“The L.A. Riots: Twenty Five Years Later”

[Issue #917]

The day of the riots, I left my then-job at Torrance Unified School District where I was the Director of Purchasing. My mother had just come home from the hospital and I wanted to check on her.

My parents' home was located one block off Manchester Avenue and one block west of Normandie Avenue, basically right at the flash point of the riots. We watched on TV, horrified, as they drug Reginald Denny out of the truck. The next three days were the most frightening thing I have ever lived through.

As soon as darkness fell, the sky was red with fire. Henry's market on Normandie, the market I went to all my childhood, was up in flames. The store next to it was also on fire. Everything was on fire.

The police were nowhere to help. We now find out, 25 years later, that Daryl Gates would not allow police officers to respond in order to “show” the rioters for protesting the continual police harassment.

Soon, the power was out. We were in the dark except for all the fire. We were still able to watch TV because my dad hooked

up a generator for power. We ran the bathtub full, so we would have water.

The word on the block was that the Western Surplus was looted and all the guns and ammunition were taken. Rioters were also looking for anybody who had trucks to steal.

That's when we were faced with the first dilemma of the riots. We had a pick-up truck, a Ford F150, which was parked across the street from our house.

We were standing on the front porch watching the bandits go by through the smoke with bandanas over their faces, riding in the backs of trucks holding rifles and guns. We needed to get our truck off of the street, before the bandits stole it, but we were scared. The looters were whizzing by and could carjack the truck. We knew the police would not come and it would be gone.

We devised a plan. My brother would drive the truck, my dad would escort the truck on foot with one of his hunting rifles, and I would stand on the front porch with another rifle. It took us about 15 minutes to get in the truck, turn into the drive way and get it safely locked behind the gate.

The second dilemma came during the second night of the riots. My mom was not recovering well from her surgery and needed to go back to the hospital, but by now the National Guard was in place with a curfew.

It was after curfew and my mom's fever was very high and her surgery area was infected. My dad drove the three of us down side streets. We had to cross over Western Avenue and 89th Street to get to Centinela

Hospital.

We knew the tanks were on Western, and we were scared. We inched the car down 89th Street to Western and the tank let us pass less than 50 feet away.

By the third day, I was able to go back to my own home. I asked my then-fiancé to take me somewhere there were no riots, no curfew. We went about 15 minutes up the 405 to Huntington Beach, where everyone seemed to be unbothered by the riots; two completely different worlds existing 15 minutes from each other.

Today, my mother still lives there. We own our home free clear. I detest those that say it's much better. It isn't to me. There are no chain drug stores to get prescriptions filled. Healthy foods are not easily accessible. There's one hospital, Centinela.

The Board is currently deficit spending by over \$4 million. Last December, the Board members were charged with cutting \$5 million annually from the district's budget.

"The projected deficits have grown larger year after year because increases in expenses outpace revenue growth," the district's letter stated. "Prior school boards have reduced expenses by eliminating administrative positions and deferring maintenance projects; but the root causes of the deficit have not been addressed."

Worst of all, in 2012 my brother was gunned down in a random shooting sitting on our front porch. He was killed on our block with manicured lawns, where most of the neighbors have lived for over 40 years. Police think it may have been a gang initiation shooting.

They don't even try to solve the murders that happen in this part of Los Angeles. They take the tax dollars, but they deliver little services.

Forgive me, I just wanted to tell my story and really how it feels right now. I work in Beverly Hills and I live in Inglewood. I drive through Westchester everyday as my route to work, all better than South LA with better services, access to fundamental stores, and sidewalks without cracks.

PROJECT: 100 North Crescent Drive Beverly Hills Media Center Project

The City of Beverly Hills is lead agency in the preparation of a Draft EIR for the proposed 100 North Crescent Beverly Hills Media Center Project. The public is invited to attend a preliminary “scoping” meeting on Monday, May 15, 2017 at 6 P.M. to comment on environmental issues that should be addressed in the Draft EIR.

Project Location: The project site is located at 100 North Crescent Drive in the City of Beverly Hills (City). The site is at the northeast corner of North Crescent Drive and Wilshire Boulevard. The site is 1.34 acres (58,528 square feet [sf]) and is identified by Assessor Parcel Number 4343-004-047. The project site is regionally accessible from Interstate 405 (the San Diego Freeway) and State Route 2 (Santa Monica Boulevard), and locally accessible from Wilshire Boulevard. The project site is currently developed with a three-story, 106,085-sf office building with three levels of subterranean parking. Historically, the existing building has been used as office space by a 3D technology supplier, a recording studio, a car dealer, and a law office. The Crescent Drive Mini Park is a 12,046-sf public park that encompasses the northern portion of the site.



Project Description: The proposed project involves a comprehensive renovation of the existing three-story office building located at 100 N. Crescent Drive. Construction of the project would include two additional floors of commercial office space that would increase the building height from 43 feet to 72 feet. The project would also include a restaurant dining area and a screening room. The three existing levels of subterranean parking would remain; however, each level would be reconfigured and parking spaces would be restriped to increase the total number of parking spaces. The proposal includes renovations to the existing park, including the replacement of existing trees and seating.

The table below summarizes the characteristics of the proposed commercial building.

Initial Study: Based on the conclusions of the Draft Initial Study prepared for the project, the following areas of probable environmental effects that are anticipated to require analysis in the Draft EIR:

- Aesthetics
- Air Quality
- Biological Resources
- Cultural Resources
- Land Use/Planning
- Noise
- Transportation/Traffic
- Tribal Cultural Resources

Potential cumulative impacts and potential for growth inducement will also be addressed; alternatives, including the No Project Alternative, will be evaluated.

Purpose of the Scoping Meeting: The purpose of the scoping meeting is to present the proposed project in a public setting and provide an opportunity for a full airing of the environmental issues that are important to the community. The meeting will include a presentation of the proposal and the environmental issues to be analyzed in the Draft EIR will be described. Following the presentation, interested agencies, organizations, and members of the public will be encouraged to present views concerning what environmental issues should be included in the Draft EIR. The oral and written comments made during the scoping meeting will provide an inventory of potential environmental effects of the project to be addressed by the Draft EIR.

30-Day Comment Period: The City invites all interested members of the public to attend the public scoping meeting. The City also invites written comments on issues related to potential environmental impacts during a 30-day comment period, which starts on Thursday, May 4, 2017 and will conclude on Monday, June 5, 2017. After the Draft EIR has been prepared, it will be released for public review and comment. The Planning Commission will then hold a public hearing on the Draft EIR and on the project. Separate notices of the availability of the Draft EIR and of the hearings on the project will be released at later dates.

The letter outlined four main structural issues causing the deficit spending: over-staffing, the K-8 model, special education and the salary formula.

Tse took to the BHEA's public Facebook page to post a response denying the Board's claims.

"Once again, [the Board] wants to blame all its financial problems on the salary formula and not on its lack of long-term planning or sound decision-making the past few years," the Facebook post read. "The district email to the community con-

tains information about the formula that is incomplete at best and inaccurate at worst."

The Facebook response also directs viewers to a "Salary

Formula FAQ" created by the BHEA.

Tse disputed the district's concerns about the salary formula being tied to property tax revenue.

"They're trying to convey this concern over something that is very unlikely to happen and if it does happen the effects will be minimal," Tse told the *Weekly*.

The BHUSD is the only basic aid district with a salary formula. Basic aid districts keep the money from local property taxes and receive constitutionally guaranteed state funding. The district is not paid per pupil.

The salary formula determines the percentage of property tax revenue that goes into salaries.

An unusual clause in the contract, signed by the previous Board, only allows the formula to expire once every teacher is the highest paid teacher in the county.

Tse argued that the Board continues to allocate money for other expenditures.

"Why are they still spending money in a way that makes the [situation] worse? They [are looking to create] a Communications Director position, which is an additional salary," Tse said. "Why are they increasing the salary of the Assistant Superintendent of Facilities position? Simply because they want to keep [Jackson's] salary the same as it was when he was a principal, but why did they raise his salary as a principal all the way up to \$200,000 in the first place?"

In March, the Board issued 23 pink slips to certificated faculty throughout the district; though, some may be rescinded due to retirements and resignations of existing faculty.

"A number of interested people, parents and staff members who've come before the Board wanted to know more about the financial condition of the district," Board President Mel Spitz told the *Weekly*. "It was past time for the Board to explain to the community what the financial condi-

tion of the district is."

He added that the two parties had yet to come together to discuss the issues.

"We haven't had a chance to sit down with the BHEA leadership and discuss the facts," Spitz said. "We're all adults; it should be possible for us to agree on what the facts are."

Spitz also noted the Board had a meeting scheduled with the BHEA for the following day.

Rooftop regulations receive update to encompass wider range of use

Rooftop use requirements have been updated to accommodate a wider range of commercial buildings in Beverly Hills.

The City Council unanimously passed an ordinance on Tuesday night amending the previous regulations related to rooftop uses on buildings located in the commercial zones of the City.

"My perspective [is that] this is a bit overdue," Mayor Lili Bosse said. "Communities now are really looking to have this exact rooftop use for lunchrooms."

The issue of outdated rooftop regulations initially came to the Planning Commission's attention when 228 South Beverly Dr. property owner Moshe Kraiem submitted a proposal for the construction of a rooftop lunchroom on his two-story building.

However, the previous regulations dictated that only commercial buildings taller than three stories or 45 feet in commercial zones are permitted for rooftop use.

The new revisions allow the Planning Commission to review rooftop use proposals on commercial buildings under the maximum allowable height limit. The revisions also provide more control over the maximum size of rooftop users, according to City Planner Ryan Gohlich.

Despite the code changes, Kraiem will still be required to return before the Planning Commission to receive approval of his Development Plan Review.

"It has been three and a half years [and the City] has put me through hell, I don't know why," Kraiem said. "It's so simple. I don't know why this is going on for so long. [There have been four or five meetings over the last three and half years and it's costing me \$60,000 a month plus what I'm paying downtown. Nobody cares. I really don't get why they have put me through this for three and a half years."

The Planning Commission had trouble approving Kraiem's proposal because of the project's inability to include additional parking.

Additional parking is required any time square footage is added to a building. The new ordinance allows the Planning Commission to make some exceptions like larger rooftops additions may require more parking to be added while smaller rooftops proposals may not need additional parking at all.

"The people are going to be there whether or not they eat there," Kraiem said. "I don't know what parking they're worried about. It really doesn't make sense."

The new ordinance states total floor area of rooftop uses cannot exceed 3,500 square feet, 50 percent of the total area of the story below, or 10 percent of the total floor area of the development; whichever is the least.

Kraiem is seeking about 12 percent of the total floor area for the inclusion of

restrooms for his employees. A potential exemption can be made the next time the project proposal appears before the Planning Commission.

Council renews West Coast Arborist contract with additional \$300,000

After receiving bids from other tree services providers, West Coast Arborists' contract is expected to be renewed for a three year extension with its annual budget increased by about \$300,000.


At Tuesday's study session the Council suggested it was in favor of the extension and the annual increase in funds to tree care services.

For more than two decades, the trimming, removal, planting and watering of trees in the City has been outsourced, with the vast majority of the work being provided by tree services contractor West Coast Arborists.


After West Coast's contract expired in December 2016, city staff issued a request for proposal seeking contract bids from other tree service companies.

All submitted proposals projected significant cost increases to the City. When compared to a three-year average amount of work performed under the terms of the current agreement, the cost increases ranged from \$306,000 to \$845,000,

according to the May 2 study session staff report.

Therefore staff and the liaison committee recommended a three year extension to West Coast Arborists' current contract. The liaison committee was comprised of Recreation and Parks Commissioner Howard Rosoff, Public Works Commissioner Sandra Aronberg, Vice Mayor Julian Gold and Councilmember John Mirisch.

"It didn't seem to make any fiscal sense to not extend the contract under its current terms," Gold said.

The original agreement provided for a service period of five years with the opportunity to extend for a maximum of three years.

The contract also prohibits West Coast Arborist from taking on any private projects in the City.

"After the screw up with Lots 12 and 13, we felt it was important that they didn't do any work for any other outside sources," Mirisch said.

However, the Council did agree that the contract should be amended to preclude the BHUSD from this restriction.

The tree services budget was reduced by 22 percent several years ago due economic downturn, according to May 2 formal meeting staff report.

Service demands, such as the citywide grid trimming of all pine trees, were short funds in the amount of \$302,095, according to the staff report.

The Council has been working to restore the funds and voted in favor of a total not-to-exceed amount of \$1,692,271 with West Coasts Arborists.

In addition to trimming, West Coast will also be responsible for other tree services like the replacement of the Indian Laurel Fig trees currently planted along Park Way. Commonly known as the Rusty Leaf Fig, the tree produces pod-like fruit which residents have experienced issues with.

Park Way resident Abraham Assil told the Recreation and Parks Commission in 2015 he has fallen twice from slipping on the berries, which coat the sidewalks for several weeks a year during the annual berry drop period [Issue 810].

Interview panel recommends Greer and Alpert as next Public Works Commissioners

Joshua Greer and Charles Alpert are expected to be appointed as the newest Public Works Commissioners at the next Council formal meeting.

The Public Works Commission Interview Panel, composed of Vice Mayor Julian Gold, Councilmember Robert Wunderlich, Public Works Chair Jeff Wolfe and Public Works Commission Jerrold Felsenthal, recommended Greer and Alpert to the Council at this week's study session.

"It really is to the credit of the City the high quality of the applicants we

received," Wunderlich said. "We reached consensus on the two [proposed] applicants and I support this recommendation."

The panel interviewed seven candidates for the two upcoming vacancies on the Public Works Commission.

If appointed, Greer will be taking over for Commissioner Barry Pressman, whose term ends on June 30. Alpert will step in for Commissioner Ron Shalowitz whose term is ending on Dec. 31.

Greer co-founded RealD, a company that develops 3D technology, in 2003. The company sold to Rizvi Traverse Management for \$551 million in 2015. Greer is married to Cultural Heritage Commissioner Lisa Greer.

Alpert served as senior executive of Earth Tech, which built the City's reverse osmosis water plant plan and the public works building on Foothill.

The Council is expected to vote on the panel's recommendations at its next formal meeting on May 16.

Suspect allegedly attempts to abduct child

The Beverly Hills Police Department is actively investigating a delayed report of a suspicious incident involving a female child that took place in the residential area south of Wilshire Boulevard between Robertson and La Cienega.

On Monday, police received a report of an incident that occurred on Saturday, April 29 between 4:50 p.m. and 5:10 p.m. A witness reported that an unknown male subject approached a female child, who was playing outside her residence, and allegedly attempted to usher her into his awaiting vehicle.

The witness indicated there was no physical contact between the subject and the child, according to a statement from the BHPD. When the witness confronted the subject, he quickly ran to his awaiting vehicle and drove away. The subject made no statements to the witness.

The suspect is described as male, Hispanic, 30 to 40 years of age, approximately five feet seven inches tall, average build with dark hair. He was wearing a black t-shirt, black pants and a red baseball cap at the time of the incident.

The suspect's vehicle is believed to be a charcoal grey Honda four-door Accord with tinted windows.

Traffic detours ahead: Santa Monica Blvd. Reconstruction begins Phase C

The Santa Monica Boulevard Reconstruction Project will move into what the City has determined is its "most aggressive" construction phase in the beginning of June.

The "Phase C" work, which involves removing the roadway and replacing it with new asphalt, will take place between Wilshire Boulevard and Rodeo Drive, and last approximately three weeks.

Traffic on Santa Monica Boulevard will be limited to only two westbound lanes and eastbound traffic will be rerouted to South Santa Monica and Wilshire Boulevards. The work and road closures are scheduled in order to keep the project's western section, Wilshire to Alpine, on track for completion before the holiday

shopping season.

Buses will continue to travel westbound on North Santa Monica Blvd with stops at Camden Drive and Wilshire Boulevard. Buses travelling eastbound will be diverted onto South Santa Monica Boulevard in Century City.

Buses will stop just before Charleville Boulevard and continue on South Santa Monica Boulevard with a second stop at Camden Drive. The eastbound buses will return to North Santa Monica Boulevard by way of Crescent Drive.

COUNCIL TO TOWNSCAPE: TAKE YOUR MONEY BACK

Developer protests termination of \$1 million dollar deposit agreement

By Madelyn Pariser

A \$1 million deposit, authorized by the City Council in April 2016, is stuck in limbo as the Council tries to return it to Townscape Partners, while the development company's representatives suggest the return will not be accepted.

"I would love to see many people who don't want their million dollars back," said Mayor Lili Bosse. "But if this is the first, I'd love to watch."

If the deposit is returned, the agreement between the two parties will be concluded.

The Council has been going back and forth with Townscape Partners, represented by Angelo Gordon Real Estate, since February of last year. At the time, Townscape presented an unsolicited development proposal for the 6.5 acres of city property and the 0.5 acres of private property along Foothill Road at Third Street.

However, the Council had yet to engage with the public about what they wanted to

see developed in that space. Therefore, the Council suggested a public review process, funded by a deposit agreement with Angelo Gordon Real Estate.

The \$1 million agreement is intended to cover the price of appraisals, land-use planning studies, economic and financial studies and public notice costs, according to the staff report.

City staff subsequently recruited MIG, Inc., a land use planning and community engagement consultant, to draft a public outreach process. But the Council vehemently opposed the three-phase process proposed by the consultants in August 2016.

Citing the need for impartiality in the public input process, Bosse called the proposed procedure "the complete antithesis" of what the Council had directed [Issue #881].

The Council directed staff not to proceed. A public input and review process never took place.

Former Mayor Tom Levyn is the

attorney representing Townscape. At Tuesday's meeting, he suggested that the Council will not be able to conclude the agreement.

"I have legal reasons why the City cannot terminate the agreement and give back the \$1 million," Levyn said.

He then read directly from the minutes of the August 2016 meeting where MIG, Inc. presented its proposed public process. The minutes indicated that staff would come back to the Council with a new draft for a public outreach program.

"This staff never returned with a revised program and process and that was nine months ago," Levyn said. "Those are good reasons why the City can't terminate and give back the \$1 million."

City Attorney Larry Wiener clarified that the Council can legally give the money back, although Townscape may not accept the return.

"If the Council's desire is not to conduct this public process at all I think it's appropriate [to give] Townscape its \$1 million back," Wiener said. "If Townscape won't take its money back, it can be used when the Council is ready to have a public process."

The City can conduct its own public process without having the developer involved. The money to fund this process would come from the City, rather than

from Townscape.

Townscape expressed interest in being involved in the public process because there is a chance that the City could issue a Request for Proposal after.

"If an RFP is issued and Townscape responds, perhaps they get the project," Levyn said.

Councilmember John Mirisch believes this to be a conflict of interest.

"It's an inherent conflict of interest having a developer fund a public outreach process," Mirisch said. "There's no way to create a level playing field with a developer involved. I would've never taken [the money from

Townscape] in the first place. I would return the money. I also don't believe we need to squeeze every shekel out of every square inch we have in this city, but [we can see] what the public wants."

By the end of the meeting, the entire Council was in favor of returning the money to Townscape.

"I don't want to debate you anymore," Bosse said to Levyn.

"We now have a unanimous council that does not want to do this process with Townscape. You can continue this conversation offline, but for now there's nothing left to discuss."
