Development talk heats up Town Hall meeting

Municipal League's meeting sparks talk of traffic, parking and boulevard trouble

The proposed Santa Monica Boulevard widening, Wilshire 8800 project or previous developments like Crescent or Canon caused approximately 50 residents to voice their opinions and listen to guest speakers Councilmember Nancy Krasne and Attorney Larry Larson at the Town Hall meeting hosted by the Municipal League on June 13.

"The word is out in the development communities that zoning in Beverly Hills means nothing," said Larson, the opening speaker for the meeting.

Larson stated at the meeting his opinions about the development in Beverly Hills, stating the city disregards the zoning requirements, and allows development

because "the city is thirsty for more money," said Larson.

"What Mr. Larson failed to mention is that one needs to factor in allowing for some greater height, which is offset by less density and less traffic impacts," said Vice Mayor Barry Brucker, who attended the meeting. "Sometimes the coed compliance high traffic use may not be as advantageous for the community and the neighborhood as something a little bit higher which offers very low traffic counts or congestion," said Brucker.

Brucker refuted Larson's argument by using other examples of development that have assisted the city's needs for development, but have not compromised the city's zoning requirements according to Brucker. For example, Brucker used the example of the Legacy project.

"Take the Legacy project for instance. We could have put in a code compliance medical office building. You would have had a 1000 plus trips a day, but what we

approved here was a bit higher, a mixed use condo complex, which has substantially fewer trips per day. This means the impact to the neighborhood is a whole lot less."

Others agreed with Larson and accused the city of disregarding zoning requirements. Louis Lipofsky, who did not attend the meeting, said he agrees with Larson.

"I would not put it the way Mr. Larson put it," said Lipofsky. "But, it is the exception when major developers request exemptions from present zoning and land use ordinances; it is the exception when they do not get what they want. The exceptions have eaten up the rule. The rule doesn't seem to mean anything anymore. There are so many instances, the Montage and the Snyder project. What has happened is that the reputation is that Beverly Hills is a developer's paradise."

Krasne did not formally address listeners

with a speech, but elected to have a question and answer session where she addressed the issue of development, Santa Monica Boulevard and two hour free parking.

"I do not believe in mixed use projects," said Krasne. "The problem is the city is mandated by the state to grow."

Krasne also said that she believes in the two hour free parking for the city and intends to voice this to City Council.

"[Two hour free parking] was proposed, lets not take it away," said Krasne.

Krasne said at the meeting she is against the widening of Santa Monica Boulevard.

Also, at the meeting Mayor Jimmy Delshad and councilmember Frank Fenton were in attendance to listen to the members of the community. Delshad addressed the residents.

"I am still not for the widening of Santa Monica Boulevard," said Delshad.

BHUSD to hire 53 new teachers

The Beverly Hills Unified School District will hire 53 new certificated teachers out of the total 313 certificated positions for the 2007-2008 school year. Certificated staff includes administrators, psychologists, counselors, nurses, and program specialists. The new hires of certificated staff has not changed, it approximate has remained. For the last three years, certificated staff hired has been approximately the same, plus or minus 10 teachers, said Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources Sal Gumina.

There are nine vacancies to fill at the elementary level and the balance at the middle and high school level. Nine teachers are going on maternity leave. As such, replacements are hired on "temporary" status. Usually, a teacher will have a one year leave of absence, but temporary positions do not become permanent, said Gumina.

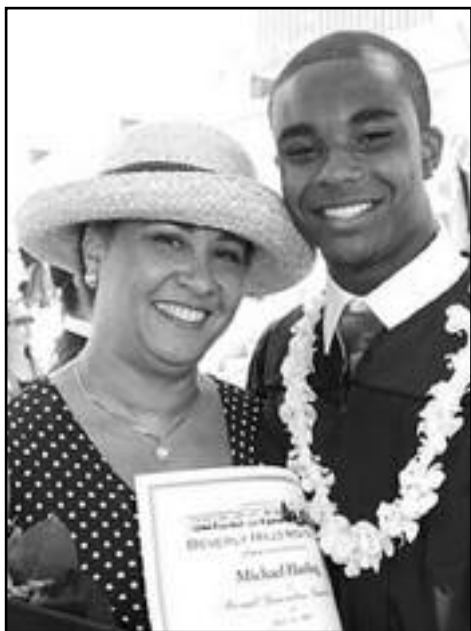

The Party That May Have Been

Wrong.

I gently refused to provide a card, not sure that my credit limit would come close to meeting the demand, instead suggesting I would pay cash. The charmer brought me a

drink and, surprisingly, the price was very reasonable:

About Twelve for a Sex and the City inspired Cosmo, my nod at trying to be mildly hip.

When I produced a Twenty Dollar bill, the server asked, "Do you need change?" My math skills are somewhat impaired, but I made that at about an eight buck tip, somewhat beyond the usual 20 percent. "Yes, change would be nice," I responded. I suppressed a desire to add, "and any other change you might want to offer would also be appreciated."

Still puzzled about the "birthday party" I was supposedly attending, I asked to be pointed in the direction of my "host." "He's at a back table having dinner with some people," I was told.

"Thank you for inviting me to your birthday party and congratulations," I said to an obviously distracted owner who looked even younger than his patrons, most stretching the drinking age limit. "You probably invited me to balance the age differentials," a comment that only puzzled him.

I thought briefly of joining my contemporaries at Lawry's, just steps away, but I realized the guests there would most likely be asleep before I arrived.

But who I am I to argue with success. The place, and remember this was a

Monday, was filled while other competitors down the street were long closed. My mistake was probably arriving at 10 p.m., the time on the invitation. The real "A List" would make their appearances much later, and more appropriately. Certainly, there must have been a "party" at some point, just not one I could find.

As I was leaving, I noticed some burly security types at the front. Not wanting to offend whoever had actually invited me, I asked that my name be checked off, making a historical record of my attendance. I had indeed done the RSVP.

If you read the press release very carefully about the planned development of some city owned property in what has been called the Industrial Area, you will see one obvious omission: "The Sports Center."

Bringing in development partners for the lot that was once part of an ambitious plan to create a sports center complete with gym, fitness center, meeting rooms, indoor pool and other accoutrements inherent in a "state

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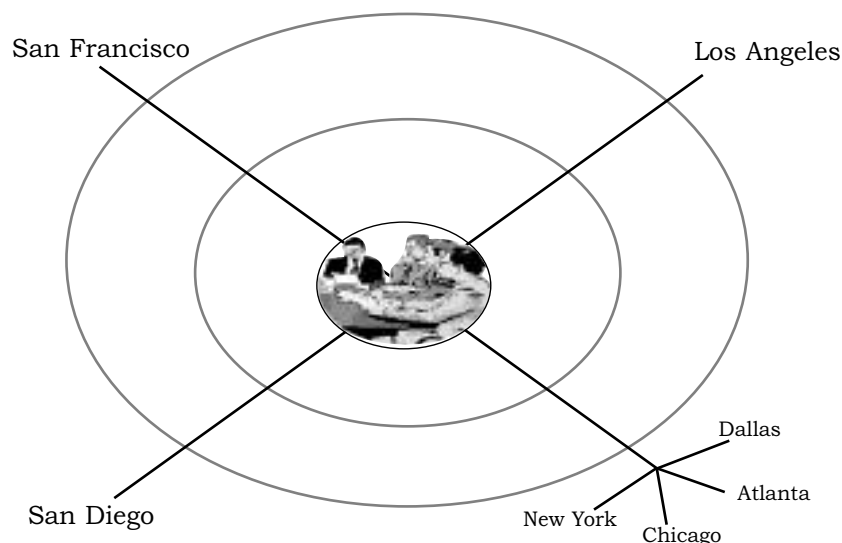
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of the art' facility. Countless surveys, feasibility studies, focus groups meetings and the like produced what? Nothing, actually.

Under the original plan, commercial development of elements of the property would help fund the Center. There may indeed have been potential users who supported the idea, but their silence during the discussion process was deafening. The opponents were heard and the plan now seems to have been abandoned, with some parts included in a renovation of Roxbury Park.

What seems to have emerged after a competitive process is the selection of ICM, the mammoth talent agency that recently left our borders for Century City, as the developers of a kind of mixed use project, the exact outlines of which are not that clear. However, one argument being made for their selection is that this would mean their return to Beverly Hills, and that would be good for our economy.

However, there are questions to be answered: How long is their lease in Century City and will this mean the entire agency or just part of their operation would return to Beverly Hills?

What is more puzzling is the failure to select developers with strong, successful credentials here, including the **Jerry Snyder** company and Goldrich and Kest, to mention just two.

As for the Sports Center, it may have left the in-box when the final election returns meant the departure of former Mayor Steve Webb, its main booster.

It's hard to feel good or bad about the

decision. The Sports Center may well mean a lost opportunity for Beverly Hills, but the selling of the concept was not a model of outreach success. As for ICM, city officials say their selection is only for an exploratory time period.

Good news department: Our **Wallis Annenberg** Center for the Performing Arts, hopefully soon to actually give us a cultural sense of place, has been honored by the Los Angeles Business Council for "Outstanding Architecture in the unbuilt civic building category." **Zoltan Pali** of SPF architects is head of the design team.

Please, maybe just this once, the professional and few no-sayers can mute their usual opposition to anything new and let this happen without increasing costs or delays, and especially the plans for a much needed parking facility.

Received a note from **Judy Borash** questioning some comments here about the loss of the League of Voters of Beverly Hills, now merged into the Los Angeles group. Judy was vice president and a hard worker in League activities for many years.

Mainly, Ms. Borash disagreed with the criticism of the League board holding a "closed" meeting, which she said "can be done legally according to Robert's Rules of Order" by making it an "executive meeting."

The National League had told me that all board meetings must be open, but Ms Borash said that the meeting was to discuss a legal matter and therefore could be closed.

Interesting, since the League and other opponents of some projects frequently accuse the city of acting outside public view. So, if you want to keep your meeting secret, just designate it as "executive."

The "legal issue" was whether the League should continue supporting a law suit filed against the city on the Montage matter. However, Ms. Borash admitted that no League lawyer was present at the "executive" meeting and certainly not one of the lawyers who filed the law suit. If that had happened at a city council meeting, the outcry would be ear splitting.

In fairness, we will publish her entire letter in another issue. As for the secret meeting, those invited to attend were instructed not even to disclose where it was being held!

Recently was invited to guest lecture to the Beverly High School class that produces the Norman News, that excellent student run tv program. The students were bright, involved and asked good questions, but when I asked them some of my own, their answers were disturbing.

If these bright kids had such little knowledge about their city, what could be said of the general school population. When asked to guess the population of Beverly Hills, one said "Two Million" and four others thought it was about 200,000! They did not know that Beverly Hills had rent control, but they did know how mayors were selected - by seniority. What was most surprising was that not one student had ever heard of the Joint Powers Agreement, the JPA,

that the city provides for school funding.

Conclusion: The school district needs a class on city government.

LOCAL HERO: Thanks to all those who sent nominations and to the three readers who nominated this week's choice: **Warren Ackerman**. If Warren wants to disclose his age, fine, but suffice to say he calls me "the kid." Warren once owned a clothing supplier called "House of Uniforms" that sold everything from police and fire outfits to nurse's uniforms plus tuxedo rentals, probably the city's first. Through the years, there has never been and probably never will be again one person who has given so much to so many important needs of our city. He is a permanent member of the board of directors of the Chamber and I appreciated his integrity and courage very recently when he once more challenged the Chamber to stand for principle and not run from an issue involving the city. Some years back, at an Iranians New Year celebration, it was Warren the group called to the dais to explain diversity, and his history in our city gave that a true meaning. We are lucky to have Warren active and involved and pleased to make him this week's LOCAL HERO.

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where are they now?



George Morgan

**Beverly Hills City Manager
1971-1978
Tigard County, Oregon**



George Morgan had 20 years of experience as city manager working in Palo Alto before he came to Beverly Hills in 1971 to take the position as its first city manager. Before

Morgan, the city had a chief executive officer. The experience was remarkable, memorable and untied a Council that outlined the duties of the city manager's position. Morgan eventually left to take a position in Lane County, Oregon at a time when that county was in recession, laying off 600 to 800 employees. Morgan was succeeded in Beverly Hills by the late John Matzer Jr.

What brought you to Beverly Hills in 1971?

Certainly the city itself it has a lot of charm. And the personalities involved were extraordinary, really quite extraordinary, the late [councilmembers] Phyllis Seaton, George Slaff, J.M. Stuchen, all were well established in the community either by reason of personal reputation or contributions to the community itself in different ways.

They did not need to take a back seat in terms of their personal contributions to the community, or to society as a whole. Quite frankly, sometimes I felt I was dealing with an army of generals. There were no privates or captains or majors - they were all generals and that was the best thing I could have known. They were equally demanding of the quality of service that was important to the city. To meet and work with people of renowned prominence was a real challenge. And I tended to welcome it. They were very fair, very friendly, very thoughtful people but they were very demanding. They expected nothing less than the best. You felt a real responsibility in making sure they get it, there was no fun and games, tell it

like it was and not necessarily what they wanted to hear.

Were you hesitant to come to Beverly Hills at first?

Someone told me to come to apply and I was a little reluctant at first. But I thought I would see what the procedure was. The importance of my first encounter was when I met with each of the councilmembers. The first time I ever met them [the councilmembers] was individually and not as a seated group of elected officials who were interested in screening an applicant. That always interested me because it was a strong conviction of faith that their colleagues had the same principles and value system. That impressed me quite a bit. I don't know how I got hired after, I guess when they went around the track they thought I had something to offer.

Once you were in Beverly Hills, what was the biggest difference from Palo Alto?

I ask myself this and I have been asked many times. Beverly Hills is a small community that lived or existed to accommodate tourists six days a week but one day a week they make sure the residents would benefit too for being a market for tourism. Palo Alto was a full service city that owned all of its own utilities-water, gas, sewer system; it even had its own airport for awhile. What was required in Palo Alto was because the community worked so hard to get it. I always felt I had the privilege of working with two of the most unique communities in the state. They were small population wise and size of local government. But in

other ways, the scope of local government was not exceeded by any other local government certainly not of their size. There were very few things the city government was not involved with.

[Something that differed in Beverly Hills from Palo Alto] was some of the most articulate spokespersons in the city government in Beverly Hills at the time were women. And they were very prominent women. They were very unusual when not reticent. They were not stay at home housewives they took charge of things and had very strong opinions of how to run the railroad. Phyllis Seaton is one I will never forget because she was so gracious in every way.

Who were other people you interacted with while on the council?

The [councilmember] ophthalmologist, Dr. Charles Aronberg had a very complex personality. He was very dedicated to the quality of life in Beverly Hills. He had been in Beverly Hills for some time and came on the council after I had been there for a few years. This was the same thing with J.M. Stuchen, a long time resident and property owner. He demanded absolute honesty. He did want you to tell him something and then later tell him there were qualifying conditions. If you had an opinion he wanted to know what your reasons were. George Slaff was probably one of the best legal minds I have met in my life. He wanted to know the basis of my compositions, where did I see it referenced to legally and in the matter of practice. Most importantly [the City

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Council] had created a framework of local government that put some unusual powers and authorities with city manager. But on the other hand, the meetings were informal.

Richard Stone is an attorney in town. He always wanted a more prestigious position than he had, even when he was on the Council. It was because he was on a Council with very capable people. It was very hard for him to be recognized for the quality of his work because of the others on the council. He was very competitive but overshadowed by some of the legends that set the foundations for the Council.

Stepping in as the first city manager, what were those unusual powers and authorities?

The council had given the manager significant authority but also held him accountable for performance under that authority. That was the important thing that I always appreciated more than anything else. The job of the city manager was to execute the policy that had been selected or determined to be in the best interest of Beverly Hills by the City Council. Simply put, I was a hired hand that presumably knew what was necessary. I was responsible for holding people accountable for the job they did or the absence of jobs. I know one of my first criticisms was that it seemed like I fired too many people. Primarily, I did not renew their employment contract on the basis of well documented conclusions that they weren't really committed to the city as the city should expect from its chief officers.

How did the community react to your new position as city manager?

That meant in the minds of many people that the council had given up something. They

really didn't give up anything, by the council becoming a council they had far more authority than as individuals who voted on issues and sometimes there was a split where they framed policy and gave the manager instructions as to which alternatives they wanted to see pursued and then to execute the policy.

Early you said the council meetings were informal, what were the council meetings like?

The first meeting I went to I can remember the mayor saying it is almost 8 p.m. and I don't intend to stay here all evening. And I bring this up as not anything against the mayor but this is the way they did business; they did not like to waste a lot of time. Generally, they met in the late afternoon, reviewed the items to see if there were things likely to be debated and then they would adjourn and go to dinner. And the city manager was expected to be there. They conducted the city's business in an open manner and public manner, but they did not believe in listening to someone, " 'a would' be" advocate, that just wanted to create snowballs in hell just for something to talk about.

During these meetings in your seven years, what can you remember important items you worked on?

I learned very early when you plant big street trees in Beverly Hills you don't plant little ones you plant good sized ones. Someone said the trees in a particular area were not doing well. And so, we decided to replace them. I did not just go out and buy them. I decided this kind of community someone had given a lot of thought to it, I found out the trees were purchased five or six years before. They were being groomed at a nursery outside of Los

Angeles. Those same trees were going to be the ones we brought to Beverly Hills and planted in precise areas in front of or near the property line of whoever lived on the street. It was a quality of service that was quite unique in many ways in Beverly Hills. Things were done with forethought. Changes were made quite carefully.

We also figured out water supply, public safety, relationships of service areas. We tried hard to avoid any service interruptions during the normal day. Also, a new city hall and new library were built. These things were strongly advocated by spokespersons.

Why did you leave Beverly Hills?

I had a couple of reasons. It had nothing to do with the Council. The Council was very generous to me and very thoughtful to me. I had family moving to Oregon. But I did have my own ties to Southern California; I had two uncles that founded the city of Fullerton, another uncle was the publisher of the first public newspaper in California. But I felt I needed rest. Too much of the material values were dominating my life.

When I left Beverly Hills, I happened to be in Eugene Oregon, in Lane County. I was offered the job in Lane County. I brought all the little gold plates and saucers, the fictional feelings about wealthy communities that all the sidewalks are paved in gold. In county government I was dealing more with the realities of the city, although it was a county. I liked the prospects of being less a captive of a materialistic world, but some of the most gracious and thoughtful people I have ever met in my life came from long term residencies in Beverly Hills. I have never met anybody who would

exceed many of the people I had good fortune to work with or assist in some project or another.

Who do you still keep in contact with from Beverly Hills?

I still talk with [former planning director] Irwin Kaplan [interviewed in issue 397]. I was the one that brought Irwin to Beverly Hills. He is a capable artistic practitioner of any area. Irwin is one I would put a gold star on. There were people like him that were department directors that I know, there are some that have come and gone. One councilmember that was there was, Donna Ellman (now Donna Garber) we exchange cards. There are two or three people like that that I have met that I have kept in contact with. I have been very fortunate to work with very fine people and capable people in Beverly Hills.

What advice would you like to give to the future city managers in Beverly Hills?

I would say do not give too much advice before you have been city manager for awhile. I would think to try avoiding giving advice unless you have been in the job for 30 days. This is to say that there is no crisis that needed immediate advice, from there ask council members for advice.

I would also say slow down, be patient. Have good ears; be selective about not what you hear but what you think you hear, so you can tell people what they need to know. Listen really carefully; when you are talking, you can't listen. Listen, digest and ask.

INDEPENDENT STUDY PROGRAM QUESTIONED

The Weekly takes an in-depth look into a program that some teachers say is harmed by lax oversight and dubious standards

The independent study program, implemented at Beverly Hills High School in the fall of 2006, is criticized by some teachers for its lack of checks and balances, “lower standards” and its level of accountability.

The district argues it is a needed program for students who do not fit into the traditional high school.

The Board of Education, who also voiced minor concerns with the program, nevertheless approved the second reading of the independent study policy at Tuesday’s Board meeting.

The program, approved by the Board of Education in 2002, originally was designed to accommodate special circumstances like child actors or athletes. It was implemented this year under independent study program Director Twila Cook, who is also the Adult School Director. The district would not release how many actors or athletes are actually enrolled in the program, but

Cook confirmed two out of the total 32 students, 16 of whom grad-

uated this year.

Some of the concerns indicated by teachers include:

- One instructor, certified in English, Spanish and social studies oversees and assigns grades to approximately 25 different courses including math, science, art

- It is unclear if the program administrators are adhering to the No Child Left Behind Act, which requires that teachers must be credentialed in the subject that they teach

- Lab sciences including biology and chemistry, which are graduation requirements, were performed at home; not in a laboratory

- Students meet with a teacher for the minimum 60 minutes a week, when an in-classroom student receives 1750 minutes of classroom instruction

- Teachers say two Ventura County students received Beverly High credits without even stepping foot on the campus

- Most teachers say they are not being adequately consulted when students leave their class to go into independent study

- Only three weeks left to a course, students are allowed to leave the traditional program and take independent study, without notation on the transcript

- Independent study courses were deemed to be Cal State or UC approved course

The program has expanded in a year from zero to 32 students, who have special circumstances or “emotional needs” to be in the program for a “month or a semester,” with master agreements signed by the teacher, parent, and student, said Cook. This independent study program should not be confused with the continuation school Moreno High School, that is geared more towards lower performing and at-risk students.

Proponents include Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services Dr. Ilene Straus, Cook and parents of students in the independent study program. They argue the program is good for students that might not fit in at the traditional high school or Moreno High School, but need one-on-one attention, or need an alternative learning environment. Cook said the program helps students with medical prob-

lems, and has helped students graduate that otherwise would not have.

“My daughter was failing her senior government class,” said Liz Goldman, parent of a recently graduated senior who was enrolled in the independent study program at Beverly High. “After she was enrolled in the independent study program she has come so alive. The teacher approached government to make it come alive, he lit a flame in her because he taught in non-traditional ways, and if it was not for this program I do not know what we would have done.”

Straus said it is not the revised policy that needs refinement, but rather the implementation of the policy.

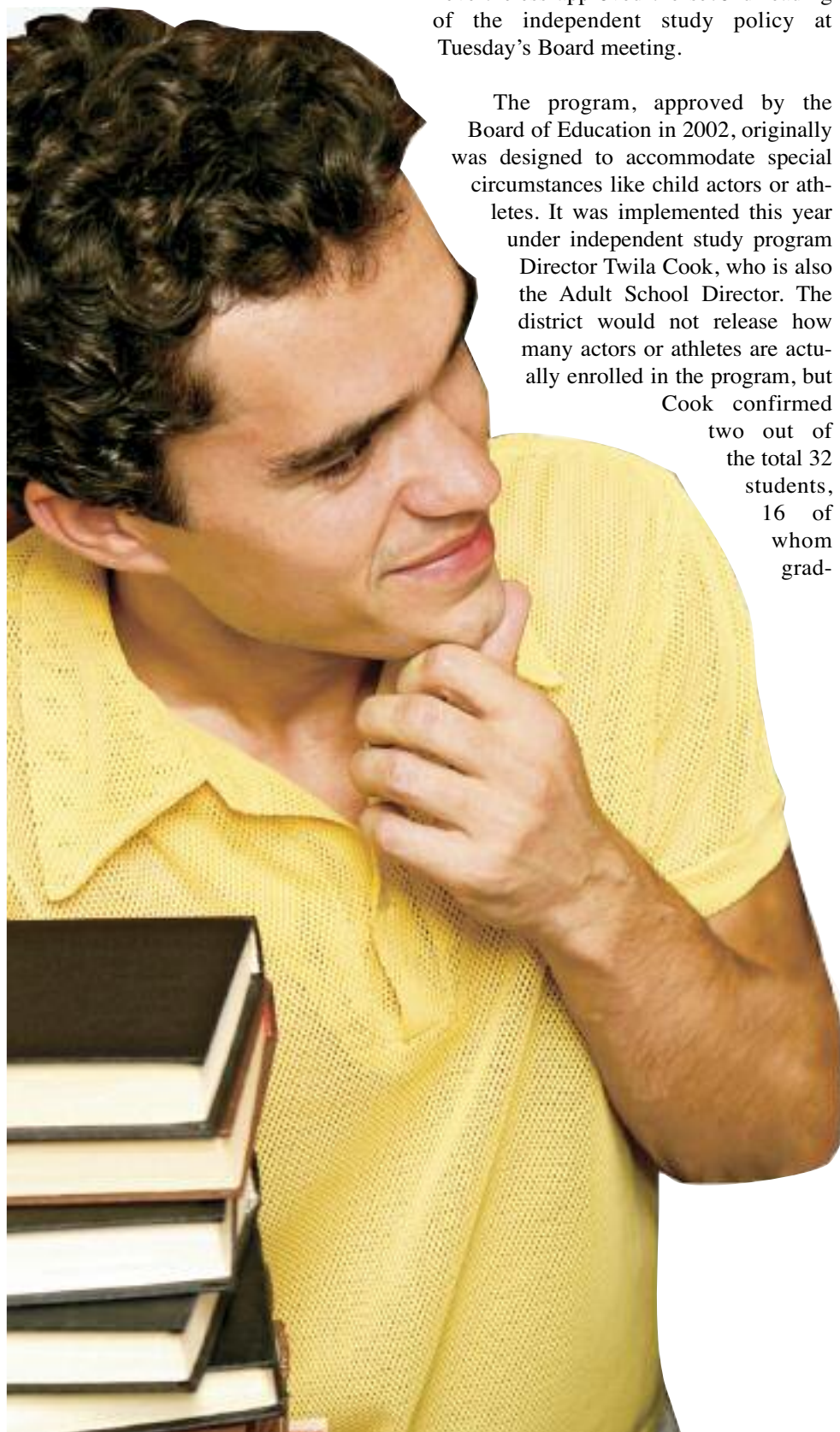
“Beverly Hills High School definitely needs a good independent studies program to meet the needs of students that are not being met,” said Straus. “In a well developed program of support for students you have both. We need both a strong continuation high school and a strong independent study program.” said Straus.

Opponents of the program, include many faculty members at the high school and the Beverly Hills Education Association- the teachers’ union. They argue they are being left out of the decision making process as their students who are either not passing, or not getting, the grade they wanted, are not being forced to re-take the class as they would with traditional enrollment.

“It seems like there are two different systems,” said BHEA president Chris Bushee. “One system for most of the kids that sit in the regular classroom environment, day in and day out, and do everything that is expected of them to earn that high school diploma. And then you have a separate system for kids who manage to get into the independent study program, where the accountability is less and the standards are lower, yet they are still earning the same Beverly High diploma as everyone else.”

Faculty say they are also concerned because students seem to be disappearing but nevertheless are earning a diploma.

“You wouldn’t recognize me because I didn’t go here [Beverly High],” a soon to



be graduated senior from Beverly High said to social studies teacher Bill Ryan, as they sat together in the grandstand at last Friday's graduation ceremony. "I have not taken a class here since freshman year," the student continued.

A baffled Ryan asked the student he had never seen before, how this was possible? How is it possible for a graduate to receive a Beverly High diploma without being on campus for class his sophomore, junior or senior year?

The student replied that he had attended Beverly High his freshman year on permit, left for boarding school, and returned to the BHUSD on permit to be enrolled in the district's new independent study program for all of his classes both semesters of his senior year, said Ryan. Ryan had heard of students like this, who just "disappeared from attendance rosters."

Retiring social studies teacher Scott Harvey and Bushee said during the school year they had students enrolled in their class that vanished from the roster without ever signing off on a master agreement, or asked to be involved in a study team. They were not alerted by the administration when the students just "disappeared from the roster."

Math teacher John Borsum, said he had two students drop from the roster during October and one at the end of the year, who re-enrolled in the independent study course equivalent to his course.

"Both students were continuously absent," said Borsum.

Where did the students go? Later these teachers would contact the administration to find out that the students transferred to the independent study program.

Now, instead of sitting in the classroom, the students in the independent study program meet on the third or second floor (it varies according to Cook) individually with teacher Sergio Mandiola for the 60 minute classroom requirement per week. Also, the students meet in small groups for another four to five hours a week with Mandiola for tutoring. In a classroom at Beverly High a student who takes all subjects on campus spends 1750 minutes with a teacher in the classroom. A student who takes all subjects with Mandiola spends about nine minutes per subject with the instructor, said Bushee.

Mandiola taught students over 25 different classes. There are discrepancies as to what Mandiola has taught students in the past year. Mandiola said he has not taught a math course over the Algebra I level. Bushee said he has confirmed with a geometry teacher that they had a student enrolled in their class, who dropped out to take that course in independent study.

"He teaches all subjects," said Cook. "If a student comes in and needs Algebra I he can teach it, if a student needs geometry he can teach it, he can actually teach French too," said Cook.

Mandiola and Bushee confirmed students did receive credit for lab sciences including Biology and Chemistry. But there is no laboratory in the district office for the students to do their labs, so instead the students did their labs at home, said Cook.

"We would say here is what you need, here is the lab, then students would show what they had done or explain," said Cook. "This has been a concern and we knew right away this is something we would have to address."

Mandiola and Cook said according to the Educational Code 44865 Mandiola can oversee all courses, including lab sciences for independent study. He said he will take more tests this summer to become better

qualified, will work to enhance the curriculum and have more contact with teachers at the high school.

Last year, there was virtually no contact between Mandiola and teachers at the high school, Mandiola said.

Cook said she has spoken to some teachers and department chairs at the high school about the curriculum, but would not give specifics.

"I am not at privy to give names," said Cook. "I have worked with the art department, I don't know all the people's names because I am not the one in direct contact with them."

The program uses the same textbooks as Beverly High, but the software program "school pathway" adapts modules, creating a curriculum aligning with state standards for education, said Cook.

"I have tried to write some of the cur-

riculum, but what we have basically done was used what was prepared by school pathways," said Cook, who has written curriculum before Beverly.

Straus argues this is allowable because the program is separate from the traditional program at Beverly High.

"When a student goes to a continuous program or an independent study program, all common programs, we use state adopted material and expectations, but we do

not use the high school staff to go to for a different program. We share the materials, but the administrator, in this case Twila Cook, is expected to secure those and make sure the curriculum is aligned with the state."

The program separates itself from the traditional school, but recommends students from a child study team at the traditional school that consist of: teachers, counselors, administrators and psychologists.

But Borsum, Harvey and Bushee said they have not been asked to be a part of these teams.

Head guidance counselor Kevin Sweeney said the program is still new and in the beginning stages.

"The decisions are made at the administration level," said Sweeney. "I have signed Independent Study/ Personalized Learning referrals." However, he is not a part of child study teams.

"I am not exactly sure who makes up the child study teams, I don't know who coordinates it, I just know every few weeks they have a list of students that are going to be discussed," said Cook.

According to Bushee, Cook did refer two students from her previous school district in Ventura County to the program, where she drives once a week to oversee instruction of the students.

Cook said this is a way to keep enrollment up and students attending Beverly High schools.

"If it were not for independent study, these students might drop out and go to home school, charters schools or private schools," said Cook. "This is a way to keep Beverly Hills students in Beverly Hills schools," said Cook.

Not all counselors agree that the program as currently designed is beneficial.

"The reservation about the program is that there has been very little of a consistent process for admitting students into the independent study program," said retired former head counselor Vivian Saatjian-Green, who spoke in opposition to the policy at Tuesday's board meeting. "The reservations are: the process, the credibility of the program, the number of courses and variety of courses the teacher is teaching at the district office."

Straus and Cook said the reservations are to be addressed in the upcoming school year. This will include more testing to better certify the instructor, a revise of the curriculum and better contact with department chairs and teachers.

Bushee said if it was not changed, that BHEA over the next few weeks plans to contact the federal department of education to inquire about the possible violations of the No Child Left Behind Act, the Western Association of Schools and Colleges that accredits Beverly High and undergraduate admissions offices at select universities to inform them of the independent study program.

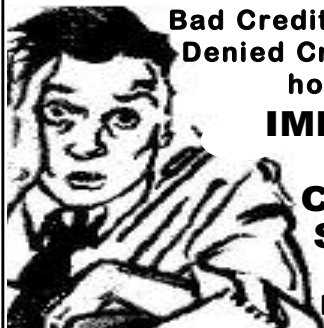
"The independent study program is run as an island unto itself," said Bushee.

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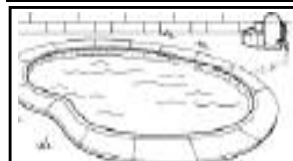

After the revitalization plan is complete, The Beverly Hilton's annual tax payment will more than double to over \$12 million.

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
