“City makes \$18.7 million in budget cuts” [Issue 507]

There are many programs for seniors at the Roxbury Park Community Center, including a popular writing class. Prior to budget restrictions the writing class was free for Beverly Hills residents and \$1 per session for non-residents. As a result of cutbacks, residents now must pay \$2.50 per session and non-residents must pay \$3.20 per session. This fee is required in advance for a 10-week program; in other words \$25 and \$32. Most writing seniors have no objection to the per session fee. They object to having to pay in advance for 10 sessions. This is understandable as many of these seniors are in their 80s and even 90s and may be unable to attend all sessions. This excellent senior program provides recreation, mental stimulation and the opportunity to meet other seniors.

Is Beverly Hills so cash strapped that it cannot go back to a pay-as-you-go plan?

Larry Larson, who recently spearheaded attempts to stop voter fraud in Beverly Hills produced the Jackson's 1984 Victory Tour, prior to becoming an attorney.

At the time, the 55-date tour became the largest tour in American concert history selling two million tickets, Larson said.

“For about 16 months I was intimately involved with the six Jacksons and to a certain extent their family,” Larson said. “I didn’t work for their lawyers or their accountants, I worked for them.”

there.”

Larson said he was the first person hired by the Jackson Entertainment Corporation and was responsible for hiring crew for the tour.

“[Michael Jackson] was extremely creative and at that time extremely professional,” Larson said. “He always showed up on time and came prepared.”

Board of Education rejects contract agreements 5-0

In a special meeting held Monday at the district office, the Board of Education rejected contract agreements that 97 percent of the 300 BHEA members ratified June 15.

The board was originally supposed to vote on the agenda item at its June 23 meeting.

BHEA President Chris Bushee voiced his concerns of the delayed vote at the June 23 board meeting. The board then scheduled its special session Monday.

“BHEA fully expects the Board of Education to approve this agreement on June 30,” Bushee said in an email June 28.

He said a lot of years BHEA suggests salary and contract changes, but this year was more focused on language; such as: how teachers are professionally evaluated, enrollment protections and employees with children.

Board President Nooshin Meshkaty said the district is interested in re-bargaining and reaching an agreement.

“We’re hoping that we can come up with something that we can all agree on,” Meshkaty said. “We will have something ready hopefully by July 14 to be able to vote on.”

Boardmember Myra Demeter said the vote speaks for itself.

“They’re going to go back to the negotiating table they have two sessions planned before our next school board meeting,” Demeter said. “We’re very confident that in those two meetings they’ll be able to work out whatever they need to do.”

Superintendent Jerry Gross issued an email to certificated staff June 26 informing them of miscommunication and lack of communication between the board and administration during the negotiation of the agreement, Bushee said.

Bushee said BHEA is concerned with

the districts behavior.

“BHEA did everything we needed to do at the bargaining table this year,” Bushee said. “It’s unfortunate that a years worth of work has come to this. BHEA will sit down and listen to what the district has to say, but this does not speak well for the management of our district.”

BHEA will seek guidance from its parent union, the California Teachers Union, as it reevaluates the agreement, Bushee said.

“It is certainly BHEA and the districts hope to get through this bump in the road as smoothly and with as little pain as possible,” Bushee said. “But this is a situation that’s going to require all parties to really kind of evaluate our relationship and make sure that moving forward we put into place safe guards so that things like this do not happen again.”

The approval will return to the agenda at the board’s next meeting, July 14.

Twenty people show stray-cat-feeder support at her hearing

Katherine Varjian, 65, had a hearing Wednesday in the Beverly Hills superior court to after being sited for feeding stray cats during the past 12 years, a press release from her attorney Tina Varjian, said.

The outcome of the hearing was not available by press time.

Lt. Mark Rosen said 20 people bearing red armbands attended the hearing to support Katherine Varjian.

“It was peaceful,” Rosen said. “There were no disruptions to the court proceedings at all.”

The release said Katherine Varjian has helped significantly reduce the stray cat population in Beverly Hills.

However, Varjians neighbors attribute an increase in coyotes in the city to Varjian’s feeding of the cats.

48 year old man found hanged at City Hall

Jomo Bannett, 48, was found at 1:45 p.m. Sunday, hanged from a second floor stairwell on the Rexford Drive side of City Hall near its entrance, Lt. Mark Rosen said.

“He was a local transcient in the area,” Rosen said.

Bannett was pronounced dead shortly after being discovered. Rosen said his death has been ruled a suicide.

“Fortunately suicides are not all that common in Beverly Hills, especially of a public nature like this,” Rosen said.

Rosen said he could not recall any similar instances in Beverly Hills history.

Court date cancelled in Haber case

Shapiro was petitioning to have recently found bonds moved into Haber’s trust.

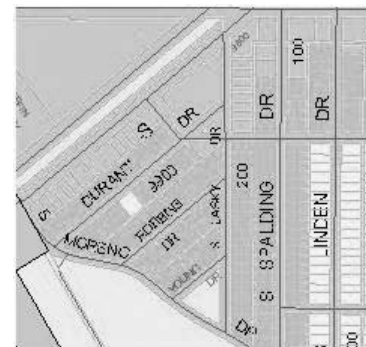

A Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) has been prepared for the proposed 13-unit condominium Project at 9936 Durant Drive. The DEIR will be released on Tuesday, June 30, 2009 for 45-day public review and comment period. The City of Beverly Hills encourages public comment on the DEIR during this period.

The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on the project and the DEIR on **Thursday July 23, 2009 at 1:30 PM** in Commission Meeting Room 280 A, Beverly Hills City Hall, 455 North Rexford Drive, Beverly Hills, California 90210.

Project Location: The project site is located at 9936 Durant Drive, on the south side of the street, between Moreno Drive to the west and Lasky Drive to the east. An alley runs along the southern edge of the project site.

Project Description: The project site is currently developed with a two-story, 28 foot tall, and 12,145 square foot apartment building with five dwelling units. Under the proposed project, the existing apartment building would be demolished and replaced by a four-story, 45 foot high, 24,906 square foot building containing 13 units, with two levels of subterranean parking containing 41 parking spaces. Access to the subterranean parking would be from the alley. Two of the 13 units would be set aside as moderate income affordable units.

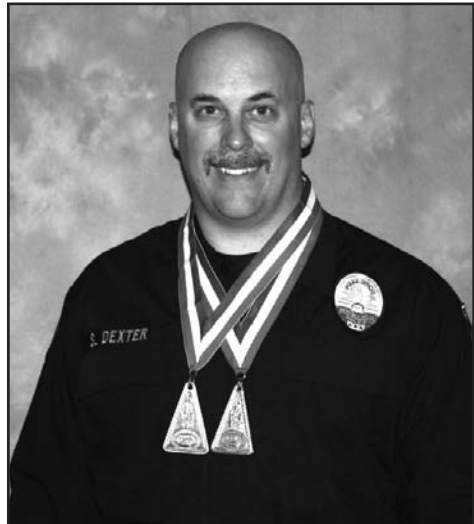

Water conservation regulations effective Wednesday

The Beverly Hills Residents' Association issued a Water Conservation Notice Wednesday.

Residents should have all received baselines for their water usage and should be decreasing water use by 10 percent.

Water consumers will be charged two times the amount of their water rate for water used after they've exceeded their baseline.

For those who water at improper times, water sidewalks or do not fix water leaks within a week of notification, it is \$100 per penalty.

Voter fraud allegations yet to be confirmed Atty. General's office said

Treasurer of the Citizen's Rights to Decide Committee, Larry Larson, said at the CRDC's June 1 news conference that he would be turning in evidence of 569 counts of voter fraud in Beverly Hills to California Attorney General Jerry Brown

and Los Angeles District Attorney Steve Cooley the week after the conference.

One month later, neither Brown nor Cooley has reviewed the material, Larson said, despite him sending both if them certified letters requesting they look into the allegations.

Larson said Brown's letter was sent May 26. He received a response June 17 from assistant Attorney General Jonathan K. Renner stating, "While the department of justice is committed to enforcing and upholding state laws it lacks the necessary resources to review and oversee local matters, such as the matters alleged in your letter."

Larson said he did not want their hard work going unnoticed.

"We're going to try to persuade the law enforcement officials who are responsible for investigating voter fraud to do their job," Larson said.

The letter proceeded to suggest Larson take the matter up with Secretary of State Debra Bowen, Larson said. He sent a copy of his letter and the letter he received from Renner to Bowen and is awaiting a response, he said.

Jane Robinson, news secretary of the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office, said Brown's office received Larson's letter June 25, but could not comment on it.

"When we receive complaints we review them and if we feel there is enough information and it is worthy of an investigation, we do open an investigation," Robinson said.

Larson declined to comment but con-

firmed Steve Cooley responded to the letter.

Schwartz Out, Prince Likely

Other notes on life in BH

Just when you thought you knew the cast of characters, meaning candidates, for the November 3 school board election, it all changes.

Who's out, who's in and who's still thinking? Considering her strong early endorsements, including from school board member **Steven Fenton**, Beverly Vista PTA co-president **Jennifer Terrell Schwartz's** decision not to run was a big shocker.

Schwartz told us her decision was strictly because of business reasons. As a pharmaceutical representative, she has been told her attendance at a company event in Chicago in October, the most critical month of the election, was "mandatory."

Even before Schwartz' surprise announcement, education activist Jonathan Prince told this column he was seriously considering running. Prince confirmed what we reported last week, but has yet to make a formal announcement.

Candidates have until August 7 to file and, unlike council contenders who must obtain at least 20 signatures on a nomination petition, school board candidates simply file a statement of candidacy.

Schwartz said she continued to be interested in serving on our school board and could run in 2011. That is when Fenton, Dr. **Brian Goldberg** and **Myra Lurie's** terms end. Of the three, Lurie is the only one who has ruled out seeking reelection. Although she insists it is very unlikely, Lurie continues to be mentioned as a possible city council candidate in 2011.

Back to the school board. Two term member Dr. **Myra Demeter** is still pondering running again. She told us the decision was complicated by her desire to explore some "professional opportunities." Demeter has been strongly urged to run by many activists in the education

community.

Demeter could make a strong argument that her experience on the board and her academic education training are needed more now than ever.

One incumbent who has made it clear she will seek a second term is board President **Nooshin Meshkaty** who first was elected without opposition, as was Dr. Demeter's for her second term.

The strongest contender is still **Jake Manaster**. He is really off and running and has garnered support from a good coalition of education and community leaders.

How would the other board members line up in the election? Dr. Goldberg has said he does not, as a matter of policy, endorse other candidates. However, he is open to reconsidering endorsing for school board and he was clearly ready to help Schwartz.

Fenton will not endorse Meshkaty or even Dr. Demeter but is likely to back their challengers. Lurie would support Dr. Demeter and will endorse Meshkaty despite some recent differences on board votes. Fenton has already said he was supporting Manaster.

There may be other candidates, especially now that Schwartz is out of the race, including some PTA officers.

On the city side, the only candidate who has made it clear he will seek election to the city council in 2011 is **Noah Furie**, a long time member and past chair of the planning commission. Councilmember **Jimmy Delshad** has not ruled a third term and Mayor **Nancy Krasne** will probably run for a second.

Beverly Hills is now experiencing what has been happening in West Hollywood

for months: Planned Edison Company outages. The company says this is necessary to repair equipment, but the impacts are very unsettling.

It is likely that many sections of Beverly Hills will soon be hit. This week, the South Reeves Drive area had no electric service from 11 p.m. Tuesday until mid-afternoon Wednesday despite earlier assurances power would be restored by 9 a.m. The difference meant that frozen and other foods would be lost. For many seniors and others this is quite serious.

Edison needs to be more up front about why this is really necessary and if the outages continue beyond expected completion, provide more timely information to their customers.

Second notice. Sill time to obtain ducats to a very special event: Legendary comedians **Jack Carter** and **Norm Crosby** will perform on August 9 at Roxbury Park along with singer **Tiba**.

Those who were fortunate enough to catch **Debbie Reynolds** show at Roxbury last year know how much fun this can be. For reservation information, call (310) 285-6840

Speaking of entertainment, the new offering by Theatre Forty is certainly worth catching, there is a however.

The Voyage Inheritance, written by **Harley Granville-Barker** and adopted by **David Mamet** could have been taken from newspaper headlines: the story of an investment advisor who ripped off his clients, mostly long time friends, although in this drama set in Victorian England, the story could have been told in 15 minutes instead of two acts.

In this play, the actors outshine the plot, and most are truly impressive. **David Hunt Stafford**, the Theatre Forty head who also produced the play, gives the most insightful performance as one of the investor's major victims. His British persona and his reaction to being ripped off are neither stereotypical nor lacking in subtlety.

This is a Stafford we have not seen and he brings the play back to life in the second act. Also worth noting is the great set design for **Jeff Black**.

Is it worth seeing? Yes. It isn't that the play is too long, the tale is just too skimpy. After all, our Maddoff did it all in real time.

One more mini-review? **Woody Allen's** "Whatever Works" has the same problem as the Theatre Forty play: Great cast, slim story. However, the Allen script does have some great moments, just not

enough,

Larry David does, for a few fleeting moments, become **Woody Allen**, but mostly he's the same guy you came to hate in Curb Your Enthusiasm, well not always.

Best performance was by the end of the movie appearance of **Ed Begley, Jr.** This actor is one of the most resourceful in the industry. Never predictable, his grafting of the role of a country father come to fetch his wandering wife in the big city is moving and hilarious. Also, the movie has some very risky moments of cinematography not often found in Allen's films.

What was also rewarding was our first visit to the Landmark Theatres on West Pico. Reserved seating, kosher and actually well cooked hot dogs, polite staff and a food server who explained that, although she had not seen the movie, those who had raved. That's not something you can actually train someone to say.

It amazes me how durable the Beverly Hills Rotary Club is. It has for years been the dominant service club in our community and has reinvented itself many times.

In a throw back to another era, **Robert Anderson Jr.**, just completed his year as president, succeeded by lawyer/lobbyist **Mitch Dawson**. What makes this so interesting is that Anderson's father was the long time leader of the Beverly Hills Civic League, later merged into the Chamber of Commerce, and that was the organization that supported the major developer projects in the 1950 and 1960s. Son Robbie was not as big an advocate for growth as Robert Sr.

True, many former mayors now lobbyists also belong to Rotary, and why not, that's a good place to break bread with many councilmembers. As for former mayors making a living as lobbyists, this is not as new as you might assume.

Here are some former councilmembers and mayors who did land use matters either when or after serving on the council. This list may surprise you: **Frederic Leopold, Richard Stone, Donna Ellman, Joseph Tilem, Edward I. Brown, Les Bronte, Allen Alexander, Thomas S. Levyn** and **Mark Egerman**. Why are former mayors hired? First, they know the process but so are the very able **Murray Fischer** and **Lee Silver**. However, if you are sitting in a New York office, talking to a Beverly Hills associate who informs you that you could actually hire a former mayor to represent your project that just might be very appealing.

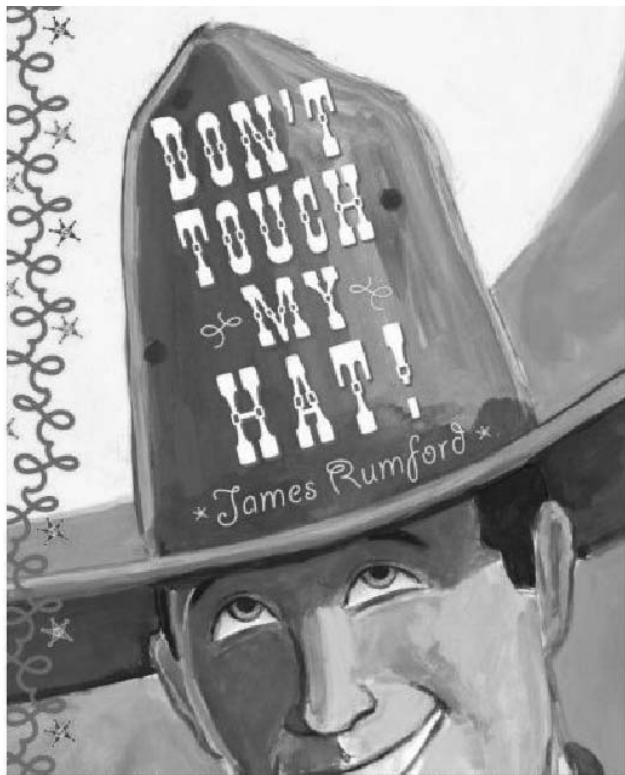

SUMMER READING

What are your neighbors reading?

With a holiday weekend coming up, why not take advantage of that extra free time and join your neighbors in opening up a good book? The Weekly will give you a look into the books your neighbors are reading this summer.



Children

The Youth of Beverly Hills will be toting around books as frequently as they do Ipods this summer, thanks to the Children's Library of the Beverly Hills Public Library.

The library offers children four programs to choose from, one of which began in June.

Summer Reading Club "Put on Your Reading Hat" began June 19 and ends August 14. With more than 40 books on its list, all focused around hats, bored is no longer an excuse.

"Don't Touch My Hat!" by James Rumford is about a sheriff from the old west, who fights crime with his lucky 10 gallon hat.

"We think it's really important for kids to continue to read through the summer so they don't lose their skills over the summer," manager of children's services Kay McDonald said.

Story Time programs begin July 6, running until August 1. This program features story times for three

age groups: toddlers (ages 2-3 years-old), toddler plus (ages 2 1/2 to 4 years-old) and pre-school (ages 3-5 years-old). Toddler story times is Wednesdays from 11-11:30 a.m., toddler plus story times is Mondays and Thursdays from 11-11:40 a.m., and pre-school story times is Tuesday, Fridays and Saturdays from 11-11:45 a.m.

Afternoon Antics, the third program, is offered to children 5 years and older every Wednesday in July at 3 p.m.

Instead of using books, this program uses people to tell the stories. The first show, July 8, features Janathon's Juggling Circus, which tells the history of juggling starting with its beginnings in ancient Egypt and following through until the 21st century.

Midsummer's Night Delight is another visual story telling program in July. Monday nights at 7 p.m. children 3 years and older will be treated to a themed night of story telling. Cowboy Ken kicks off the program July 6 with an evening set in the old west. He'll be telling his stories with folktales, campfire songs and rope tricks.

All a child needs to participate is a library card. Due to limited space visual story telling requires tickets that can be picked up the Thursday before each show at the children's department reference desk.

McDonald said the library's goal is to create a situation where reading is fun for children.

"We make it as fun as possible so that by the end of the summer they've read a lot of books and they pick books that they really enjoy," McDonald said. "They think of reading as something fun to do, not something you have to do."

For those children who complete eight books from the Summer Reading Club, as well as a report on each one, they will be invited to the Summer Reading Club Party, August 14, to conclude the end of summer.

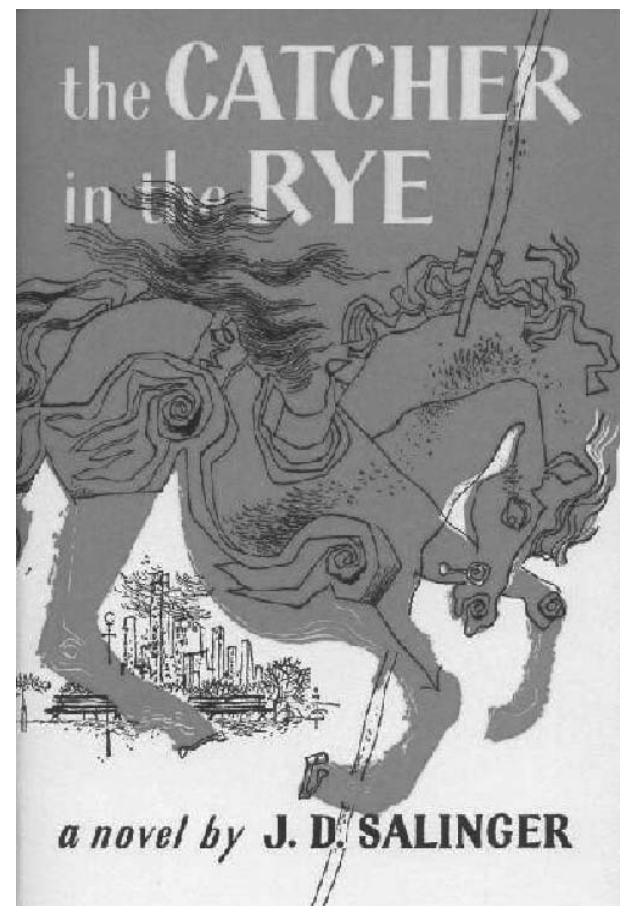

High school

From freshman to seniors, students of Beverly High in English honors and Advanced Placement English courses have a lot of reading to complete by September.

Luckily, instead of school books, their reading material ranges from "The Catcher in the Rye" by J.D. Salinger to "The Chosen" by Chaim Potok.

Incoming freshman, sophomore and juniors are required to read four books off of the summer reading list provided by Beverly High. Seniors are required to



read two books and one text.

English department chair Christiane Elhabr said the list is a way for students to read and learn about a wider selection of books. For example, students read and learn British literature their sophomore year. During the school year, they read four to five books, Elhabr said, so summer is a way to fit in four more.

"A lot of it has to do with exposure," Elhabr said. "And a lot of it has to do with keeping their brains working over the summer."

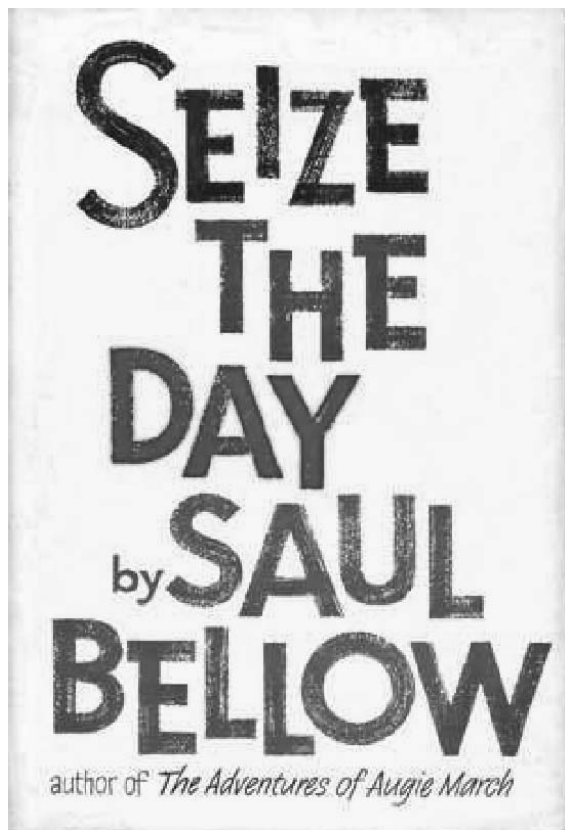
Two changes were made to the list this year. "Tess of the d'Urbervilles" by Thomas Hardy was replaced with "Jane Eyre" by Charlotte Brontë; and "Cry, the Beloved Country" by Alan Paton was removed.

"You begin to see patterns of books they're not choosing," Elhabr said. "So we still wanted them to have a classic British novel and we wanted to see if Jane Eyre appealed more to the students."

Elhabr said Paton's novel was removed to avoid repetition. Incoming juniors read it over the summer, and then it was taught again their senior year.

Changes are not common to the list. Elhabr said tests and essay questions are suited well to each book on the

list and it would take a lot of work to change the list each year.



City

As reported in Issue #457, the City's employee book club disbanded about a year ago because of low interest.

Patty Ogden, assistant City clerk, said it was hard for her to find time to participate because of her workload, but starting one back up might be of interest to other City employees.

"I think it's a great idea," Ogden said.

Two book clubs meet in the Beverly Hills Public Library each month.

The Great Book Discussion Group meets the second and fourth Thursday of every month from 7-9 p.m. to discuss great books of civilization, Marilyn Taniguchi, library services manager of public services, said. Examples of books on its reading list includes: "On the Shortness of Life" by Seneca and "Seize the Day" by Saul Bellow.

Friends of the Library Reading Group normally meet the second Wednesday of each month from 10:15 – 11:45 a.m., but the group is on hiatus until Sept. 9.

If the hours are too late, or there isn't enough time in the day, the library also offers personalized monthly recommendations by email once a month.

"The news letters links them from their computer to the library's computer and it tells them if the book is available," Taniguchi said. "They can even put a hold on it if they want to."

Subscribers will receive six to eight suggestions from topics and genres they choose, she said. The free service will even suggest books similar to authors that reader enjoys.

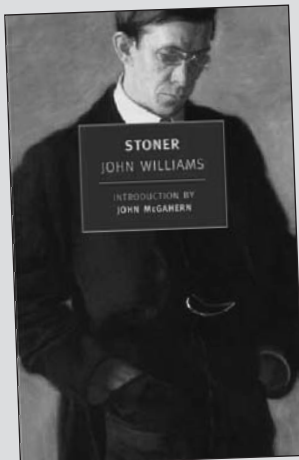
"I think it's good for people who are really eager readers and it's good for us because sometimes we don't know everything about every book," Taniguchi said.

Since it has been offered more than 200 residents have signed up for the service, she said.

For those looking to buy books, instead of check them out, Friends of Beverly Hills book shop, located in the library, offers new, used and out of print books.

Taniguchi said one of the most popular services of the book shop is the last chance \$1 books by the check out.

Rogaway said it was an introspective look into a young man's life starting out as a student and progressing to a master professor at the University of Missouri.

Having a son who teaches at the University of California, Davis, made it all the more interesting to read, she said.

"It was a very interesting look into universities," Rogaway said. "A friend read it for one of her book clubs and said I'd enjoy it; and I did."

Rogaway said the fictional series "Twilight" by Stephenie Meyer and "Harry Potter" by J.K. Rowling have been popular picks at the library.

"A lot of young parents come in and request "Twilight," she said. "A mother came in here last week and asked for the newest Harry Potter book. She said she wanted to see what all the talk was about."



Patty Ogden, assistant City Clerk, just read "How to Ruin a Summer Vacation" by Simone Elkeles.

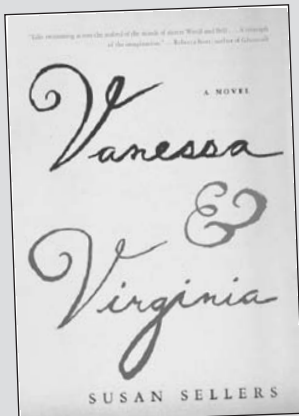
"[It] was not geared for my age group, but it was really fun," Ogden said.

"Vanessa and Virginia" by Susan Sellers is her latest reading accomplishment.

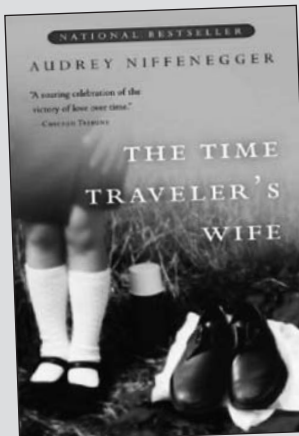
"It's very poignant in a lot of places because they were both somewhat troubled women," Gibbons said.

"If you've gone through life and not read little women then you need to catch up to pace and read it," Gibbons said.

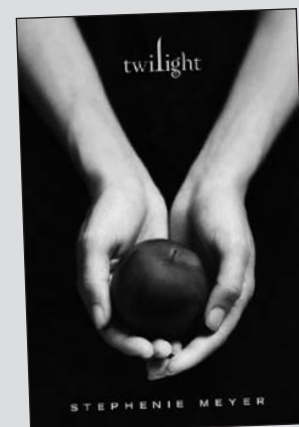

BHHS Names Co-Athletic Director, New Coaches

Norman girls' basketball team wins another tournament.

Jason Newman and Vonzie Paysinger will share the athletic director's role at Beverly High, subject to expected approval by the Beverly Hills Unified School District Board of Education, Carter Paysinger announced Wednesday.

Their specific responsibilities have not been determined, Carter Paysinger said.

Carter Paysinger had been the athletic director before assuming his new position as an assistant principal Wednesday.

The athletic director's position was limited to staff members. Four staff members applied for the position and three were interviewed, Carter Paysinger said. The fourth person withdrew from consideration before the interview process, he said.

The appointment was made by Principal J. Guidetti, Carter Paysinger said.

Newman is 1969 Beverly High graduate and the school's boys' and girls' golf coach. Vonzie Paysinger, a younger brother of Carter Paysinger, is a 1979 Beverly High graduate and its baseball coach and an assistant football coach.

Carter Paysinger also announced the hiring of Jeff Fisher as the school's cross country coach, Sherman Armstrong as track and field coach and Kate Marks as girls' lacrosse coach.

"They know our program well," Carter Paysinger said of Armstrong and Fisher. "They know our kids. They were very, very good coming in and the last couple of years [have] been very good."

Fernando Dominguez, who had been both cross country and track and field coach, is not returning because of conflicts with his college schedule and long commute.

Georgia Hurd will not return as girls' lacrosse coach because she "could not commit to next season," Carter Paysinger said.

Marks would have been the girls' lacrosse coach this season, "but was just starting as a counselor," Carter Paysinger said.

Fisher had been an assistant coach with both the cross country and track teams, Armstrong the boys' spring coach. Marks is a counselor who played lacrosse in high school and afterward and coached the sport, Carter Paysinger said.

Carter Paysinger said an assistant coach will be named as his successor as football coach "in the next week or so."

"The responsibilities of our all of our

[football] coaches is going to stay the same," he said. "The head coach really depends on which one has the time to handle the time to handle the extra responsibilities that comes with [being] the head coach."

Carter Paysinger had said in April he would continue to be a football coach, helping call plays during games and joining the rest of the staff on weekends in designing game plans.

Girls' Basketball

Beverly Hills won its second consecutive tournament, defeating Palos Verdes, 60-48, in Saturday's final of the Platinum Division of the Saugus Tournament at Saugus High School.

The Normans outscored the Sea Kings, 16-4, over the final four minutes after the score was tied, 44-44.

Beverly Hills advanced to the final by defeating Bakersfield Stockdale, 66-37, in a semifinal Friday, benefiting from the Central Section Division I champion Mustangs' fatigue in a quarterfinal overtime victory over Studio City Harvard-Westlake earlier Friday.

"They didn't even warm up before the game," Solomon said. "They were exhausted. We really took advantage and ran and ran and ran. It was cruise control

basically."

Mason scored 28 points.

The Normans defeated North Hills Monroe, 56-28, in a Platinum Division quarterfinal Friday, with Mason scoring 20 points to help avenge a one-point loss in a game this spring.

"The girls were hungry and wanted to beat them pretty badly," Solomon said. "They couldn't match up with us. It was kind of an easy game. We took control early."

Beverly Hills defeated West Hills Chaminade, 69-58, in a pool play game last Thursday, with Mason scoring 41 points.

"She carried us on her back," Solomon said.

The Normans built a 20-point second-half lead that the Eagles cut to six several times, Solomon said.

"We always had the answers down the stretch," Solomon said.

Chaminade was "very good" and "shot the ball really well," Solomon said.

Beverly Hills opened the tournament with a 53-37 victory over Crescenta Valley in a pool play game last Thursday, with Mason scoring 31 points, in a game they trailed 24-19 at halftime.

"I don't think we played very well at all," Solomon said. "It was probably the worst team we played so far this summer. They were missing kids and I don't think they were near our level."

"I think we were uninspired. We took them lightly. We didn't really play hard at all. We played with no intensity. The second half we did much better."

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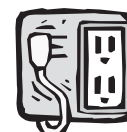
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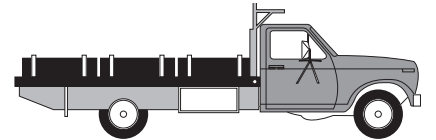
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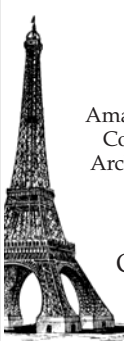

The Council of the City of Beverly Hills does resolve as follows:

Section 1. That certain document entitled "City of Beverly Hills 2009/10 Fiscal Year Budget," a copy of which is on file in the office of the City Clerk, which may hereafter be amended by the Council, is hereby approved as the Capital Improvement Program budget for the City of Beverly Hills for the Fiscal Year 2009/10.

Section 2. Appropriations in the amount not to exceed \$72,961,784 are authorized in the City's various funds that have capital programs for the purpose of carrying on the Capital Improvement Program of the City.

Section 5. The Chief Financial Officer may make budget adjustments to accounts within the same fund, provided that the fund is within its approved budget and that any transfer between departments within the same fund is authorized by the City Manager.

The City Manager may transfer and appropriate up to \$300,000 during the Fiscal Year and the Chief Financial Officer may transfer and appropriate up to \$100,000 during the Fiscal Year from all fund balances to any accounts within that fund as long as it meets the purposes of that fund's designation. Section 5. The Chief Financial Officer may make budget adjustments to accounts within the same fund, provided that the fund is within its approved budget.

Section 6. The City Manager may transfer and appropriate up to \$300,000 during the Fiscal Year and the Chief Financial Officer may transfer and appropriate up to \$100,000 during the Fiscal Year from all fund balances to any accounts within that fund as long as it meets the purposes of that fund's designation. An annual report shall be made to the Council describing each transfer and the reason therefore.

Section 7. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 37208 of the Government Code, the Council, from time to time, by motion or resolution, may ratify the prior payment of budgeted demands from those funds which have been certified or approved by the Chief Financial Officer and may appropriate funds for non-budgeted items, and any such appropriation for a non-budgeted item shall constitute an approval to issue a warrant in payment of a proper demand or demands therefore.

Section 8. The City Council hereby adopts the Comprehensive Financial Policies of the City for Fiscal Year 2009/2010, as attached to this resolution.

Section 9. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this resolution and shall cause this resolution and his certification, together with proof of publication, to be entered in the Book of Resolutions of the Council of this City.

**Section 10. In the case of fee-based programs, if the revenues for such programs exceed the amount budgeted, the City Council hereby authorizes the Chief Financial Officer to increase the appropriation of said program in the same amount of the increased revenue.

Adherence to adopted financial policies promotes sound financial management, which can lead to improvement in bond ratings, a lower cost of capital, provide assurance to the tax payers that tax dollars are being collected and spent per City Council direction and provide a minimum of unexpected impacts upon taxpayers and users of public services. Parking Authority of the City of Beverly Hills

The Parking Authority of the City of Beverly Hills (Parking Authority) is a public financing agency established by the City under the State of California Parking Law of 1949 to provide public parking facilities on a citywide basis. The Parking Authority provides for the acquisition and/or construction of parking facilities that are leased to the City for the general benefit of its citizens.

The City Manager is the Executive Officer of the Parking Authority and the Chief Financial Officer is the Finance Director Treasurer of the Parking Authority.

Beverly Hills Public Financing Authority

The City of Beverly Hills Public Financing Authority (Public Financing Authority) is a joint powers authority, organized pursuant to a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement, dated November 10, 1992 between the City and the Parking Authority. The Joint Powers Agreement was entered into pursuant to the provisions of Article 1 of Chapter 5 of the California Government Code (the Act). The Public Financing Authority was created for the purpose of providing financing for public capital improvements for the City through the acquisition by the Public Financing Authority of such public capital improvements and/or the purchase by the Public Financing Authority of local obligations within the meaning of the Act. Under the Act, the Public Financing Authority has the power to issue bonds to pay the costs of public capital improvements.

Required lease payments between the City and the Public Financing Authority exactly match debt service requirements of the underlying debt. Accordingly, the leases between the City and the Public Financing Authority are eliminated and the underlying debt is reported as debt of the City. Separate financial statements are not prepared for the Public Financing Authority.

The City Manager is the Executive Officer of the Public Financing Authority and the Chief Financial Officer is the Finance Director Treasurer of the Public Financing Authority.

Financial Reporting Policies

The City's accounting and financial reporting systems will be maintained in conformance with all state and federal laws, generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) and the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA). Further, the City will make every attempt to implement all changes to governmental accounting practices at the earliest practicable time.

An annual audit will be performed by an independent public accounting firm with an audit opinion to be included with the City's published Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR).

The City's CAFR will be submitted to the GFOA Certification of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Program. The financial report should be in conformity with GAAP, demonstrate compliance with finance related legal and contractual provisions, disclose thoroughness and detail sufficiency, and minimize ambiguities and potentials for misleading inference.

The City's CAFR will also be submitted to national repositories identified by the City's bond trust agent as a continuing commitment to disclose thoroughness to enable investors to make informed decisions.

Comprehensive Financial Policies

Financial policies shall be adopted by the City Council during the annual budget approval and will establish the framework for the overall fiscal planning and management of the City of Beverly Hills. Parking Authority of the City of Beverly Hills

The Parking Authority of the City of Beverly Hills (Parking Authority) is a public financing agency established by the City under the State of California Parking Law of 1949 to provide public parking facilities on a citywide basis. The Parking Authority provides for the acquisition and/or construction of parking facilities that are leased to the City for the general benefit of its citizens.

Budget development will use strategic multi-year fiscal planning, conservative revenue forecasts,

and program-based cost accounting that require every program to be justified annually in terms of meeting intended objectives ("effectiveness criteria"). The process will include a diligent review of programs by staff, the Chief Financial Officer and City Council.

Utilization of a program budget format will provide a basis for evaluation of service and other impacts of potential increases or decreases in funding.

Revenues will not be dedicated for specific purposes, unless required by law or generally accepted accounting practices (GAAP). All non-restricted revenues will be deposited in the General Fund (or other designated fund as approved by the Chief Financial Officer) and appropriated by City Council.

Current revenues will fund current expenditures and a diversified and stable revenue system will be developed and maintained to protect programs from short-term fluctuations in any single revenue source.

Current operating expenditures for all fund types will include all allocable overhead operating costs. For the most part, these expenses will be charged to individual budget program elements as internal service fund charges. Included within the allocated service charges to Governmental Fund types will be funding adequate to maintain the approved capital program (unless financed through other debt instruments).

City staff shall strive to identify entrepreneurial solutions to recover costs of operating programs.

The City shall strive to avoid returning to the City Council for new or expanded appropriations. Exceptions may include emergencies, unforeseen impacts, mid-year adjustments or new opportunities.

Addition of personnel will only be requested to meet program initiatives and policy directives; after service needs have been thoroughly examined and it is substantiated that additional staffing will result in increased revenue or enhanced operating efficiencies. To the extent feasible, personnel cost reductions will be achieved through attrition.

All non-enterprise user fees and charges will be examined or adjusted at least bi-annually to determine the direct and indirect cost of service recovery rate. The acceptable recovery rate and any associated changes to user fees and charges will be approved by the City Council following public review.

Development impact fees, as permitted by state law, for capital expenses attributable to new development will be reviewed annually to ensure that fees recover all direct and indirect development-related expenses and be approved by City Council. Any unfavorable balances in cost recovery will be brought to the City Council's attention and evaluated from a departmental, program and goals perspective.

Capital equipment replacement will be accomplished through a life cycle of funding mechanism and in some instances the use of a "rental" rate structure. The rates will be revised annually to ensure that charges to operating departments are sufficient for operation and replacement of vehicles and other capital equipment (fleet, computers, phones and copier systems). The City shall endeavor to maintain adequate cash reserves to fund 100% replacement of capital equipment. Replacement costs will be based upon equipment lifecycle financial analysis developed by each department and approved by the Chief Financial Officer. Non-capital equipment replacement will be accomplished through a life cycle funding mechanism developed by each department and approved by the Chief Financial Officer.

Grant funding will be considered to leverage City funds. Inconsistent and/or fluctuating grants should not be used to fund ongoing programs. Programs financed with grant monies will be budgeted in separate cost centers, and the service program will be adjusted to reflect the level of available funding. In the event of reduced grant funding, City resources will be substituted only after all program priorities and alternatives are considered.

Balanced revenue and expenditure forecasts will be prepared by the Chief Financial Officer to examine the City's ability to absorb operating costs due to changes in the economy, service demands, and capital improvements. The forecast will be updated annually and include a four or five-year outlook. The Chief Financial Officer will prepare these estimates to the City Council at least once a year.

Alternative means of service delivery will be evaluated by the Chief Financial Officer to ensure that quality services are provided to our citizens at the most competitive and economical cost. Departments, in cooperation with the City Manager and Chief Financial Officer, will identify all activities that could be provided by another source and review options/alternatives to current service delivery. The review of service delivery alternatives and the need for the service will be performed annually or on an "opportunity" basis.

Cash and Investment programs will be maintained in accordance with the Government Code and the adopted investment policy and will ensure that proper controls and safeguards are maintained. City funds will be managed in a prudent and diligent manner with an emphasis on safety of principal, liquidity, and financial return on principal, in that order. Pursuant to State law, the City Treasurer and Chief Financial Officer, at least annually, revise, and the City Council affirms, a detailed investment policy. In addition to liquidity requirements, the City Treasurer and Chief Financial Officer will also consider the appropriateness of investment decisions vis-à-vis debt management.

The City, through the Chief Financial Officer and the Administrative Services Department, will follow an aggressive, consistent, but sensitive policy of collecting revenues, with proper internal controls, to meet the needs of the City and follow all applicable state and federal laws.

Capital Management Policies

A five-year Capital Improvement Plan will be developed and updated annually, including anticipated funding sources. Capital improvement projects are defined as infrastructure or equipment purchases or construction which results in a capitalized asset and having a useful (depreciable life) of two years or more.

The capital improvement plan will attempt to include, in addition to current operating maintenance expenditures, adequate funding to support repair and replacement of deteriorating infrastructure and avoidance of a significant unfunded liability.

Proposed capital projects will be part of the City budget development process and reviewed and prioritized by a cross-departmental team regarding accurate costing (design, capital, and operating) as well as the Chief Financial Officer for overall consistency with the City's goals and objectives. The City's Chief Financial Officer will then identify financing sources for the highest-ranking projects.

Capital project contract awards will include a fiscal impact statement disclosing the expected operating impact of the project and when such cost is expected to occur.

Pay-as-you-go Capital Improvement Plan financing should account for a minimum of 50 percent of all capital improvement projects for each five-year planning period. Pay-as-you-go financing is defined as all sources of revenue other than City debt issuance, i.e., fund balance contributions, developer contributions, grants, endowments, etc. Pay-as-you-go financing should generally be considered as the preferred option. However, the potential for debt issuance that provides additional economic and/or strategic values should be considered as recommended by the Chief Financial Officer.

The City shall endeavor to apply restricted funds (i.e., In-lieu Parking, Gas Tax Funds or existing Bond proceeds) to capital projects before using "unrestricted" funds.

Debt Management Policies

The Chief Financial Officer will seek to maintain and, if possible, improve our current bond rating(s) in order to minimize borrowing costs and preserve access to credit.

New debt issues, and refinancing of existing debt, must be analyzed for compatibility within the City's overall financial planning. The review shall not be limited to cash flow analysis, potential for unexpected revenue surprises, and the maintenance of the City's bond ratings. Annual debt service shall not produce an inordinate impact upon future operations.

The Chief Financial Officer will ensure that City Debt Service costs within the General Fund should not exceed 15% of the City's operating revenue in order to control fixed costs and ensure expenditure flexibility. Improvement District, Enterprise Fund and general obligation debt service is not included in this calculation because it is paid by district property owners, service users or taxpayers and is not an obligation of future general fund revenues.

General Obligation debt, which is supported by property tax revenues and grows in proportion to the City's assessed valuation and/or property tax rate increases, may be utilized if/when authorized by voters. Other types of debt (e.g., water, sewer, and parking) may also be utilized when they are supported by dedicated revenue sources (e.g., fees and user charges) and recommended by the Chief Financial Officer.

Debt financing should not exceed the useful life of the infrastructure improvement with the average (weighted) bond maturities at or below twenty-five years, unless otherwise authorized by Council.

A ratio of current assets to current liabilities of at least 2/1 will be maintained to ensure the City's ability to pay short-term obligations.

Utility rates will be set, as a minimum, to ensure the ratio of revenue to debt service meets our bond indenture requirement (generally a minimum of 125% of debt service). When calculating debt services coverage for internal purposes, the minimum pay-as-you-go capital expense for each enterprise fund will be considered a part of the operating costs to be covered by pre-debt service revenues. The City goal will be to maintain the required debt service coverage with this additional cost factored into the equation. Use of a 5 year budget projection, including capital project requirements, will provide assurance that all needs are considered by the Chief Financial Officer, the Public Works Commission and City Council as revenue requirements are considered.

Reserve Policies

General Fund

All fund designations and reserves will be evaluated annually by the Chief Financial Officer for long-term adequacy and use requirements in conjunction with development of the City's balanced five year financial plan.

It is a goal of the City to obtain and maintain a general operating reserve in the form of cash, of at least 40% of operating revenues. The first 25% shall be considered a contingency reserve to cover normal seasonal cash flow variations, as well as unforeseen emergency or catastrophic impacts upon the City. Funds in excess of 25% may be used for economic investment in the community when justified by projected financial return to the City and specifically authorized by the City Council.

In addition to cash specifically maintained in the General Fund, we recognize the following cash reserve resources as being available to meet sudden negative fiscal impacts in the short term:

- Liability Self-Insurance Fund
- Worker's Compensation Self-Insurance Fund

- Employee Benefits Fund
- Information Technology Fund
- Equipment Replacement Fund

One-time revenue windfalls should be designated as a reserve or used for one-time expenditures. The funds should not be used for on-going expenditures. To the extent such funds are not required for current expenditures, one-time expenditures and/or capital improvements such funds should be maintained as operating reserves or used to reduce debt.

For purposes of this policy, one-time revenue windfalls shall include:

- Proceeds from new taxes or increases in existing tax rates.
- Lump sum (net present value) savings from debt restructuring
- CalPERS Rebates
- Tax Revenue growth in excess of 5% in a single year
- Sale of city-owned real estate
- Pure unexpected revenues (i.e. litigation settlement)
- Receipts from approved Development Agreements
- Contributions and Gifts
- Any other revenues the City Council may elect to designate as extraordinary

Sufficient reserves shall be maintained in internal service funds to prevent extended disruption of service in the event of natural disasters or other interruptions of revenue collections. Determination of adequate reserves will be reviewed annually by the Chief Financial Officer and guided by the following:

Self-Insurance Reserves (liability, workers' compensation, other) will be maintained at a level, which, together with purchased insurance policies, will adequately cover the City's property, liability, and health benefit risk. A qualified actuarial firm shall be retained and report on a bi-annual basis recommended appropriate funding levels. The City shall endeavor to maintain reserves equal to 90% of the estimated net present value of such liabilities.

Fleet Management, Building, Equipment and Information Technology reserves will be maintained based upon lifecycle replacement plans to ensure adequate fund balance required for systematic replacement of fleet vehicles, buildings, computers and related equipment, and operational contingencies. Operating departments will be charged over the useful life of the asset used. The City shall endeavor to stabilize funding by maintaining reserves equal to the current replacement cost of each asset class.

Enterprise Fund (Water, Solid Waste, Wastewater, Parking and Stormwater) user fees and charges will be examined annually to ensure that they recover all direct and indirect costs of service, provide for capital improvements and maintenance, and maintain adequate reserves. Secondly, maintenance of cash reserves will provide a de facto rate stabilization plan. Rate increases shall be approved by the City Council following formal noticing and public hearing.

Rate adjustments for enterprise operations will be based on five-year financial plans unless a conscious decision is made to the contrary. The target level of operating cash reserves shall be 50% of gross annual user revenues.

Contingency Reserves, to be determined annually by the Chief Financial Officer, will be maintained to offset unanticipated revenue shortfalls and/or unexpected expenditure increases. Contingency reserves may also be used for unanticipated and/or inadequately budgeted events threatening the public health or safety. Use of contingency funds should be approved at recommendation of the Chief Financial Officer.

Annual Review of Financial Policies

The City Council shall review and approve the financial policies on an annual basis, as recommended by the Chief Financial Officer.
