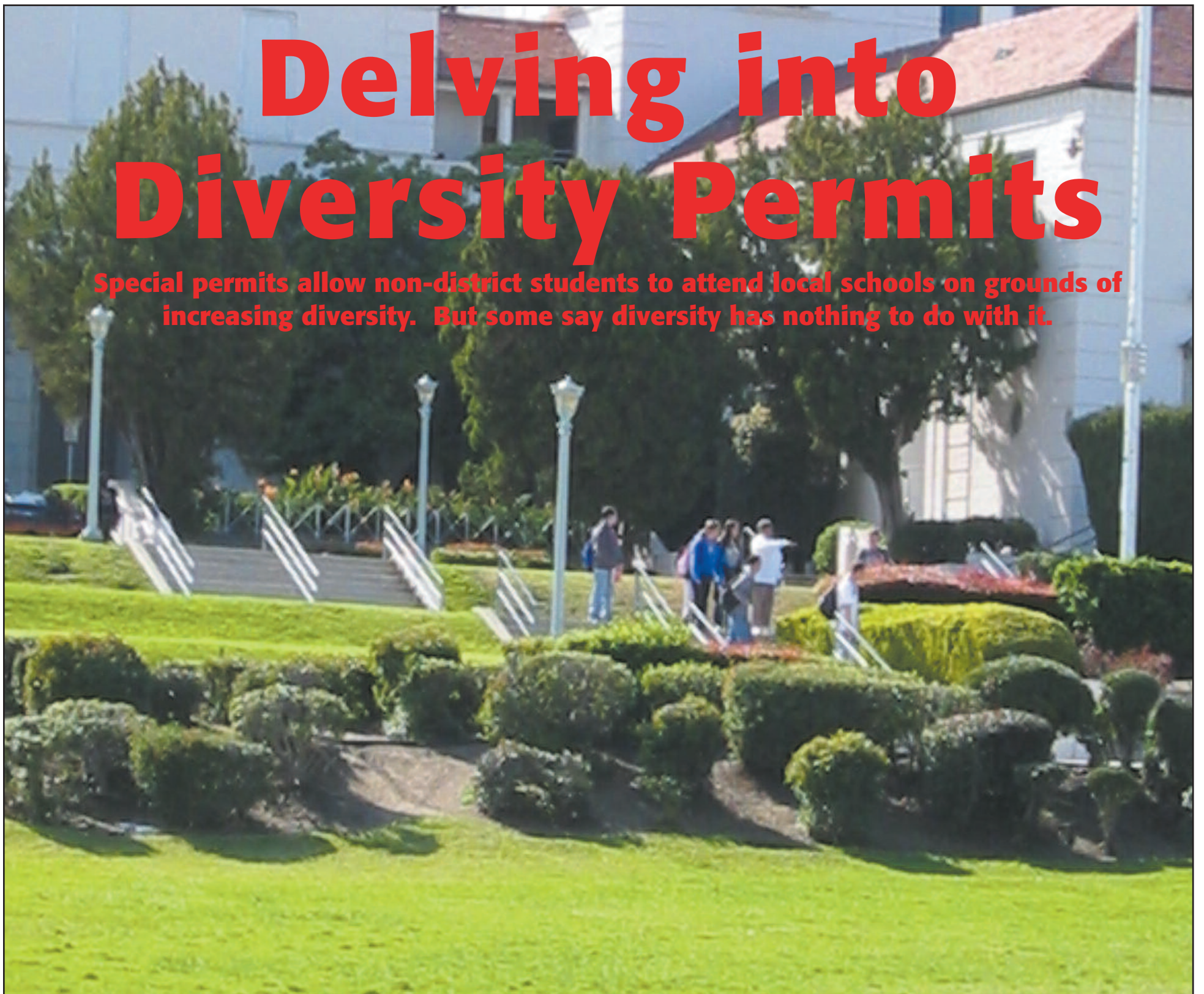

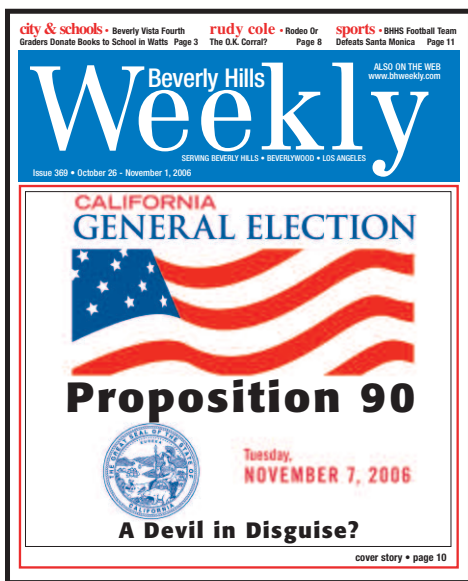

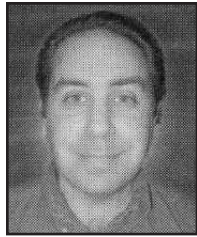


Teachers Union May File Unfair Labor Claim

As the district implements an online grading program, computer non-savvy teachers could be left behind.

The Beverly Hills Education Association, which represents teachers throughout the district, warns that it may soon be forced to file an unfair labor practice with the Public Employment Relations Board of California over the implementation of an online grading program.

“BHEA as an organization has no problem with the idea of doing online grading,” Former BHEA President and current member Stewart Horowitz said. “We just want to negotiate the impact of our having to do this and make sure that those teachers who are uncomfortable about it and don’t know how to use [the software] are given the opportunity to get some training and feel good about what they’re doing.”

The plan to implement online grading is at least two years old and many teachers are already posting grades online. “I personally have been doing my grades online for the past several years and I love it,”

Horowitz said.

Prior to the 2004-2005 school year, the district assembled a technology committee which then created a “Technology Use Plan.” The plan calls for all teachers to be trained to use online grade reporting software by June 2006 and for all teachers to

be posting grades by June 2007. According to the BHEA newsletter, the 2006 deadline was not met. Regarding the June 2007 deadline, “It is unclear to BHEA how the district plans to achieve this goal on time if the software training was not completed on time,” the newsletter states.

“The reality is that there are a lot of teachers who just will never be comfortable with computers,” Horowitz said. “But when we went to the online attendance system for example, we were given the opportunity to be trained on that and that worked well.”

The Traffic & Parking Commission will consider a proposal establishing a permit system for parking on the driveway apron. The “driveway apron” is defined as the area of a driveway entrance between the street and the sidewalk. Only residents that demonstrate lack of sufficient off-street parking (i.e., driveway or garage space) would be eligible to purchase a permit. As proposed, this permit would only be valid from 10pm to 9am. Parking on the apron would be prohibited at all other times.

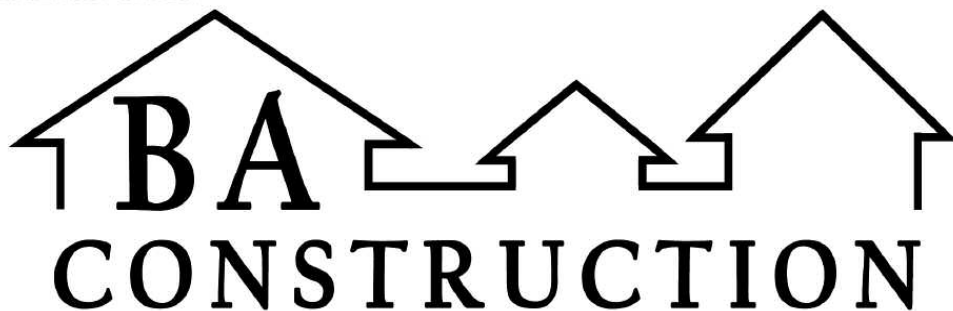

BHHS Graduate Seeking Georgia Governorship

Garrett Michael Hayes, a 1973 Beverly High graduate, is the Libertarian Party candidate for Georgia governor in Tuesday's election and could force a runoff.

Hayes holds the customary libertarian beliefs of limited government and low taxes. He has called for abolition of Georgia's income tax, more freedom of choice in education and ending seizure of private property through eminent domain for private use.

Hayes graduated from Cal State Bakersfield with a bachelor's degree in religious studies. He has long worked in information technology, currently running the consulting firm of Verbal Imaging, Ltd. Co.

Hayes moved to Georgia in 1991 and said has never regretted the choice. "I was tired of breathing air I could see, and, even more, I wanted a place to raise my son where freedom still meant something," Hayes said in a biography posted on his campaign's Web site, www.hayesforgovernor.com.

Hayes joined the Libertarian Party in 1997, and has been active in the Cobb County organization, serving at various times as county chairman, vice chairman and secretary, his current position.

Hayes was the 2002 Libertarian candidate for Georgia governor, receiving 2.3 percent of the vote. He received support from 9.1 percent on the voters surveyed in a Zogby Interactive poll conducted Oct. 23-27. Republican Gov Sonny Perdue led with 48.3 percent, while

Democratic Lt. Gov. Mark Taylor had 36.3 percent. The margin of error is plus or minus 3 percentage points.

Under Georgia law, if no candidate receives a majority, a runoff is held among the top two finishers.

Assistant to the Superintendent of Educational Services Dr. Ilene Straus said the district is currently working on a plan to identify the technology needs of the schools related to online grading and that training will be offered in time for the program to be in place by the end of the year.

"There are some issues around just repairing computers, and there are also issues about individual coaching and support based on what people need and we're in the process of developing a plan that will differentiate these issues," Straus said.

BHEA President Chris Bushee denies that the district has been cooperative in consulting with the union regarding the impact of implementing the program and that training is still needed.

"It's important to our organization that we always behave professionally and we want to ensure that we do things right," Bushee said. "At this time, we have attempted to resolve the issue with the district and it has not been resolved yet."

According to the California Educational Employment Relations Act, the union has the right to bargain with the district over the impact and effects of implementing any educational program. The union delivered a "demand to consult" letter to the district on September 5th 2006, requesting that the district abide by EERA. The request, according to the newsletter, has not yet been addressed by the district.

More than a conflict over policy, the issue of online grading amounts to a rift in communication between the teachers union and the district, especially since both groups seem to support online grading as an idea.

"Online grading is a wonderful tool that allows parents and students to be partners in the educational process, and to become accountable for their learning," Boardmember Myra Demeter said.

Superintendent Kari McVeigh also supports the idea.

"The reason we grade students is to report performance and progress so that students and parents have the opportunity to know what children are performing well in and where they're struggling so that corrective action can be taken," McVeigh said.

"Online grading enhances the timeliness of that effort."

BHEA has its executive Board meeting on Thursday, and will presumably decide whether or not to pursue an unfair labor practice claim with the PERB.

Straus said the district plans to meet with the teachers union soon to talk about the issue, which should mean that drastic measures will be unnecessary.

"I don't think there's anything complicated about it," Horowitz said. "If the district would just agree to sit down with our bargaining team, this could probably be worked out in a day."

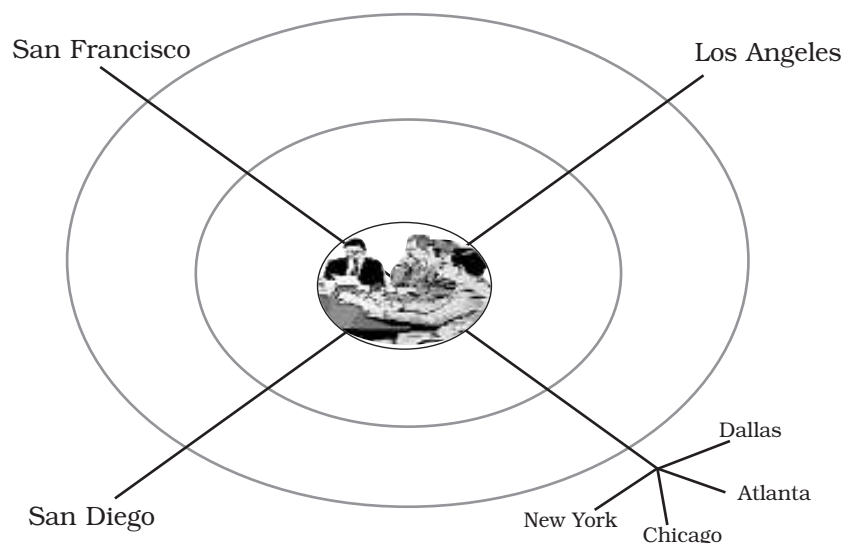

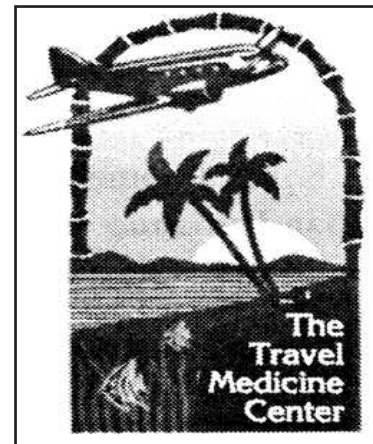

What this country needs is a Consumer's Report for political campaigns: A one-stop where you can obtain a completely unbiased examination of election claims, promises, charges and records of performance. I also favor a traffic free Olympic Boulevard.

Within a few days all those conflicting, confusing and annoying political television spots will have spun out their final 30 seconds, fattening the ad agencies that spawned them and adding little to the elective process. If there is one contributing factor to the decline in voting and citizen involvement in campaigns, at least in major urban areas, it is the television spot.

There is no accountability - no real test of what is true and what is false or deceiving. Imagine the understandable confusion of most of the electorate when they view ads from both sides of Prop. 87. If you vote yes, we will not be so dependent on Middle Eastern oil. Imagine though, the oppo-

nents say that we will become more dependent. An unbiased analysis should be able to very easily determine the truth, but it is hard to find any group or institution without a horse in some race.

How pervasive have television spots become? Some guy running for something called the Santa Monica Rent Board actually bought a TV spot on cable. I had no idea Santa Monica had an elected rent board or that it was such an attractive political plum.

Aside from television ads, the most deceptive tools in campaign are the so-called slate mailers. They are cleverly designed to convince the voter that they represent a political party, either Democrat or Republican. Yes, they carry fine print disclaimers, and there are legal requirements on disclosing who, among listed candidates or ballot measures actually helped pay for or authorized involvement, but that takes some looking. The quick impression

is that the mailer is official.

Let's assume that the oil companies, those paying for all those anti-87 ads, want to off set **Bill Clinton's** support. In your mailbox is a "slate" piece urging you to vote for all the Democratic candidates and, imagine, against Prop. 87! The slate piece I saw said boldly: "Voter Information Guide for Democrats." In fact, most of the endorsements closely followed the official position of the Democratic party. One of the exceptions, the oil initiative.

Ballot measures are often more expensive than campaigns for office. There are two basic voter measures: Those placed on the ballot that would amend the constitution to mandate an action not approved by the legislature and the governor and bond approvals. Bonds for school construction, road and highway improvements, cleaner water programs and other funding needs require voter approval. Ballot measures are promoted by special interests, both the good and the bad kind, and are expensive even to qualify.

Final thought: Probably, the most dangerous ballot measure is Prop. 90. Yes, I know government cried horrendous wolf

when Prop.13 was unleashed and although there were major problems with school funding, the education system did not close down, but this time the League of California Cities and almost every responsible governmental organization has it right. This draconian ballot measure, playing on the fears of eminent domain abuse and placed before voters in many western states by far right interests from outside California, could cripple local government's ability to fund police and fire protection and, very strangely, even make it impossible to prevent high rise development. (Read the nonsense carefully)

If there is one contributing factor to the decline in voting and citizen involvement in campaigns, at least in major urban areas, it is the television spot.

The campaign has offered one alternative to groping. A Coachella valley Republican assemblywoman has informed a high school assembly that she "would not

kick the governor out of her bed." Side bar: I thought the only person getting screwed in this election was poor **Phil Angelides**.

Weighty campaign award: **Cruz Bustamante, Jr.** our enigmatic Lt. Governor, wants you to trust him because he has lost 70 pounds, keeping a promise to his family. The Cruz, now running for Insurance Commissioner, has been the target of a very dirty campaign, but he also has some bad history with his own Democratic party. He too early dumped **Gray Davis** during the recall election, later mending his ways.

Certainly, the newspaper knows that the people of Beverly Hills give more to charities per capita and proportionate to their net worth than almost any other community in America.

Speaking of newspapers, the new community paper, the Chronicle published in

Santa Monica and started by people once involved with the Courier, has lost its publisher. **Jim Lynch** has moved on to become the head of the Santa Monica Chamber. Jim served for a few hours, slight exaggeration, as executive vp of the Beverly Hills Chamber.

And speaking of the Chamber, we credited Executive Vice President **Dan Walsh** and "staff" for the good work in organizing the South Beverly Drive merchants, a long-needed city tool. The "staff" should have been credited since the work of **Anita Zusman Eddy** to make this happen began even before Walsh arrived. Mrs. Eddy is Director of Economic Development for the chamber.

One economic impact of the election on Beverly Hills is the absence of the governor from his favorite cigar smoking venue, Caffe Roma. Too busy electioneering for the pasta? Taking Beverly Hills for granted or giving up on us hometown Democrats? When he returns, **Arnold** will find a new addition next door. DELVING INTO DIVERSITY PERMITS

Special permits allow non-district students to attend local schools on grounds of increasing diversity. But some say diversity has nothing to do with it.

The Beverly Hills Board of Education hosted a special study session last Thursday to discuss the issue of inter-district permits. After an hour-long presentation, community members and district administrators tossed questions back and forth for another hour, but final answers remain elusive.

In 1969, the Board of Education launched a voluntary permit program to bring LAUSD students to Beverly High in order to increase diversity. At that time, Beverly Hills was much less diverse than it is now, and integration was a highly contentious idea among the community. A former Board member of that era who had supported the measure even lost his seat over the issue.

Now, over thirty years later, no local official would likely stand a chance at reelection if he or she were to contest the merit of diversity in the classroom. But with larger class sizes at the high school and with a student body that over time has become more diverse even without non-district students, some question why the program remains necessary.

“What do you think permit kids bring in the way of diversity?” Beverly Vista parent Eric Capogrosso said. “We already have diversity.”

Indeed, according to this year’s language census prepared for the 2006 -2007 Western Accreditation report, 43 different languages are spoken at home by BHUSD students. At the high school, there are 929 students that speak a language other than English.

“This is a true international school,” Dr. Raquel Ramsey, English Learners Coordinator at Beverly High said. “Being the coordinator I see languages and nationalities from all over the world.”

Why then must BHUSD continue to bring in non-district students to increase diversity? “I tend to think it’s a red herring,” Capogrosso said. “To me, this really feels like a money game more than anything else.”

Every student that comes to BHUSD on a permit – there are at least four other types of permits besides diversity permits - comes with a critical package of state and federal funding attached. When students leave one school district to attend another, that money leaves with them and goes to the student’s new district.

This school year alone, BHUSD received a total of \$5.4 million in funding for its 875 permit students that are currently enrolled throughout the district. \$2.5 million is attributed to 417 permit students at the high school, which includes children of faculty and staff.

Besides diversity permits, which are only available at the high school, students can also get permits if their parents are employed in Beverly Hills. Other permits include child care permits, which are given to non-district students who need special education resources

that are not available in their local schools. Siblings of any student on permit are often granted permits as well.

“If the community would like to see the permit program cancelled, the Board needs to know that,” Board member Alissa Roston said. “But the high school would have to be shut down.”

Since the practice of accepting non-district students by way of permits has taken root in BHUSD, permit-derived funding has become a necessary component of the district’s annual budget.

“If you look at the total amount of aid we receive from permits and divide that by the average yearly teacher salary - \$69,000 - that’s about 78 teachers,” said Amy Lambert, BHUSD Director of Pupil Services. “Of course all of that money isn’t allocated to teachers salaries, but it gives you an idea.”

Critics of the permit program, many of them parents worried about overcrowded classrooms, tend to overlook the financial component of the program, Roston said. “People may not understand that yes this is about education and yes this is about children, but it’s also about not going bankrupt,” she said.

In addition, according to Lambert, space is not an issue.

“I think there is a misconception that classrooms are crowded,” she said. “Parents might think that because the teacher to student ratio was 1 to 20 one year that it will be the same the next year. Just because the ratio changes doesn’t mean there’s overcrowding.”

But whereas permits have become a critical aspect of the district’s budgeting and planning process, whereby empty desk chairs in the district are filled by non-district students in order to maximize the amount of funds available, the original intent of the permits, specifically of diversity permits, may be getting overlooked.

A district memorandum regarding the diversity permit program states that students receiving diversity permits “shall be reflective of the diverse racial, cultural and ethnic backgrounds of significant portions in Los Angeles County.” It also states that such students will be awarded permits based on a “random selection” process, which is laid out in the California Education Code section 48301 (a).

“Pupils admitted under the [permit] policy,” the Code reads, “are selected through a random, unbiased process that prohibits an evaluation of whether or not the pupil should be enrolled based upon his or her academic or athletic performance.”

The state constitution forbids public schools from considering race in application processes, but BHUSD administrators assume that any group of students from LAUSD will inevitably differ, both racially and socio-economically,

from Beverly Hills students.

“We can’t just say we want this many African Americans and this many of these and this many of these,” Lambert said. “We pull from schools in Los Angeles where there are large numbers of minorities and expect that it will bring diversity.”

The allegedly random process though, which draws from a school district that is 73% Hispanic, has brought a largely disproportionate number of Asians to Beverly High, where Korean has just this year surpassed Farsi as the most commonly spoken language other than English. In BHUSD K-8 schools, where there is currently not a diversity permit program, Farsi remains the most common language other than English, with 451 students. Korean is next with 235.

Whereas Asians make up 3.8% of students in LAUSD, almost half of the students to receive diversity permits for Beverly High this year were Asian, according to documents obtained by the Weekly through a public information request to LAUSD.

Of the 37 students that received a diversity permit this year, two were Filipino, five were Hispanic, seven were Black, and 18 were Asian. There were also two students that identified as white. All of the students come from nine LAUSD schools, seven of which are over 50% Hispanic and three of which are 70% Hispanic or higher.

The numbers suggest a skewed selection process that favors Asian applicants over other minorities, especially Hispanics. For example, Los Angeles High School, which is 79% Hispanic and 8% Asian, sent nine students to Beverly High on diversity permits. One of them was Hispanic and the rest were Asian.

“The program does tend to bring in more Asian students,” Lambert said, “but we have no way of knowing their ethnicity when they’re selected.”

But while BHUSD administrators may not know the ethnicity of permit applicants, they do require students to submit an official transcript and two essays with their diversity permit application. So while students may not be singled out according to race or ethnicity, their academic performance is taken into consideration.

Once applications are submitted, they are evaluated by district officials according to a special rubric that awards applicants up to 100 total points. Among the list of criteria is “classroom achievement,” for which applicants can receive up to 20 points. “Community Service,” “Extra Curricular Activities,” “School Service,” and “talent,” can net 5 points each and the writing sample offers up to 15 points.

There is no minimum point requirement that

students must attain, according to Lambert, and applicants are not tossed out if they have not participated in a few of the activities listed in the rubric. “But if you have many sections where there is nothing in it, then you’re probably going to be eliminated,” Lambert said. “We want somebody who’s going to come here and be involved in a lot of aspects of the school. That’s one of the goals.”

These criteria seem to conflict with both the Education Code and a slide featured in a presentation at Thursday’s study session, which said that “We cannot be a public school with a private school entrance policy,” and that BHUSD “can only deny a permit on the basis of space, impacted program or excess costs.”

Lambert said she did see a discrepancy in the law and the selection process, but she said the program was evaluated by an attorney in 2000 and it “held up.”

Board President Myra Lurie and Boardmember Myra Demeter declined the Weekly’s request for further comment, both stating a wish to learn more about the issue before weighing in on it.

The disproportionate representation of Asians among diversity permit students may be a result of how the program is advertised, or not advertised, to LAUSD students. Phone calls and emails from the Weekly regarding how LAUSD students learn about the diversity permit program were not answered by Michael Guillemet, Director of Pupil Services at LAUSD.

Matthew Strieker, Staff Attorney for the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund, suspects that permits are awarded to students with the best informed parents.

“It’s about parents who know how to advocate for their kids and beat the system,” he said.

While Strieker said that both he and MALDEF support initiatives whose intent is to increase diversity in schools, he believes that many existing programs are outdated.

“These programs are born out of desegregation litigation in the 60s and 70s and they need to be retooled in light of demographic changes and changes in the legal landscape,” he said.

The Beverly High diversity permit program was reevaluated and ultimately reinstated by the Board in 2000. Six years later, the board may consider more retooling if the district is to restore the program’s original intent, which presumably is to favor diversity, not academic performance.

“Now that we’ve seen what we’ve seen, it opens up so many more questions,” Lurie said, “we’re going to need further study on it.”

Normans seek to remain atop Ocean League

An early injury to quarterback Dex Lucci and five turnovers Friday night led to the end of the Beverly High football team's 14-game winning streak over Inglewood and its 169-game streak of avoiding being shut out.

Lucci sprained the index finger on his right (throwing) hand on the third play of a 20-0 loss to the Sentinels when his hand hit a defender's helmet. He continued in the game, but was removed after having two passes intercepted.

Receiver Erik Munzer who had minimal practice time at quarterback, replaced Lucci and lost a fumble on a handoff and also threw two interceptions.

"It was one of those deals," Norman coach Carter Paysinger said after the loss in an Ocean League game at Inglewood's Coleman Field that dropped Beverly Hills (6-2, 2-1 in

league play) from a two-way tie for the league lead to a four-way tie. "There's not a whole lot we can do at that point. Erik did a great job filling in."

Lucci, who became the starter after Meyer Linter sustained a shoulder injury when he was tackled on a run in the 49-7 victory over Pasadena Blair Oct. 6, completed two of six passes for 27 yards. Munzer completed five of 11 passes for 32 yards.

Inglewood (6-2, 2-1) got all the points it would prove to need on David Freeman's 90-yard first-quarter touchdown run, following an interception. The Sentinels increased their lead to 14-0 on Freeman's two-yard third-quarter touchdown run following a long runback on the kickoff to open the second half.

Marlon Johnson ran 27 yards for a fourth-quarter touchdown following an interception.

"Our team played well," Paysinger said. "It was a game that we would have won under any other circumstance. That's what was so frustrating about it. We didn't think Inglewood was a better team than we were overall, but Friday night, because of our situation, they were."

Defensive tackle Daniel Berkowitz, linebacker Sae Bin Park, defensive backs Dominique Sandifer and Dewayne Taylor and running backs Raymon Judkins (81 yards on 20 carries) and Gerald McGee (45 yards on five carries) all drew praise for their play for the Normans from Paysinger.

In addition to Inglewood, Beverly Hills is tied for the league lead with Culver City and Inglewood Morningside. All four teams have two games to play, all in league play.

The loss dropped the Normans six spots to ninth in the Southern Section Western Division poll released Monday. The Sentinels rose three spots to fifth.

The loss was Beverly Hills' first to the Sentinels since 1983, when they lost 17-14 in the midst of a 1-9 season. The teams played to a 7-7 tie in 1984, with the Normans' winning streak beginning with a 24-6 victory in 1985.

The last time Beverly Hills was shut out was Oct. 18, 1991 in a 30-0 loss to Redondo. The Normans bounced back from that shutout with a six-game winning streak, advancing to the Southern Section semifinals.

What's Next

The Normans are scheduled to play host to Inglewood Morningside (5-3, 2-1) Friday at 7 p.m. in the first game on Nickoll Field's new artificial surface and Beverly High's homecoming game.
