#### MAJOR MWD PIPELINE REPAIRS PROMPT CALL FOR CONSERVATION OF WATER

**NOVEMBER 6 - 8, 2023** 

As crews from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD) plan repairs to a pipeline that delivers water to Beverly Hills, water customers across the Beverly Hills service area are being asked to conserve water from November 6th to November 8th, 2023.

Now that work is set to begin on the MWD pipeline impacting Beverly Hills, the City will be utilizing water supplies from its existing reservoirs and from its own water treatment plant while MWD's work is performed.

During the three days, the City is requesting customers to refrain from outdoor watering and conserve water indoors as much as possible.

#### **City Council Special Meeting Canceled Regarding Review** of Sixty Hotel

A special City Council meeting was canceled after Mayor Julian Gold sought to determine if there is Council support to call the Planning Commission decision up for review that approved a Development Plan Review and reauthorized a Conditional Use Permit and Extended Hours Permit for the hotel rooftop facilities at the Sixty Hotel located at 9360 Wilshire Boulevard.

The meeting was canceled due to a lack of quorum.

Derrick Ontiveros, who is a registered lobbyist for the Sixty Hotel, served on Gold's 2020 campaign steering committee.

Specifically, the entitlements include a permit to allow outdoor recreation and dining facilities, as well as to allow an increase in the maximum rooftop occupancy of up to 165, excluding staff.

into housing over an eight-year period. For sites with existing uses, such as office buildings, cities must provide evidence that the existing uses will be discontinued during that time, according to the nonprofit. It is alleged by the nonprofit that Beverly Hills has not complied with these obligations.

The nonprofit claimed that the City's 2013-2021 allocation was just three units. And that recent changes have made the RHNA allocation process more robust, and the City was assigned a 2021-2029 RHNA of 3,104 units, including 1,688 units of housing for low and very low-income households.

It was further alleged that the city shifted its approach and chose to identify "broad swaths" of the commercial corridors as potential sites for housing, even though most of these sites contain established office and cultural uses that have "little potential: for residential development by 2029, according to the nonprofit.

The nonprofit also claimed that the city "drastically" overcounted the development potential on these sites, using a calculation method that assumed that the existing buildings on all of the sites will be replaced with ground-up residential developments, at the maximum density allowed by law.

City Attorney Larry Weiner previously told the Weekly that 60% of the residential units in the City are rentals and 40% of those are occupied by lower income individuals. This made Beverly Hills one of the State's earlier adopters of rent stabilization. Which subsequently directed new residential de-

velopment to commercial areas.

The City has also established a mixed-use zone in order to direct new development away from multi-family areas to preserve rent stabilized units and avoid displacing tenants, Wiener said.

#### Traffic and Parking Commission to Discuss Local Road Safety Plan

At their Thursday meeting the Traffic and Parking Commission is expected to discuss a local road safety plan (LRSP), including an overview of components and how they guide efforts to improve traffic safety.

The Complete Streets Action Plan identifies coordination with the BHPD on the purchase of collision management software for producing regular traffic safety reports as a

high priority.

In 2023, the City acquired software that allows for the analysis of crash data, which the City believes will be helpful in developing the City's first LRSP, according to a city staff report.

"While local roads are generally less traveled than state highways, some can have higher rates of fatal and serious injury crashes. These higher rates are typically due to factors like existing roadway design and unsafe driving behavior. LRSPs help agencies reduce crash rates and achieve a future with fewer traffic fatalities and serious injuries on their roads by establishing a framework for identifying where collisions are occurring, analyzing collision patterns, and prioritizing roadway safety improvements to address

REVIEW OF THE PERMANENT OPEN AIR DINING PROGRAM, WHICH INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING COMPONENTS:

A) ADOPTION OF A DRAFT ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING THE BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE REGULATIONS RELATED TO OPEN AIR DINING

- B) ADOPTION OF PARKLET DESIGN GUIDELINES PROVIDING A SET OF MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF PARKLET DINING
- C) RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHEDULE OF TAXES, FEES AND CHARGES TO ADD A SIDEWALK DINING LICENSE FEE AND PARKLET DINING LICENSE FEE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024
- D) PROCEDURES FOR IMPLEMENTING THE PERMANENT OPEN AIR DINING PROGRAM

#### AND MAKING A DETERMINATION OF EXEMPTION UNDER THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA)

The OpenBH program was started during the Covid-19 Pandemic to temporarily ease regulations related to open air dining on public and private property and is currently scheduled to end in December 2023. The City Council has directed staff to work on permanent changes to the City's open air dining program throughout several City Council Ad Hoc Subcommittee meetings. Based on direction provided by the Subcommittees, the following open air dining program items have been developed for review and approval by the City Council:

A) Amended Open Air Dining Ordinance: The draft ordinance consists of proposed code changes for City Council for review and adoption. At their July 13, 2023 meeting, the Planning Commission reviewed the draft ordinance and adopted a resolution recommending City Council adoption of the draft ordinance, as well as providing guidance to staff to create a guidelines document for the architectural review process for open air dining permits, and provided Council comments on the extension of open air dining areas beyond the restaurant's facade and in front of adjacent tenants' facades as the Commission did not come to a consensus that topic. The draft ordinance proposes code changes in the Beverly Hills Municipal Code (BHMC) that may include but are not limited to the following:

- · Article 27 of Title 10, Chapter 3 of the BHMC
- o Changes to the parking requirements for open air dining located on private property
- · Article 35 of Title 10, Chapter 3 of the BHMC
- o Changes to the development standards and requirements, and review processes
- Addition of development standards and review processes related to parklets in the public right-of-way
- B) Parklet Guidelines: The City Council will consider adopting parklet design guidelines which include a set of minimum standards for design, construction, and maintenance of parklet dining (dining located in parking meter spaces). The Guidelines also provide details for a 'Kit of Parts' designed and pre-approved to provide a more streamlined permitting process.
- C) Fees: The City Council will consider a resolution to increase and make amendments to certain fees and service charges that are charged to the public for the various activities and services as set forth in the Schedule of Taxes, Fees, and Charges for fiscal year 2023-2024. The new fees are proposed for leasing of public right of way for sidewalk and parklet dining use with the adoption of an Open-Air Dining Program ordinance.

These fees would become effective on November 21, 2023.

D) *Procedures*: The City Council will receive information on a streamlined application process for open air dining and discuss the compliance period for converting existing temporarily approved open air dining areas (Open BH program) into permanently approved open air dining areas.

This project has been assessed in accordance with the authority and criteria contained in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the State CEQA Guidelines, and the environmental regulations of the City. Since the project does not authorize construction, and makes minor changes to existing development standards that apply to a fully built-out area of the City (in the commercially zoned areas), there is no possibility that it may have a significant effect on the environment. In addition, the project reflects minor changes in land use limitations, and do not result in changes to land use or density. Accordingly, the City Council will consider a recommendation to find the project categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15305 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.

If a comment is received after the agenda item is heard, it will not be a part of the record. Public comment via video conference will be no longer than three (3) minutes per each individual comment, subject to City Council discretion based on the anticipated length in the meeting. #### Rafael Moscatel on His New Book "The **Bastard of Beverly Hills**"

You are a class of 1995 Beverly High graduate. You have a new memoir out, "The Bastard of Beverly Hills." What made you want to write this book?

I had been sitting on the story of my adoption for quite a while. I needed to do something that would allow me to heal the pain of learning that I was adopted at such a late age. Upon the advice of my wife, she told me to just put it down in words and see if it might help me through the whole experience. I had actually done a documentary on my grandmother, whom I found out was a

very famous singer in the twenties. Then I learned my grandfather was a composer who wrote the music to *The* Addams Family. I'd written a documentary about it. But I really hadn't finished the personal piece of it, which was more about family and forgiveness. [Since I didn't finish what I started], I decided to do a book instead and talk about adoption and forgiveness.

#### You found out later in life you were adopted and it was kept secret by your parents. Tell us about that.

I always felt a little bit out of place growing up in Beverly Hills. My mother and father were two very eccentric and loving people, but I never felt like I had quite fit into their story. I had market differ-

ences between me and my father. They were Sephardic Jews [and] I was given the name Rafael, in honor of our family, who was from Spain, through the Isle of Rhodes and Cuba. But I am blonde and blue-eyed, and it turns out I am German. I didn't find this out until I was about 30 years old. I was looking through a newspaper and I read about this girl who was the first test tube baby, and she was a little bit older than me. My mother kind of floated the idea that I was a test-tube baby and I naively bought into this.

Ironically, some years after that, we were living on Beverly Drive and across the street from us was Sharon Osbourne and her husband, Ozzy. My father called the police on Ozzy because he would walk around the block a lot. He didn't know he was a rock star and just saw him as a brooding strange man. [The police] came by and explained to my father,

there was this misunderstanding, that he was calling the police on his neighbor. But a day later, his wife came over to our home to apologize and introduced herself because they were our new neighbors. In all the years my mother lived in Beverly Hills, nobody had ever come over to the house and introduced themselves. That just wasn't something you did when we grew up.

But then Sharon looked at my mother and she looked at me and she said, 'Is this your grandson?' At that moment, I realized that something was wrong be-


> cause she noticed that there was an age difference between my mother and me that probably couldn't be explained.

Long story short, I learned about the first test-tube baby, and I basically discovered that my mother and father were telling me a lie. I sent a letter to the State of Calcan't live your life full ifornia, and about a month later, this envelope came and it just blew my mind that I was not their child. Not only that, I was the grandson of a bastard child of the man who wrote The Addams Famihatred towards people who loved me but just made a mistake?"

The Addams Family. My mother was having an affair and she had a baby, which turned out to be me. She wanted

to have an abortion. But my mother got wind of her pregnancy and sent an attornev [our neighbor and former Clippers owner] Donald Sterling to see her. He basically convinced my birth mother not to abort me and that he would pay a sum of money so that I could be adopted.

So I've kind of spent a long time trying to unravel that story. The theme of the book is 'What is home and is home a building?' [It's not], it's a place where vou feel comfortable. So my journey has been trying to find a place where I'm comfortable in my own skin. The only way I can do that, is to learn how to forgive those who deceived me. The book really talks about that. It talks about Donald Sterling's deception, my mother's deception and has a lot of interesting stories about Beverly Hills along the



Part of the book takes place when you are attending Beverly High and you have a section on the late Biology Willie Hale. Tell us about that.

The book is in seven chapters but it's a coming of age story structure. [Mr.] Hale was my biology teacher. He was really special to me because my sister [Marleigh] had failed his course. She was a straight-A student and became a doctor. She is [also] my copilot [and] best friend in the book. But I was always jealous of her achievements. I knew she had failed his class, and he was a very scary looking man, he looked like Muhammad Ali. He was tough. I got to know him very well. Whereas other children kind of just skirted or tried to get around him, I connected with them. He taught me a great lesson about truth and honesty. A friend of mine and I tried to cheat on our biology midterm and he caught us. Then throughout the rest of the year, we would go to his class during lunch and we became very close with him. Then in the story, I talk about how when he caught me, he told me, 'You could have lied and gotten away with it. But the thing is, you can never lie to yourself.' To kind of pair that with the whole idea of being deceived in an adoption, honesty is a big deal to me. If you can achieve that, then you're going to find your way to learning how to forgive people. When you see that we're all sinners, you understand that everybody's capable of it. It's easier for you to forgive once you start forgiving yourself. So Willie Hale taught me that great lesson. You have to be honest if you're going to live any kind of genuine life.

#### You now live in Northwest Montana. What made you want to leave Los Angeles?

My wife is from Ohio. She's a Midwest girl. I went to San Francisco for seven years and came back and lived in Los Angeles. Like I said, I grew up in Beverly Hills on [North] Beverly Drive and Sunset Boulevard. My book is full of crazy stories about [a lot of celebrities] and I was just not that person. I used to go to summer camp when I was a little boy. I'd go horseback riding, fishing, hunting, and I gravitated towards that. So after COVID went down, my wife and I decided to explore other places and see if we could find a better home for our children. We had two at the time and now we have three. We came here, and it was a completely different world [compared to] Beverly Hills, and it was just a lot closer. There's a lot of wonderful people [in Beverly Hills] but I want my children to grow up somewhere a little bit more natural. I didn't want to give them the life that I had even though I enjoyed my life and don't regret [it]. The book is not a book of regrets. But I wanted them to come and breathe the fresh air. In Montana, it's still free. There's freedom of speech, free Second Amendment, First Amendment. People treat each other very differently here, which is why I think a lot of people are leaving California and moving to places like Texas and Florida. It was really for my children and it's a beautiful place.

#### What sort of reaction are you getting from the book?

My book is a very dangerous book because it's also about cancel culture. Originally, it was with Simon and Schuster [but] they were afraid that Donald Sterling and some of the other people in the book would sue them because it has [some] explosive claims. They're not salacious. But it talks about cancel culture, in a way that basically we've cut each other down so much that I wanted to take a dark character like Donald Sterling, and redeem him because he saved my life. So it's very hard to grapple with the idea that there's this man, he's accused of these terrible things over the years, and yet he saved my life. He swooped in and made sure that I was born.

But it's been very well received by [the late actor] Michael Landon's family, who is in the book. Michael Landon is my father's best friend. He and my father had a great life together. I talk about alcoholism and a lot of really rough kinds of drug addiction. But it has been well received. Melissa Gilbert, an actress on the Little House on the Prairie. raved about it on her Instagram. The book has also been positively reviewed by Publishers Weekly, Kirkus Reviews, and had overall great ratings.

I had a friend call me about a month ago, and she said, 'You'll never believe this. I'm a bastard, too. My father and I were talking about your book, and we decided to go get a DNA test. It turned out that my mom was lying to me and I wasn't my father's daughter. I'm just reading your book and it's helping me get through this.' I've known her for 30 years. She found out at the age of 46, which is how old I am now, but I found out at 31. It's nice to hear stories like that because many people in America are adopted. My feeling is that people are always looking for who they are and their identity. So if you're like me and you've been told that you were a Spanish Jew for 31 years, and then suddenly

Tell us about the fundraiser you held in support of Israel.


Amy:It was Monday night, 48 hours after the war started that Saturday. We put out an invitation, sent it to the

community, and 250 people showed up. That night, we raised \$900,000. We started off the program with a moment of silence and within minutes, everyone was crying and hugging. It was almost like I had said that we're here sitting Shiva for what just happened to our world and Israel. Then we were able to zoom in with the soldier that was on the ground. So we had [Rabbi] Noah Farkas giving a speech, and while he was talking, I had to interrupt him and said, 'Wait a second, our soldier on the ground is able to put down his weapon and give us a few words.' So he spoke


about what was happening, and you literally could hear a pin drop in our house. People were shoulder to shoulder in our living room. After that, I spoke and Brad spoke [about it being] the time to give and you have to give until it hurts. This is giving for our future and our life here.

The war started Saturday morning, and I sent the invite out Saturday night. [By Sunday afternoon] I had people dropping off plates, wine, drinks, ice, candles, and everyone [asked what they could do to help]. Someone noticed [we didn't] have security, so then they sent security in. Another person on Monday morning [noticed we didn't have a valet]. It was just this community effort within 48 hours of everyone coming together and helping. The truth is, we were just doing it as a place to get together. We all needed to hug, cry, and lean on each other. It turned out to be unbelievable that we raised so much money. I had my daughter bring 15 of her friends. I had them all dressed in blue and white, and they sat at our dining room table and they all brought a laptop. They had the website out for Brothers for *Life*, which is where all the money went.

> They collected monev on the website. We sent the pictures of our event the next morning to soldiers on the ground in Israel so they could see right away what we were doing for them. It just made them feel like they're not alone.



Amy: We raised \$900,000 that night. [But now we are] over \$2.3 million.



Amy: Brothers for Life is an organization [consisting of] combat wounded soldiers helping combat wounded soldiers get

their life back. So right now in Israel, there's over 500 guys who have been injured badly on the ground, and they're in hospitals. A combat wounded soldier from before will go to the hospital and [tell them about the leg they] had amputated. [To let the soldier know he has] reclaimed [his] life and [they are here for them]. [They will] never be alone whether [they] need medical bills [have] PTSD, whatever it is, [they are there] to do this together. So they have a few houses in Israel that they go to for physical and mental health and just a place to recharge and come together. It's a small but mighty organization. Our dollars are getting very well spent directly to the soldiers.

#### What are some ways people can get involved?

Amy: They can give to the emergency fund because, unfortunately every day more soldiers are joining Brothers for

Life. The beautiful part of it is that when there [was] no war, we brought soldiers to LA. We do ten soldiers a year, if not more and we bring them into our homes and they stay with us. We break them up

into different families and we give them an entire week out just showing them [as] the heroes that they are. [We] take them to different places where people [show them so] much love, put them on a pedestal, and really show them how much the diaspora is there for them.

#### What other events are you planning?

in November, one in Brentwood on November 14, and one in Beverly Hills on November 15.

What do you hope these funds accomplish?

Brad: There's going to be a tremendous amount more that we're going to

need. Just for the emergency fund the goal is \$20 million. The problem is nobody knows what that number will be of combat wounded soldiers. This is going to be an ongoing budget that we're going to need to have. What people can do is get to learn about the organization Brothers for Life. It's combat wounded soldiers helping each other. When they get wounded in combat, their commanders know to call Brothers for Life and somebody shows up at the hospital bed

and they're getting the best kind of rehab you can get. For these soldiers that get wounded, oftentimes they require follow-up surgeries that unfortunately, the government doesn't provide. The organization [helps with] whatever the soldiers need to get better. Recently,



What do you want readers to get out of reading the Bastard of Beverly Hills?

crashes," according to the staff report.

The first step will consist of identifying where collisions are occurring and why they are occurring.

Using the platform, collision data from the past five years will be collected. This will include the number of crashes, the location of crashes, the severity, contributing factors, and involved parties.

This is then expected to lead to the city analyzing collision data and identifying collision patterns to determine which streets and intersections have the most collisions overall, the most serious collisions, and which involve vulnerable road users.

The final step is to prioritize where roadway safety improvements should be made and identify the types of safety countermeasures to consider. For example, roadways with high rear end collision rates may benefit from access-management solutions, according to a City staff report.

After completion of the LRSP, staff plans to implement safety solutions starting with roadway segments and intersections with the most serious collisions.

Staff has started work to prepare the 2023 LRSP using collision data through 2022 and anticipates finalizing and presenting the report to the commission in early 2024.

#### Traffic and Parking Commission to Discuss Mobility Education and Encouragement Program

The Traffic and Parking Commission is expected to provide feedback on proposed elements of a Mobility Education and Encouragement Program, at their Thursday meeting.

The program is meant to expand on efforts to educate the community on transportation safety and encourage residents to try multi-modal travel options.

In fall 2022, the City applied for Bicycle Friendly Community (BFC) status through the League of American Bicyclists and was awarded Honorable Mention for starting efforts to address the needs of bicyclists. The report recommended action items that would help move the City up to a higher level.

The following is a preliminary list of program components staff plans to explore over the next year:

- A Transportation Safety Campaign
- Climate Friendly Business District
- First/Last Mile Resources
- Bike Light Giveaway event to provide bike lights to cyclists
- Targeted Parent Education about how to travel safely in school zones
- Student Bicycle Trainings
- Adult Bicycle Trainings
- Walktober/Bike Month: Events to encourage a wide range of participation

#### BHHS Football Team Closes Season With Victory

Mathew Recupero threw a 70-yard touchdown pass to Ty Sayles in the first quarter and ran 10 yards for a score in the third quarter as Beverly High concluded its 2023 football season with a 32-27 victory at Centennial in an Ocean League game Friday night.

The victory was the Normans' third of the season and second in league play, the first time since 2019 they have won at least three games in a season and first time since 2010 it had at least three victories over Southern Section teams and at least two victories in league play.

Beverly Hills (3-7, 2-3 in league play) never trailed, opening the scoring on Connor McGee's 8-yard run and 2-point conversion

The Normans increased their lead to 15-7 when Sayles caught a pass from Re-

cupero at the 50-yard line, eluded a tackle just past the Apaches' 40-yard line and ran into the end zone.

Oscar Mantville's 10-yard run about five minutes before halftime gave Beverly Hills a 22-13 lead.

Jaxon Tonley kicked a 35-yard field goal with less than a minute left in the second quarter to increase the Normans' lead to 25-13.

Recupero's 10-yard touchdown run gave Beverly Hills a 32-13 lead with about two minutes left in the third quarter.

"We took advantage of how they were aligned defensively," Norman interim coach Tim Ellis said. "We kept running off tackle on the right side. Our fullbacks and our line did a good very good job opening holes for Connor and Oscar and anybody else to carry the ball."

On defense, "we hunkered down after first couple series," Ellis said.

"We were a little scattered," Ellis said. "We didn't tackle well early on. One of their touchdowns came on a short pass. We had guys around for a 1-yard gain and ended up we missed some tackles and he went about 50 yards for a touchdown.

"They really couldn't run the ball on us. They were throwing the ball almost every down. They came out in a kind of a different formation that we made some adjustments at halftime to and that hurt them a little bit."

Recupero "did a pretty good job of managing the game," Connor McGee "ran extremely well all night" and Manville "ran well," Ellis said.

Center-nose guard Daren Berukhim "played an excellent game on both sides of the ball" and cornerback Jesse Jenco "had one of his best games of the year," Ellis said.

Beverly Hills rose five spots to 357th in the MaxPreps rankings used to determine playoff divisions. Centennial (2-8, 1-4) dropped nine spots to 346th among the 373 Southern Section 11-man football teams.

The high school football website Cal Preps projected a 42-19 victory for the Apaches and gave Centennial a 93% chance of winning.

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
