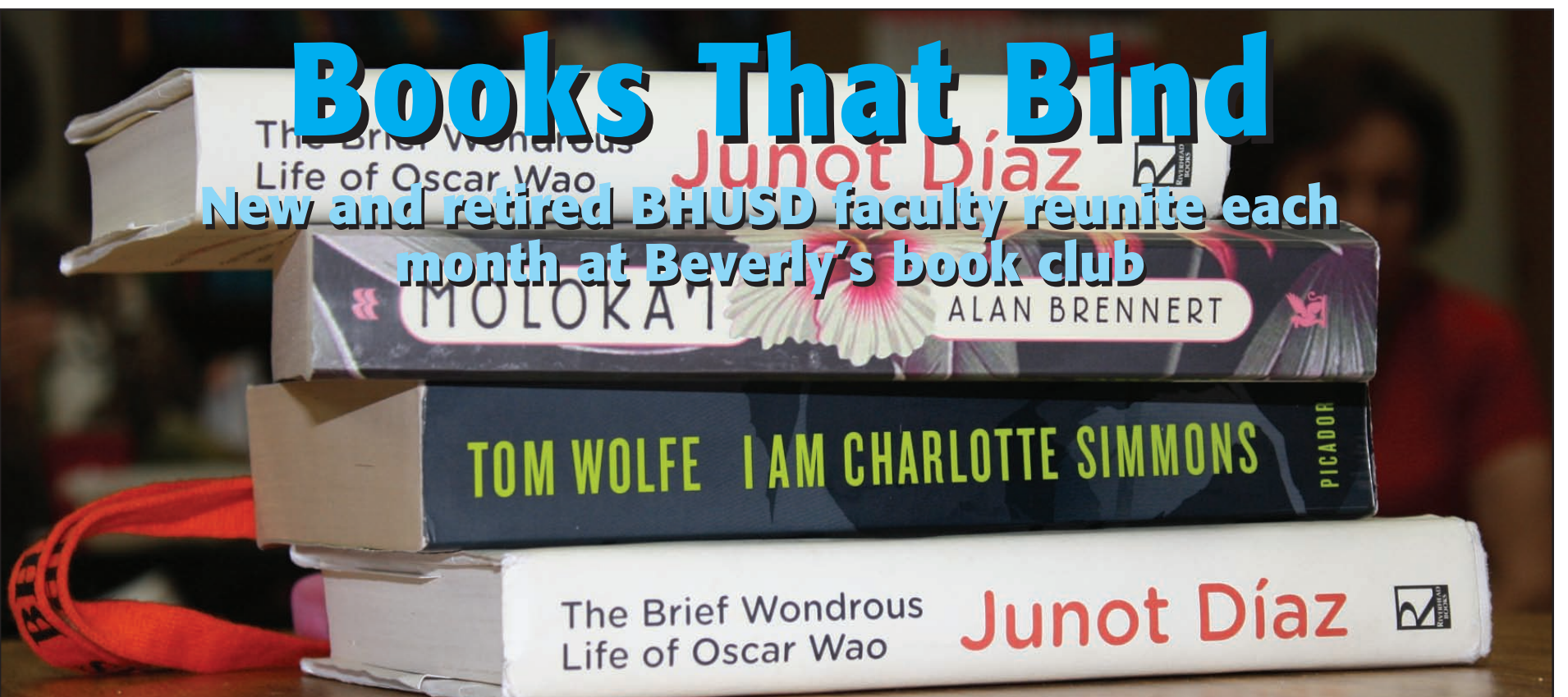

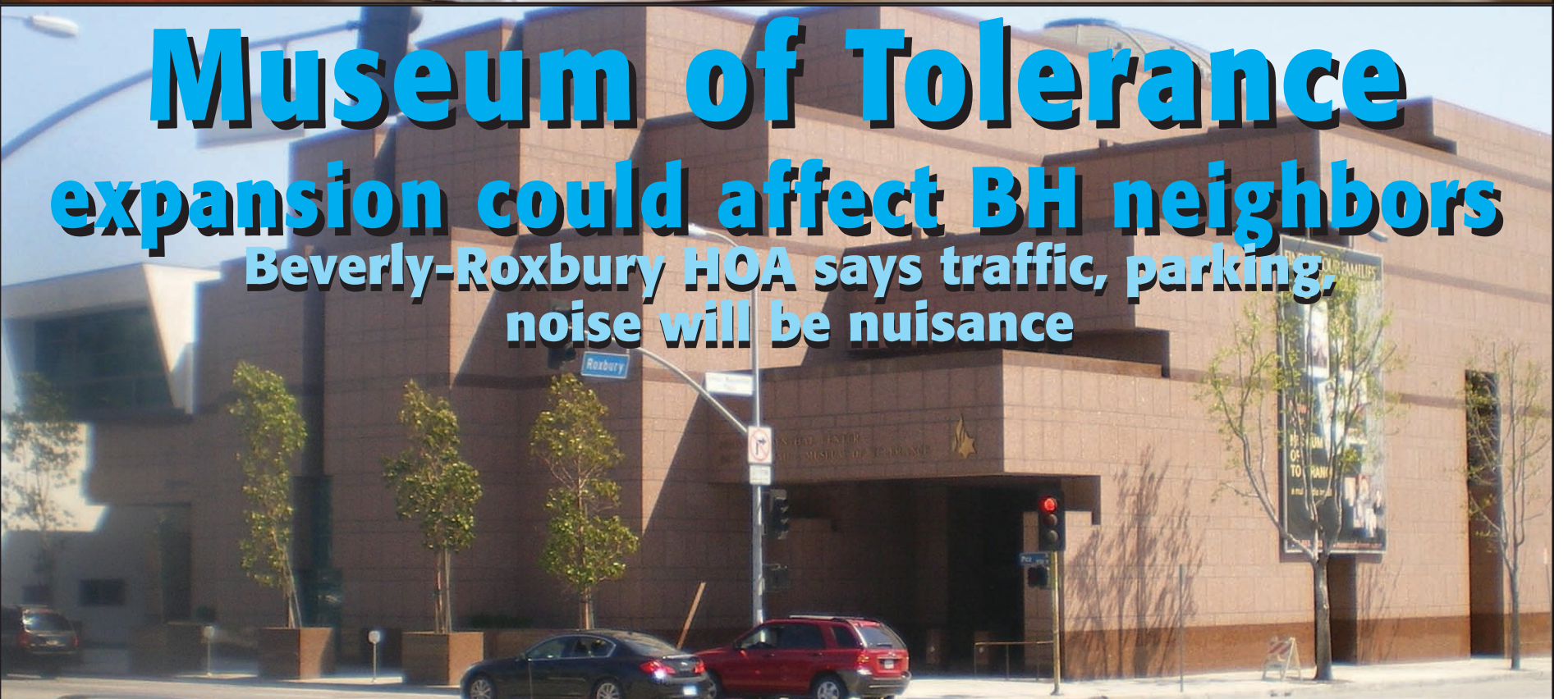

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Goldman moves to strike Beverly Hilton's lawsuit as SLAPP case

The SHOA president says he was exercising his right to free speech

Beverly Hills South West Homeowner's Association longtime president Kenneth Goldman filed a motion to strike Beverly Hilton owner Oasis West Realty's lawsuit against him as a SLAPP (Strategic Lawsuit Against Public Participation) case and denied allegations that he breached his contract with the developer in connection to the hotel's redevelopment plan, known as Measure H, which successfully passed in November last year.

"California case law is also clear that Goldman's conduct discussing the petition, collecting signatures and leaving notes at neighbors' homes is precisely the type of activity protected [under the anti-

SLAPP statue]," according Goldman's motion filed March 9. [See Issue 489.]

Goldman, who is an attorney at Reed Smith, is referring to what is essentially the crux of Oasis West Realty's complaint against him: an afternoon in which he spent what he says was an approximate hour and a half gathering approximately 20 signatures to put the Hilton's redevelopment plan to the Beverly Hills voters as a referendum.

Oasis West alleges that Goldman and Reed Smith breached their responsibility to the developer by 'campaigning' against the redevelopment plan two years after their contract, specifically tied to the development plan, ended.

Goldman says he never worked against his former client Oasis West and that he never revealed any confidential information.

Oasis West hired Goldman and Reed Smith in 2004 to represent the company in seeking approval and entitlements for the \$500 million expansion plan that included adding two condominium build-

ings and a Waldorf=Astoria Hotel on the Beverly Hilton's nine-acre lot at the corner of Santa Monica and Wilshire boulevards.

Goldman terminated the contract in 2006.

"Since that time, I have never represented any party or otherwise acted as an attorney with respect to the Redevelopment Project," according to the motion filed by Goldman.

What has yet to be made clear is why Goldman and Oasis West decided to terminate their relationship and what the circumstances surrounding Goldman's immediate cease to collecting referendum signatures really were.

The case hinges on whether Goldman's actions in May 2008 did damage to Oasis' cause.

"It's an interesting case. It's a question of first impression, which may make a judge somewhat reluctant to dismiss the case at the outset," said Doug Mirell, an attorney specializing in first amendment rights at Loeb and Loeb, who says he is not aware of another case in California similar to this one.

Mirell said the defense's argument seemed lucid and that it could be up to Oasis West to convince a judge that Goldman had specifically caused the damages they claim.

"It's a threshold question whether the other side can demonstrate causal conduct between Goldman's efforts and the placement [of the referendum] on the ballot," said Mirell.

According to The Citizens Right to Decide Committee, the unofficial No on H campaign, treasurer and organizer Larry Larson, the opposition to Measure H was not inspired by Goldman and would have materialized without him.

"With or without him we would have

come up with sufficient signatures to pass the referendum," said Larson, who is also an attorney in Los Angeles, in an interview.

In fact, the referendum ended up garnering 2,574 valid signatures when it only needed 2,075 signatures to qualify.

In Goldman's motion, Larson included a declaration taking responsibility for activities opposing the Hilton revitalization plan

"At no time during the referendum effort did Ken Goldman ever disclose a confidence of Oasis West, nor did he disclose to me that he had ever represented Oasis West in any capacity," writes Larson.

Larson lists nine specific activities crucial to the campaign against the revitalization plan and states in no uncertain terms that Goldman took no part in them.

"What's happening with the attack on Goldman is outrageous," said Larson. "The burden of proof is on [Oasis West Realty] to keep this going. I can't imagine what their lawyer will be able to say [in response to] this."

Oasis West is not worried.

"We are confident that the case will proceed forward and will prove that Reed Smith and Ken Goldman's activities violated their legal obligations to their client," said Robert Barta counsel for Oasis West Realty in a prepared statement.

But Mirell says this will be a case to keep an eye on.

"I think the big question here will be whether a lawyer's personal conduct, as opposed to paid employment or pro-bono employment on behalf of a client, as anything other than legal work would qualify as adverse to the client," said Mirell.

The motion will be heard by a judge on April 29.

Ambassador program up and running

Beverly Hills Education Foundation (BHEF), a non-profit fundraising group for the BHUSD, has launched its Ambassador program, aimed at making it easier for new families to enroll in Beverly Hills schools.

"It's taken on a life of its own," said BHEF CEO Dev Hankin.

Ambassadors are giving at least six tours a week at the school sites, according to Ambassador program head Nathalie Kunin.

The popularity of the tours has exceeded BHEF expectations to such a degree that Hawthorne School had to add three new ambassador parents this week.

"There are 15 ambassador parents. They are all really different but all really involved [in the schools] and enthusiastic," said Kunin.

The program works this like: a new family calls the ambassador line at BHEF, where someone takes all their information, including the grade levels of the

kids. Then BHEF pairs the family with an ambassador parent, who has a child in the same grade at the school of choice. The new family takes a tour with the school principal and then meets with the ambassador parent, who answers any further questions. The ambassador parent stays in touch with the new family and can help with the enrollment process, among other things.

Ambassador parents do more than just answer questions about the school.

"Sometimes, they will know someone who lives across the street and say 'hey, you know so and so across the street has a first grader too,'" said Kunin. "We don't always look in our own neighborhoods. But that's what makes us different from private schools. We all live within one or two miles of each other. At private schools, people can be coming from 10 to 15 miles away."

BHEF is working to create packets for all the schools that would include things like all the steps to start summer school, lunch menus, a map of the school, information on the school PTA and how to sign up for the newsletter.

For only being open two weeks, the Ambassador program has been quite successful.

Of the families that have toured El Rodeo in the last two weeks, at least half have been families that are leaving private schools to enroll in the BHUSD.

"There was no system. This is a system and that's why it's so easy and works. Now everybody who wants a tour is getting tour," said Kunin.

City buys Paine's postmodern sculpture

The City of Beverly Hills has acquired a 15-foot wide, 7-foot tall stainless steel boulder sculpture, "Erratic," by New York-based artist Roxy Paine to display

in Beverly Gardens Park.

Funds for the \$342,800 purchase came from the City's Public Art Fund, which contains monies from developers' fees earmarked for the acquisition, installation, maintenance and display of art for public enjoyment. Additional costs of \$10,000-\$15,000 are estimated for the transportation and installation of the sculpture.

In geology, the term "erratic" refers to a rock that has been carried by a glacier hundreds of miles away from its original geographic location.

The sculpture is currently on display in Prospect Park in Brooklyn, N.Y., and will be transported from New York and installed by a local company.

The City anticipates the sculpture will be installed in Beverly Gardens Park on Santa Monica Boulevard by this summer.

New City Council to be sworn in next week

Beverly Hills' new City Council will be sworn in Wednesday but the official inaugural celebration will be held March 31 for the first time at the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.

First-term Beverly Hills City Councilmember Nancy Krasne will be sworn in as mayor. Sitting Councilmember Jimmy Delshad will become vice mayor. Newly elected members of the Council Dr. Willie Brien and John Mirisch will be sworn in for their first terms on the Council. Current Vice Mayor Barry Brucker will begin his second term on the Council.

Krasne says she decided to hold the ceremony at the Academy because the space is free to the city through a joint use agreement. The tent set-up traditionally used for the inauguration costs almost \$40,000 in the end, she said.

"We don't need to spend that [city] money in this economy," said Krasne.

Krasne will be sworn in by Federal Judge Harry Pregerson and his son Federal Judge Dean Pregerson.

The inaugural ceremony will be held at Samuel Goldwyn Theater, 8949 Wilshire Blvd. on March 31. Doors will open at 6:30 p.m. with the ceremony at 7 p.m.

Beverly High's AP and assistant position still vacant

After assistant principal Toni Staser and executive assistant Pam Kraushaar received promotions to the district office earlier this school year, BHUSD has been searching to fill the two vacant positions at Beverly High.

Interviews have been held for Kraushaar's former position but it is not clear when the staff will make a recommendation to the Board.

BHHS principal J Guidetti has previously said he received approximately 116 applications for the assistant principal position, with a handful of inside applicants. No information about stage of the hiring process was available by press time.

Until her position is filled, Staser is performing both jobs, spending half of the day at the high school and half of the day in the district office.

Guidetti was not available for comment by press time.

Norman girls' track team defeats Redondo, sets school record.

Gary Parizher's three decisive singles victories helped host Beverly High defeat Palisades by the narrowest of margins in an intersectional boys' tennis match Tuesday.

The Normans and Dolphins were tied on sets, 9-9, with Beverly Hills winning on games, 83-82.

The teams entered the final round tied, 6-6. In addition to Parizher's 6-0 victory, the Normans (3-1) also got a 6-3 victory from their No. 1 doubles team of James Ephrati-Jonathan Jason and a 6-2 victory from their No. 2 doubles team, Ben Haber and David Roth in the final round.

Parizher was a 6-1 winner in the first round, helping Beverly Hills to a 4-2 lead. Its other first-round victories came from Andre Herd at No. 2 singles, 6-3, and Sam Farzani at No. 3 singles, 6-4, and the Haber-Roth team, 7-5.

Parizher was a 6-2 winner in the second round, while Ephrati and Jason teamed for a 7-5 victory.

Herd was a 6-0, 7-5, 6-4 winner in a non-league match at Beverly Hills March 11, while the Ephrati-Jason doubles team won its sets 6-2, 6-1, 6-1.

The Normans' season of unprecedented success ended with a loss in a Division II CIF State Championships first-round game at Hanford March 10.

"We were overwhelmed by their system," Beverly Hills coach John Braddell said, referring to the Bullpups' dribble motion offense. "We had an idea of how wanted to defend it, but having an idea and executing it on the court are two different things."

The Normans (24-10) allowed a season-high 90 points.

"We helped them a lot," Braddell said, referring to Beverly Hills' 29 turnovers. "They pressed us a little bit and we struggled at times bringing the ball up. We just didn't do a good job defensively against them. We scored 65 and that should be enough to win games. We just didn't play well enough defensively."

The team left at 8 a.m. for the approximately four-hour drive to Hanford.

"It was a great day," Braddell said. "We had a great time. More than physically taxing, [it was] mentally [taxing]. By the time we got to the game, we were mentally worn out from all the travel."

"The first time they pressed us, we didn't cut at full speed. You could just tell mentally and physically we were struggling to start the game."

Beverly Hills was outscored 16-7 in the first quarter, with Lacey Gibbons and Courtney Rose both scoring five points and making 3-point baskets for Hanford (26-4), the Central Section Division II

BH Has A Night Life

And notes on city rumors

There is night life in our village – from fine jazz combos to piano artistry at our hotels and restaurants, but first some side issues:

To coin a phrase, I am a huge **Will Ferrell** fan, and the only emotion I could evoke for the Second **George Bush** is pity: for him and for our country. Ferrell's talents are enormous, although he has probably been less cautious in his choice of film roles than he should, and Bush left sufficient problems behind to give **Barack Obama** a chance for Mount Rushmore.

However, having said that, I found the Ferrell HBO special/parody on George Bush offensive, crude and even dishonest – not a reference I make lightly.

What came as close to being both racist and sexist was the jarring and embarrassing performance of an actor mimicking, if that is the possible right word, "**Connie**" **Rice**, the former President's Secretary of State on the Ferrell "comedy." Neither funny or appropriate.

What was very disingenuous were the promos for the show. They were very clever – a good physical resemblance to Bush, which Ferrell did accomplish, being interviewed by Ferrell playing two Bush look alike roles. But this was never used in the real program, and that would have been welcome in the too lengthy, repetitive program.

About cell phones: A client, pushing me into the new world of electronic miracles, hooked me onto a Blackberry Bold. The damn thing not only receives and makes phone calls, it sends and accepts emails, takes photos, turns into a video camera, is able to access music and CNN, notes appointments on a calendar, does math, reminds me of meetings and does everything except prepare breakfast. But with all that incredible technology, it becomes totally disabled when exposed to a small drop spilled from my martini. When wet, it dies.

Progress? The Indians had the same

problem with smoke signals.

Back to more important challenges: where to spend an evening after dinner and still keep your tax dollars working for our village. This is the first of an occasional look at night time entertainment, but first-what we used to have:

Once, there were real full performance night clubs in Beverly Hills. One on North Canon, Ye Little Club, at almost the same place as Nic's, had full programs with singers and even comedians. The best entertainers were usually found at the Beverly Hilton, which had a large club on the ground floor. (This was later copied by the Century Plaza, once housing two full nightclubs including a Vegas type room and a more intimate venue where **Charlie Bird** often performed.) Not too long ago, we even had, at least I was told, a so-called strip club at the former home of Ah Fong's Chinese restaurant on North Beverly Drive.

Frascati's on Wilshire, at what is now Two Rodeo, always had a fine jazz trio, Swiss Café on Rodeo had both combos and singers. Only very recently has there been a return to music at night. Incidentally, efforts to find a venue for a leading New York jazz club, in the talking stage for years, is still on-going.

Where to go and enjoy:

The best piano music in town is at the Montage Beverly Hills. **Margareta Svensson** has a wide range of offerings and has performed in both Europe and the United States before such fans as former UK prime minister **Margaret Thatcher**, **Robert De Niro**, **Paul Mc Cartney**, **Tom Jones**, **Dolly Parton** and **Michael Bolton**. She plays nightly.

Best jazz combos: Saturday night at the Beverly Hilton Lounge, a trio fronted by saxophonist **Ken Moran**, and Friday and Saturday the David Sparks Trio at the Beverly Wilshire BLVD room. Both exceptional, but the Hilton room is more conducive to listening.

The Peninsula Bar has piano most evenings and a harpist during the day in the tea room.

Camden House/Flame has a band on Tuesday and Thursday through Sunday from 7 p.m. to 1 a.m.

Crustacean Beverly Hills – live music Thursday through Sunday and a "Lucky Hour" from 4:30 to 8:30 p.m. with appetizers and specialty drinks. Makes even the music sound better.

Mastro's, one of our most successful steak houses with a noise level that challenges the hearing impaired has live entertainment ever day after 7 p.m.

Nic's on North Canon has a DJ Thursday evening, and a live band on Friday and Saturday nights.

Trader Vic's at the Beverly Hilton, this continuation of a Beverly Hills landmark restaurant now adjacent to the Olympic size pool, has nightly music and a large following on Friday nights.

Best martini bargain: Bar 360 at the

Recently had the real pleasure of speaking to the Friends of Greystone on some of the political and use histories of the mansion and park. This is a very impressive group and they are doing outstanding work in supporting renovation and programs.

It did remind me of the time, several years back, when I was invited to speak to a Women's Club in Pasadena, although that was not the precise name. A more conservative group outside Orange County would be hard to find, but they were very polite and mildly attentive during my talk.

But something seemed to be missing, and I wasn't sure what. After my brief talk, I asked if there were any questions. An elderly lady in the front row immediately raised her hand.

"We enjoyed your 'little' talk," but why didn't you tell us about the sex scandal and murder at Greystone?" Once I understood their fields of interest, the talk was a big success. Alas, the "Friends" did not bring up the Greystone scandal.

Had lunch recently with Dr. **Jerry Gross**, our school super, and clearly his experience and professionalism comes at the right time for our school district. His agreement runs for a year, but both he and the board can call it quits with a 30 day notice. He was drafted for the job while we began the search for a permanent replacement for the departed **Kari Mc Veigh**, but his tenure has been extended, and that works well for the district.

At Dr. Gross' insistence, his contract has no "buy out" agreements and if and when a replacement is found, his departure will not cost the district anything – an unusual and selfless act by Dr. Gross.

You may remember that his wife, Dr. **Gwen Gross**, also served our district as superintendent. I had the highest admiration for her leadership and education skills, but was miffed when she left abruptly in

2003 during the oil impact conflicts and shortly after leading the district's successful bond campaign.

Now that she has shared her husband with us, all is forgiven.

It is not exactly a state secret that our district has seen more than its share of conflicts on everything from student permits to teacher/union relations. I think Gross can help heal the system, at least we should give him the support to make that happens.

One goal: Advancing from within merit board and superintendent support. Teachers should have the opportunity to become administrators, including school principals, and principals and others in the super's office should be considered for the top job in the district. I don't think there is any disagreement on this on the board, the district office or the union.

Revolution at city hall? Probably not as many changes as the rumor mills are predicting. Even the most biased observer should be able to admit that the management team at city hall is one of the best we have ever had. Certainly, many pre-dated our present city manager, **Rod Wood**, and were appointed and advanced by his very popular and able predecessor, **Mark Scott**, but every division and department has been reorganized or consolidated, all making for a very smooth operating team.

Our highly regarded chiefs of fire and police are Wood appointees and there are new faces in many leadership roles in every

department from planning to transportation, all functioning extremely well.

No matter some private, personal issues, it is highly unlikely that our new city council will risk tampering with what works and serves the public interest so well.

It is the inherent nature of the office for the city manager to adjust to changes in the council – whether dramatic or only in style. The city manager administers programs, the council sets the agenda and votes for the money to make programs reality. One council can have street maintenance as a priority and the next increases in park programs. The city manager can and should advise, but he or she can also count to three and when a majority gives direction, the city manager becomes the agent of the majority.

What is not acceptable is for any councilmember to become involved in management or for a city manager to dictate political decisions. I hope the council understands, and I think they do, the separation of powers and Wood is too much of a professional not to accept the democratic process.

I doubt if this community will accept personality driven decisions or radical changes in a service oriented, people friendly city administrative staff.

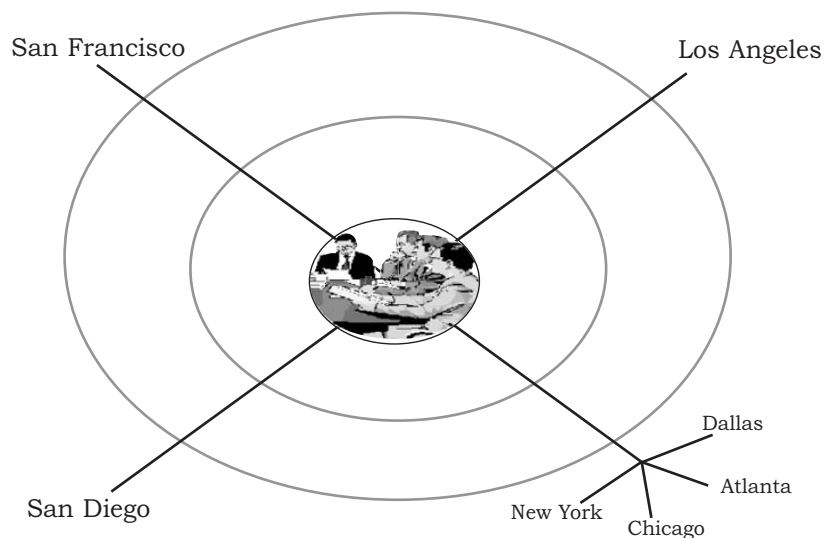

BOOKS THAT BIND

New and retired BHUSD faculty reunite each month at Beverly's book club

Many speculate Mark Twain was thinking of his neighborhood book club when he said, "Good friends, good books and a sleepy conscience: this is the ideal life."

While there's no way to know Twain's true intention, several at Beverly High's staff Book Club would probably argue the same.

The 72-member, 12-year-old staff book club at Beverly High, founded and led by Beverly High English teacher Julie Goler, brings together retired, former, new and current faculty and staff for one hour a month for a lively discussion over a commonly read book, hand-selected by Goler.

"[I love] the combination of exposing me to books that I wouldn't have maybe read on my own or wouldn't rush out to read and the camaraderie," said member Rick Munitz, now retired after a 41-year career as a high school English teacher and assistant principal, about why he's attended book club for the last six years.

His sentiment is one that motivates Goler to continue the club.

"That is exactly what I want them to get from the groups. I want to create a smaller community on campus for people who love what I love: reading," said Goler.

The club started after former assistant principal Tanis Harris approached Goler.

"She knew I was a voracious reader and Oprah was just starting the whole book group thing, so we thought there might be an interest and there was," said Goler, who now runs several book clubs across Los Angeles.

In the beginning, the club's membership was predominantly English teachers, according to Goler. As the years progressed, the membership started shifting to a more "interdepartmental" group, including kindergarten teachers through administrators.

"I love seeing my colleagues from the math to the science and social studies departments come in to share ideas about reading. Other connections to politics, arts and literature flow naturally from the reading. It makes what can be an isolating field, far less isolating," said Goler in an interview.

Today's membership is made up of dozens of retired staff members.

This makes sense, according to Munitz, who says that working teachers and administrators hardly have the time to read books for pleasure.

In fact, it wasn't until after his retirement in 2002, after the Book Club had

been up-and-running for a few years, that Munitz finally had the time to join the staff Book Club.

"I wanted to read more [after retiring]," said Munitz.

Of course, reading is only half of it. For Munitz, like many of the members, coming to book club is a chance to reunite with old friends.

The retired faculty and staff from BHUSD, ranging from a former El Rodeo kindergarten teacher to a former Beverly High vice principal, drive in from as far as Agoura Hills to reunite with former colleagues at their old BHUSD stomping grounds.

On the second Thursday in February, Beverly High's English lounge filled with 13 former and current teachers and administrators to share their thoughts and reactions to Evelyn Waugh's "Brideshead Revisited," Goler's selection for the month. She says she tries to include at least one "classic" in each year's book list.

"Who, asked the lady book critic, was

Evelyn Waugh? The greatest English novelist of the century, I ventured, but on ascertaining that he was not a dirty writer, she lost all interest, and went off to look for more dirty books to rail against," read Goler to the group from an obituary for Waugh written by William F. Buckley in 1966, at the beginning of last week's meeting.

Goler, a professional book club organizer, opens all the meetings in this way.

"I run meetings like a salon. The first thing that I do is introduce the author and his or her biography. I'll give the historical background on the book if there's any that's relevant, and then we start the discussion," said Goler.

At the February meeting, freshman honors world history teacher Joanie Garrett, former English teacher Alexandra Rose, retired payroll worker Penny Splain, former El Rodeo kindergarten teacher Barbara Sadoff, teacher Alli Jason-Fives, retired English teacher Mary Ann Baum, retired math teacher Lee Morris, retired biology teacher Susie Spruce, retired English teacher Roberta Beatty, retired assistant principal Rick Munitz, performing arts technician Anne

"[In] the side conversations, someone will tell me 'If you liked that, then check out this book.' But we talk about teaching classes too. If I talk about a [problem] I'm having, [the retired and experienced teachers] say 'Try taking this angle,'" said Butchart.

Discussions can become robust but "those things happen in terms of getting together a bunch of people who are well-read and informed," said Munitz. None of the members have yet to turn sour on each other.

"Of course, we all have experiences of literature as it speaks to challenges in teaching and working in education. We share a unique perspective as to what it is to work with certain populations. Teaching comes up at nearly every meeting; how does the literature relate to our work as educators? When I get to hear a true veteran like Rick Munitz or Mary Ann Baum speak to this, I really feel like my work as a teacher deepens," said Goler.

One of the advantages of holding a book club at a high school is all the intellectual resources available at her fingertips. Goler often invites teachers knowledgeable in the subject of the book to come to the meeting and offer their expertise and insight. For instance, when reading "Middlesex" by Jeffery Eugenides, Goler invited science teacher Marla Weiss to offer history and facts about intersexuality.

Goler spends most of her time busy teaching and running book clubs all over Los Angeles but somehow always finds time to continue the BHUSD Book Club.

"It's a gift, really," said Munitz of Goler's efforts.

MUSEUM OF TOLERANCE EXPANSION COULD AFFECT BH NEIGHBORS

Beverly-Roxbury HOA says traffic, parking, noise will be nuisance

Residents in the Beverly-Roxbury Homeowners Association say they are troubled by the possible noise pollution, traffic congestion and parking shortages that would be caused in their neighborhood if the Museum of Tolerance (MOT), a Holocaust memorial museum on Pico Boulevard at Roxbury, moves forward with its proposed 28,000 square-foot expansion to add a reception and banquet building where the Holocaust memorial garden is currently located.

“Our concerns are that we are across the street from the museum and the only mitigation that covers this change is on Olympic and Beverwil. There will be significant impact on traffic in Beverwil; people will still be driving up it,” said Olympic Boulevard resident Steve Dahlerbruch, president of Beverly-Roxbury Homeowners Association, which is bounded by Roxbury and Smithwood and Olympic and Pico. “People are going to park on our streets. And any development like this brings in trash and strangers to your neighborhood.”

Los Angeles resident Susan Gans, who says she lives “exactly one block” from the MOT, is leading neighborhood residents in Los Angeles in the protest and petitions against the expansion plan, culminating in a Web site titled Preserve the Legacy.

“[Gans’ group] just started informing us, frankly, about two weeks ago. Unfortunately, we came in too late and weren’t involved during the EIR comment period,” said Dahlerbruch. “We’ve tried to engage the city of Beverly Hills and to see if there is anything we can still do.”

The Museum of Tolerance’s current Environmental Impact Report (EIR) posits that the intersections of Beverwil and Olympic as well as Olympic and Roxbury will face “significant” traffic impacts and includes a proposal to widen and restripe Beverwil Drive as part of a mitigation effort.

The proposal suggests widening the western side of Beverwil Drive, north of Olympic Boulevard, and would require restriping Beverwil to accommodate an additional through street and add a dedicat-

ed right-turn lane on the southbound side.

City of Beverly Hills planning officials estimate that the project would increase traffic at the Beverwil and Olympic intersection by 2 percent during weekday evening peak hours.

There was no study performed to estimate how weekend traffic would be

cerns or the fact that people are going to be parking in our neighborhood,” said Dahlerbruch.

The 1986 conditional use agreement between the museum and the city of Los Angeles, in which the city granted the entitlements for the building on the grounds, that include among other things, there

97,400 square feet. The new wing would stand 63 feet tall, with a first and second floor setback of 20 feet, a reduction to the existing 100-foot setback.

The Museum currently offers 209 parking spaces in its three-level subterranean structure. For the new plan, the museum would lease an additional off-site parking lot, with an undisclosed number of spaces, for non-business hours and special events.

Dahlerbruch and Gans both say they are upset the museum is requesting so many changes to its original contract with Los Angeles.

“The original approval was not to have events and to have sufficient parking, that’s what allowed them to build in our one zone. They agreed not to have events. This is not an entertainment zone,” said Dahlerbruch. “What good is an agreement if you don’t stick to it?”

But The Simon Wiesenthal Center, which sponsors the museum, says that museums have changed in the 20 years since the MOT was built and that they need to catch up with times. The banquet hall will also bring in additional funds for the non-profit.

The Museum accommodates approximately 1,000 people, including students, each weekday. With a long waiting list daily, the museum says that expanding space would allow them to include more students in the programs in each day.

Some supporters of the expansion plan say that the residents concerns and complaints about the proposed development are nothing more than a Not In My Back Yard (NIMBY) campaign, in which immediate neighbors to a proposed development that could benefit the larger city say they want the project to be built elsewhere.

The Los Angeles Planning Commission hearing for the MOT is on March 26.

Representatives from the Museum of Tolerance and Simon Weisenthal Center could not be reached by press time. Los Angeles Fifth District (which include the MOT) City Council candidates Paul Koretz and David Vahedi did not return calls by press time.

City of Beverly Hills officials did not respond by press time.

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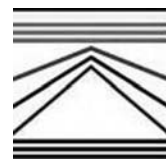
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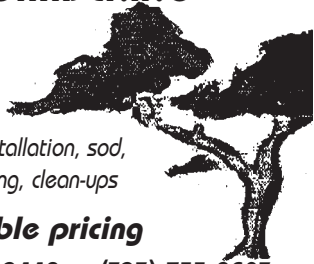
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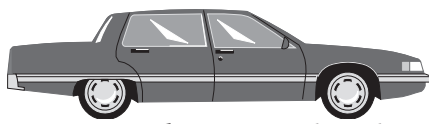
