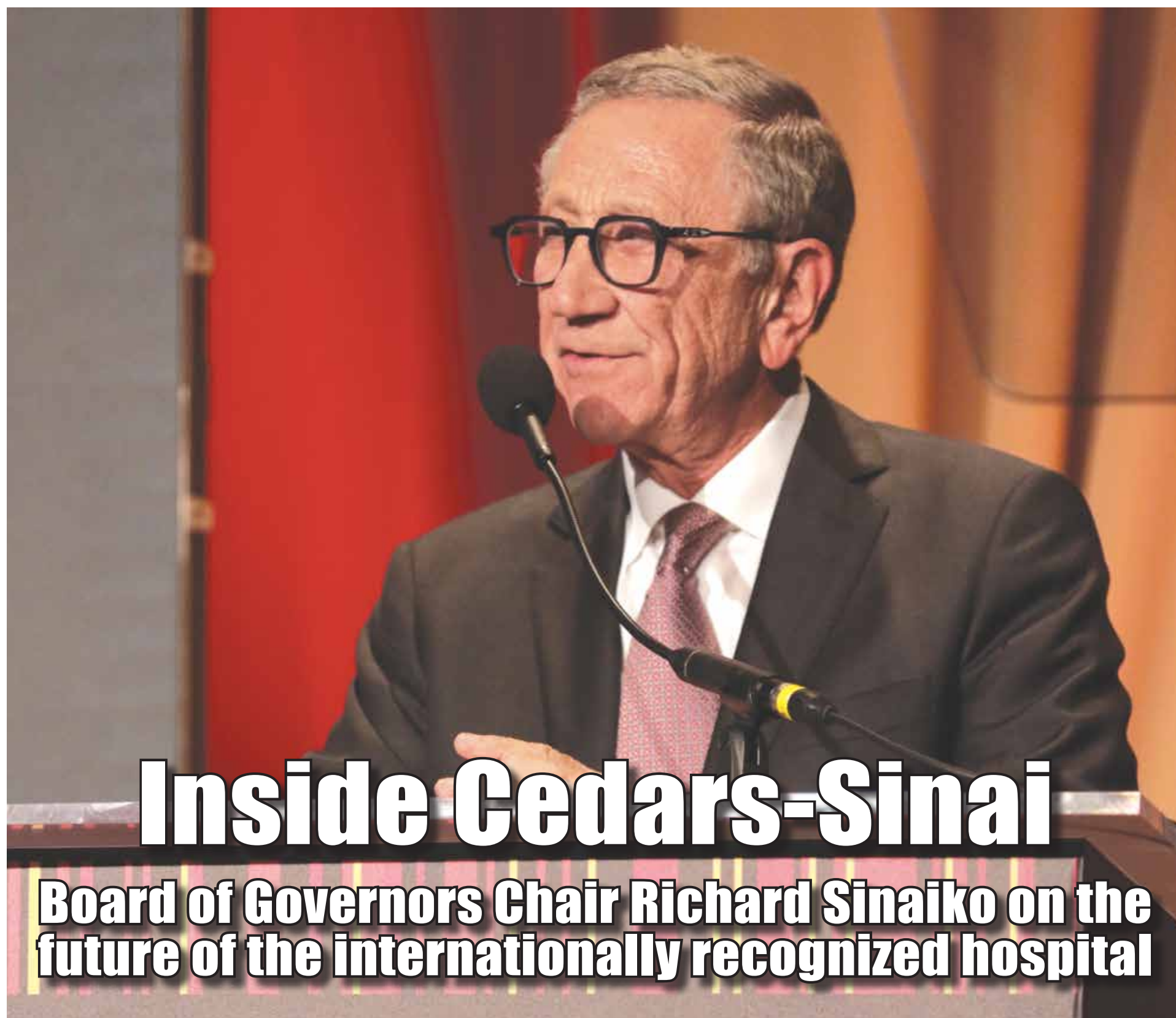

Fiber Installation in the Public Right-of-Way *Now through February 28, 2020*

The City of Beverly Hills has contracted with Henkels & McCoy, Inc. to install fiber in the public right-of-way as part of the Fiber-To-The-Premise project. They will be performing installation of microducts, conduits, pull boxes and fiber in your area. You will be notified when the project is adjacent to your property/residence within a week of being affected.

Street & Alley Improvements Project *Now through September 14, 2020*

The City is currently working on concrete and asphalt pavement rehabilitation in various locations throughout the City of Beverly Hills as part of the Fiscal Year 2019-20 Street & Alley Improvements Project. This project will take place through Friday, September 14, 2020 (no work on holidays.) You will get door delivery of notices when the project is adjacent to your property/residence within a week of being affected.

New Organics Waste Program *Now through March 2020*

As part of the City's new organics waste program, the City will be providing green waste containers for multi-family residential buildings to dispose green waste. Commercial customers will get a site visit and a green waste container for their organic waste.

Businesses and multi-family properties with five units or more and generate 4 or more cubic yards of solid waste per week will be required to recycle its organic waste. Organic waste includes items like food scraps and landscape waste. This is part of the City's ongoing efforts in working with residents and businesses toward achieving the State's sustainability goal and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

"Car Flips on Olympic and Elm" [Issue #1052]

It is no surprise that BHPD did not respond to a query from the Weekly about the rollover crash on Olympic Boulevard last week. The police department's Facebook timeline is punctuated with on-the-scene photos of vehicle rollovers in town. Invariably they go without any department comment at all.

Isn't a vehicle rollover precisely the kind of crash that should never happen on a local street where the speed limit is 25 mph? The police know that excessive speed is a contributing factor to crashes and adds to the severity of crash injuries. Speeding certainly makes the difference between a vehicle remaining upright after a crash or coming to rest wheels-up. Yet no comment from BHPD on these crashes?

The department's own figures show that speeding is a low enforcement priority in Beverly Hills. A decade ago the department issued an average of 40 citations weekly for speeding. Last year officers

issued only 6 speeding citations weekly. That's a whopping 85% decline over the decade. (The number is creeping up this year but evidently not quickly enough to send the message that speeding is not tolerated in Beverly Hills.)

The rollover news item caught my attention for its brevity: no cause or contributing factor was attributed. Even the BHPD's designated media contact, Lt. Elisabeth Albanese, who is the Executive Officer one rung below the Chief of Police, had no comment for the Weekly.

What are we to think when the police department can't help us take the obvious and appropriate lesson from a rollover crash? Where was that familiar bromide, "Speed kills"?

Pickleball Slated for January at La Cienega Park

At their meeting last Tuesday, the Recreation and Parks Commission discussed the impending implementation of a Pickleball Pilot Program.

The paddleball sport, which combines elements of tennis, badminton and table tennis, made waves back in June when a citywide survey verified interest in such a program. The survey collected the community's feedback between February and May, and as a result the commission recommended implementing a trial program to designate one tennis court at Roxbury and two tennis courts at the La Cienega Tennis Center to function as both a tennis court and pickleball court.

During deliberation the commission requested that pickleball hours include operation during both peak and non-peak hours and one weekend day from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

The commission also discussed a tentative Public Outreach and Marketing Plan, which includes a combination of methods, from regular social media posts to e-blasts to tennis players, pickleball players, organizations and E-notice distribution lists.

Commissioner Julian Javor also suggested posting on the USAPA Places to Play site, where people can type in the city name or zip code to find places to play in Beverly Hills, even though the courts would be temporary during the pilot program.

The outreach program will ensue shortly, with the first press releases slated for release this week.

"I think this is great," said Commission Chair Alissa Roston. "We had asked for this because we were concerned about some other programs that had been brought forward that maybe didn't have as much PR before. Of course that was a different grouping, but this looks very complete."

The Pickleball Kickoff event is expect-

ed to take place on January 12, 2020 at the La Cienega Tennis Center.

Could Dayton Way Become a Two-Way Street?

At their November 7 meeting the Traffic and Parking Commission discussed a request from North Crescent Drive businesses to convert Dayton Way from one-way eastbound to two-way.

Eight speakers shared at public comment why they support this change, which would occur between Crescent and Canon Drive.

The commission discussed three different options to address this issue: the first being no change, the second being to

convert Dayton Way from a one-way to a two-way as requested, and the third being to convert Dayton Way from a one-way to a two-way and remove the pedestrian scramble sign phase at Canon Drive/Dayton Way.

But Commissioner Jake Manaster pointed out that removing the pedestrian scramble could actually result in opposite, unintended side effects like further traffic congestion and confusion.

"The intersections are already bad," said Manaster. "We don't know what we don't know yet. I'm concerned that it's a 'be careful what you wish for' situation. We don't know the human factor. Traffic is unbelievably unpredictable."

Their discussion follows expressed interest at the commission's May 2 meeting in converting the one-block section of Dayton to gain access to the 9361 Dayton Way City-owned parking garage from Crescent Drive.

The parking facility on the northeast corner has retail businesses including Beverly Hills Market, Pioneer & Lucerne Hardware, Beverly Custom Cleaners, and the U.S. Post Office.

The businesses expressed that with the closure of North Canon Drive as part of Metro Purple Line construction mitigation, customers accessing the 9361 Dayton Way parking facility from Wilshire Boulevard would need to use Beverly Drive or other streets to the east due to the existing one-way configuration of Dayton Way. They explained that by converting the one-block section of Dayton Way, customers could use Crescent Drive to access the parking structure entrance.

"If we advocate as a group for a two-way, think about what the impact of traffic turning into that parking structure would be," said Commissioner David Seidel. "We'd be dealing with a cross-traffic situation."

The commission directed staff to request that the consultant conduct further studies and prepare results before the item appears in front of the City Council.

Kusama Undergoes Refabrication

At their meeting on November 12 the Arts & Culture Commission discussed an update on the Kusama piece, which is in the process of undergoing refabrication.

According to Recreation Services Manager Patty Acuna, the Kusama piece is currently being engineered and the City is in communication with Oda Fine Art Studios, from whom it is borrowing the piece.

Acuna said that the current plan is for the piece to be removed in March for further re-fabrication, noting that there isn't presently a plan to situate something else in its place.

Commissioner Carolyn Hiller suggested putting in a sign to explain the Kusama's temporary disappearance, so as to educate the public on its refabrication.

"We're hoping to time it so that the duration will be short," said Acuna, add-

ing that she anticipates no more than two months.

Crime Continues to Decrease in Beverly Hills

The BHPD is crediting Automatic License Plate Readers (ALPR), surveillance cameras throughout the city and an increase in arrests for the reduction in residential burglaries by 50% this year. Beverly Hills Police Chief Sandra Spagnoli says technology has allowed police officers and detectives to "react in real time to crimes in progress," and immediately arrest suspects, recover stolen vehicles and obtain evidence of other crimes committed in the area.

According to the October 2019 monthly crime statistics report there was a 50% reduction in residential burglaries year to date. Commercial burglaries experienced a 14% drop, violent crimes are down 8% and other property crimes are down 16%. In addition to technology, the crime reduction is attributed partly to an increase in pro-active policing, high visibility patrol and an increase in arrests. During the past twelve months, arrests have increased by 7%.

Spagnoli said, "the effort from our residents to keep Beverly Hills safe is shown in these numbers, as well as the decrease in crime we've seen this last year. These community partnerships in preventing crimes and suspect apprehension is, in part, why Beverly Hills continues to be one of the safest cities to live, work and play."

During this holiday season, the BHPD will continue its efforts to keep the community safe by ensuring high visibility of uniformed police officers to include an increase in foot patrols in the City's business district. We encourage residents to sign up for our smartphone application to receive more information about Department events and activities. INSIDE CEDARS-SINAI

Board of Governors Chair Richard Sinaiko on the future of the internationally recognized hospital

Can you tell me a little bit about the Board of Governors and how long you have been a part of it?

The Board of Governors is the largest philanthropic and leadership support group in the Cedars Sinai health system. It has about 800 members, and its mission is to support

the priority projects within the medical center. And so, we just completed a \$30 million campaign to fund the regenerative medicine institute at Cedars and have now launched a new \$50 million campaign that we hope to accomplish in ten years. That's for the Board of Governors Innovation Center. This

is a new initiative where scientists will isolate the genome and makeup of an illness in specific patients and then develop new and personalized treatments for those patients. I've been involved in healthcare for 40 years, and I remember when the first heart transplant was done, I thought that was science fiction -- this is really science fiction. So customized therapies will be then developed to treat a variety of illnesses including cancer, brain disease, heart, gastrointestinal, liver, and physical diseases, and so on. It really is truly, an innovation center.

The Board of Governors recently held a Gala. Tell us about that.

It was very, very successful, and we honored two very important community leaders: Paul Guerin and Don Passman. They both are members of the Board of

Governors. The Gala raised \$2.3 Million, and quite frankly was one of the most successful we have had in recent history. We had over 700 guests attend at The Beverly Wilshire Hotel. And I've been really pleased and honored to be the Chair of this organization for the past two years.

Can you tell us any major highlights that took place at the Gala?

The whole event was very spectacular. We had Howie Mandel as the master of ceremonies, and he was, in my opinion, very funny. And the entertainment this year was by [multi-platinum recording artist] Josh Groban who was absolutely sensational. Seeing him in that kind of private setting was really special.

How are the nominees of the Gala awards chosen and selected to win?

The two honorees, Paul Guerin and Don Passman both have been long, active members of the Cedars Board of Governors and in the Cedars community.

How does one get an invitation to this Gala?

All the members of the Board of Governors are invited, and each of those members typically -- if they're so inclined -- invite friends and people that they think might be interested in Cedars Sinai. Just as an example, I purchased two tables. I had about fourteen guests of mine that came to the Gala. And some of them in the past have become Board of Governors members after attending

the Gala.

How do people serve on the Board?

The Board has multiple committees. Members are eligible, if they are so inclined, to serve various committees to help participate in governing and aiding the organization. I would be remiss if I didn't specifically acknowledge the tremendous support that is provided by the staff of the Board of Governors. Two

key people, Meredith Shikora and Rebecca Garrison. They are truly amazing in terms of how they manage all of the activities of that organization. As you can tell, I think the entire organization is very special.

Are you involved in any other philanthropic organizations at this time?

Yes. I am very actively involved at the UCLA School of Public Health, where I received my masters in hospital administration and served on the Dean's Advisory Board at the school. And I have been actively involved in providing philanthropic support at the Department of Healthcare Policy and Management.

Are there any other upcoming events that the Board is hosting?

Well, our other major event is held during the summer. It's called "Rock for Research." It's held typically outdoors, it's designed to attract not only Board members, but also their families and their children. We usually have entertainment at that event as well. And also, we have food stations from thirty or forty of the top restaurants around Los Angeles who agree to participate.

Is your family also involved with the Board and can you tell us a little about them?

I've been married 52 years to the same woman, Patricia Sinaiko. We have two sons, Jeffrey and Gregory, and they both work in the healthcare business with me. My youngest son, Gregory, is also a member of the Board of Governors.

What can we expect from the Board in the next year?

We will continue to move forward. We clearly have major efforts that are going

to be required to accomplish our goal of \$50 million over the next ten years. The previous campaign was a \$30 million

campaign also planned to be accomplished in ten years, and at last year's Gala, I was able to announce that we exceeded the \$30 million goal in four years. Cedars is really an outstanding institution with outstanding leadership: both administratively from the Board and the Executive team, and with great support from the community.

What are your responsibilities as Chair and what do you love the most about your position as Chair?

My responsibilities are to provide leadership to the organization. I attend virtually all of the various committee meetings and provide some of my perspective and hopefully some leadership and guidance. We have monthly general board meetings as well. This has really been a culmination of my healthcare career. It's just been a real, real honor. My term is actually up now, it's the end of my second year. I'm sorry to see it end.
