

The Human Relations Commission was informed at its meeting last Thursday that future of rent stabilization will no longer be under its jurisdiction.

Human Services Division Administrator Jim Latta explained that the work will be transferred over to the City's Community Development department.

"At this point, the [City] Council has put our Commission's work on hold," Latta said. "We've done everything we can. It's going to Community Development and they're working on some of the details as far as rent [stabilization]."

Latta noted that the Human Relations city staff will be working closely with Code Enforcement to transition the work over to the Community Development

department.

At the meeting, Community Services Director Nancy Hunt-Coffey elaborated on why the decision was made to move the tenant/ landlord program to the Community Development department.

"There was some soul searching that took place here in the City," Hunt-Coffey said. "[I think] we did a very good job, but there was some soul searching about where it is most appropriate for the landlord/ tenant program, moving forward, to sit in the City structure. [Traditionally,] housing issues, code enforcement issues [and] inspection issues reside in the Community Development department. They have quite a bit more experience, than I have, with the various laws, regulations, building codes and all of those kinds of things."

Hunt-Coffey told the Commissioners that the Community Development department has started to work on some of the ordinance's structural components.

"The Community Development department has already started working with the IT department, based on work that we did, to start developing the backbone for the rental registry

program. They are working on [having] an appeal process for landlords who feel they need to raise the rent beyond the three percent."

The Council unanimously approved a Rent Stabilization Urgency Ordinance to restrict no-cause tenant evictions and rent increases on Jan. 24. The ordinance capped tenant rent increases to three percent per year and established payment of relocation fees to tenant issued 60-day non-just cause termination notices.

The Human Relations Commission has hosted several Tenant Landlord forums to receive community feedback on the urgency ordinance.

The Commission also brought forward initial suggestions for the Council to consider, such as create a database for the approximately 8,600 multi-family units with descriptions of their current conditions, utilize the database to establish a Rental Registry Program in the City, change the current no-cause termination ordinance in Beverly Hills to include a relocation fee, and develop methods to limit annual 10 percent rent increases.

Beverly Hills property owners such

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as Michael Vilkin have voiced concerns about how the Rent Stabilization Ordinance will impact their business.

"I don't raise people's rates every year," Vilkin told the Weekly [Issue #906]. "My raises are not very high on average. However, it doesn't flow smoothly. There are some years where the market doesn't allow you to raise very much at all and some years where, to catch up to market, you have to raise a lot larger. I don't think the landlords are being well represented."

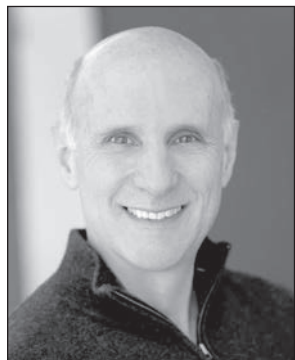
Fresh faces bring new perspectives to City Council

The two new councilmembers being sworn in on Tuesday bring with them unique qualities from diverse professional backgrounds.

Les Friedman is a certified specialist, through the State Bar of California, in Workers' Compensation Law. In 1986, he created his law firm solely focusing on representing injured workers within

consultant Robert (Bob) Wunderlich has a Ph.D. in Chemical Physics from Harvard University and later became a registered chemical engineer.

He went on to co-create Discovery Economics, Inc. in 1999. For more than 22 years, he has provided economic and financial consulting for nationally prominent businesses and prestigious law firms.

Since 2007, Wunderlich has been the Beverly Hills Director on the Board of the Metropolitan Water District, the government body that is the water wholesaler for 19 million people in Southern California. As the representative of Beverly Hills, he works to ensure the City and region maintains a reliable, sustainable source of water.

His position on the Board of MWD will

be open once he is sworn in. The Council appoints the MWD Director in the same manner in which Commissioners are selected, according to City Clerk Byron Pope. There will be an application process, interviews, a liaison/ interview panel report and recommendations.

The Public Works Services Department serves as the liaison and staff for the MWD Director.

Fine Arts Commission gets outside perspective on how to incorporate more cultural activities

Cusick Consulting President Jessica Cusick came to the Fine Arts Commission meeting last Thursday to provide insight

on how the City could enhance its capacity for events related to cultural and the arts.

At the request of Mayor John Mirisch, city staff has recently start-

ed researching potentially expanding the purview of an existing commission or creating an entirely new commission to handle cultural and art activities.

Community Services Director Nancy Hunt Coffey explained that the jurisdiction of the Fine Arts Commission is currently limited to the acquisition of fine art.

"The purview of the Fine Arts Commission is really restricted to the purchase and placement of 'world class fine art,'" Hunt Coffey said. "The desire [that has been expressed by Mayor John

Mirisch] is to look at expanding the scope of one of the commissions in the City to include a cultural arts component."

Chair Alan Kaye asked Cusick to elaborate on the ways in which Santa Monica incorporates cultural dealings into city government.

"As Cultural Affairs Manager, I was a manager within the department of Community and Cultural Services," Cusick said. "[The] Cultural Affairs division has responsibility for a number of facilities within the [City of Santa Monica], including the Miles Playhouse, the Civic Auditorium and the Beach House. It is responsible for the full spectrum of the cultural life in the City, from grants, to events, to public art, [with] the exception of landmarks and historic preservation."

Cusick left her role with the City of Santa Monica last March to return to consulting. As part of her work with Santa Monica Cusick developed "Glow," a unique, all-night art event that drew over 200,000 visitors in its first year. Over \$750,000 was raised to put on an event of this magnitude.

"We mostly had foundation support," Cusick said. "Foundations loved [Glow] because of the reach of the program. [Getting] 150,000 people attending a free event [was something they] loved."

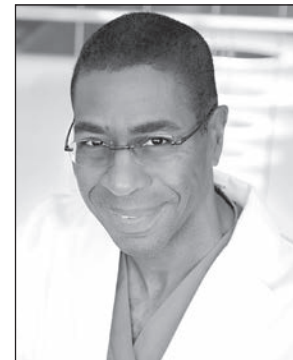
pated in the highly interactive, half-day event working to inspire the next generation of neurosurgeons and scientists.

Highly visual, BrainWorks offers excellent photo and video opportunities of students performing surgery on human simulators, interacting with neuroscientists and participating in experiments.

New this year, students had the opportunity to use a new high-definition imaging device to perform simulated surgery and see inside the brains of patient simulators. The simulators have pulses and can eat, breathe, speak and blink.

Black started Brainworks in 1998 to help cultivate the same kind of passion for science that he discovered as a boy. He welcomes the students and introduce them to techniques in neurosurgery.

"Brainworks came about because we wanted to expose as many young minds as possible to how exciting science is and especially how fascinating the brain is," Black wrote in a statement. "Once they experience performing virtual surgery on a robot and look at tumors under a microscope, they start to believe that becoming a neurosurgeon or neuroscience researcher is in reach."

Alana Morgan 2016 Junior Miss South Bay El Rodeo eighth grader

JERRY'S YEAR

Human Relations Commission Chair Jerry Friedman on the ongoing landlord/tenant dispute

Why did you decide to join the Human Relations Commission?

I was fascinated by the mission, [which is] to try and engender friendship and civility among the residents of Beverly Hills. [The Commission] had just finished up discussions and hearings [regarding] the Noise Ordinance, which allowed people to air their feelings while also understanding [the opinions of others.]

I felt it would be beneficial to be on a commission that enables the citizens to express their concerns [without peer reprisal].

Your commission has recently garnered some criticism for its involvement in the Rent Stabilization Ordinance passed by City Council at the end of January. What have you and your colleagues learned throughout this process?

I want to be clear that our mission was not to draft an ordinance. Originally, our mission was to educate the landlords and tenants on their rights. This was before the ordinance was even brought up, about a year and a half ago or so. We prepared and updated the landlord/tenant handbook because we recognized from our meetings that both landlords and tenants did not know what the laws were in the City.

When we got into the direction of what we'll call the "ordinance discussions" we were hearing that there was [a wide variety of both landlord and tenant experiences.] Everyone is entitled to their own opinions based upon their own experiences.

We learned, even before the ordinance, that there was a group of land-

lords who were not compassionate, to say the least, and there were also a lot of compassionate and considerate landlords. Similarly, there were a lot of tenants who were both respectful of the premises and the landlords and there were tenants who felt they were being mistreated. A lot of them were being mistreated.

We were there to let them express themselves without fear of peer reprisal so that the Council could understand what the emotions of the City were and what was happening to the various residents.

Outgoing Commission Chair Ori Blumenfeld told *the Weekly*, "We are a commission, not a legal body. If lawyers need to get involved [with rent stabilization] it's not something our commission can resolve." [Issue #801] At last week's Commission meeting, it was announced rent stabilization will move to the City's Community

Development department. Was this issue out of reach for the Commission?

It appears, at the present time, the Council felt that the Community Development services were more appropriate to handle the landlord/tenant mediation. That's solely within the control of the Council.

I do not know whether or not, if afterwards, we will become the hearing process and the recommending process to hear all residents' opinions [after the conclusion of that mediation]. That has not yet been decided. That is up to the Council.

One of [the] disappointments I had was the fact that the whole process

seemed to bring forth to the surface a lot of discontent [between] many tenants and landlords. It was not, at times, the civility we would appreciate in our city.

We'll see what happens with Community Development. They are apparently better staffed to handle the work on the resolution and on the ordinance.

The one recommendation we did give was we felt it needed more time. [The Council] has given it more time with [an interim] ordinance. There will be a panel with more discussions and there could be changes. We are looking at going from discussions, to more discussions, to panels and then that final result about the interim ordinance; or at least keeping parts of the interim ordinance in effect to prevent retaliation by certain landlords.

I think it's going the right route. This is a problem that's going to take a lot of time. There are a lot of ramifications that have not been fully analyzed by everybody.

Moving forward, what do you think will be the biggest challenge for the Human Relations Commission?

We will be back to hearing our landlord/tenant forum to try and address specific tenant or landlord concerns. We are focusing, now, back to some of our original mandated charges like our civility award. We're also looking at going back and doing our competition for anti-bullying videos among the schools to get our goal of a more civil city out to the neighbors and the residents.

We will also continue our goal, which is very important, of monitoring the ambassador program which we helped initiate.

How do you respond to people who question the Human Relations Commission's relevance?

I believe it's very relevant. We are trying our best to make this a city we're

all happy to live in. [Throughout] the time I've been on the Commission, the 'One Book, One City' session brought together 500 to 1,000 people that showed up. That was a crowning achievement of that year's commission. We're looking at possibly trying to do it again.

We're bringing to the forefront the good in the community. I think it's very important to be reminded of that.

Tell us about your family.

We've been residents of Beverly Hills for about 30 years, since my youngest son [Ari] entered the third grade at El Rodeo. My wife, Judi, served [as chair] of the Fine Arts Commission [in 2011]. She is active in the arts. She's been involved with

the Museum of Contemporary Art downtown.

I have five and a half grandchildren. I say five and a half because the sixth one will be here sometime in May. My son, Josh, was a member of the [Citizens Oversight Committee] for a while.

What is one thing you would like to accomplish one year from today on the Commission?

Unfortunately, this year we've had so many preset subjects that we really haven't had much time to get into anything new and positive.

Our staff has been stretched very thin, both with the landlord/tenant and now also with the Community Assistance grant fund which we also process with the Charitable Solicitations Commission. In the next month or two, we recommend approval for the various applicants for those funds.

My goal is for us to have enough time to promote the anti-bullying video. I hope we're able to do that this year.
