Horace Mann Student Threatens Board Members; Emergency Meeting Called

An emergency Board of Education meeting was called Sunday after a Horace Mann student suggested bringing “machine guns and machetes” to the board’s upcoming Jan. 12 meeting.

A rowdy board meeting Friday sparked at least four Facebook pages created by Beverly High students, who continue to engage in a first-ever online debate.

The issue involves opportunity permits — and the solution may show BHUSD opportunity students the door.

But the debate turned ugly after one student posted the violent threats, which were immediately removed from the page.

“Anyone who posts about violent actions will [immediately] be deleted and blocked from [this] Web site,” posted creator Nikka Harounian of the page “Petition to keep permits students in BHUSD” on Sunday around noon. “Because of [certain] comments, the BHPD has become involved, and an emergency meeting has been called.”

Sunday’s emergency meeting with the Beverly Hills Police Department discussed matters of security for board members and their families, after Friday’s meeting ended in a vote to draft a letter notifying permit parents that BHUSD will no longer renew

or accept opportunity permits.

Actions against the student, however, have yet to be taken.

“There wasn’t a specific person that was targeted, and investigators determined that it wasn’t a credible threat,” said Lt. Tony Lee. “The kid was located...but wasn’t arrested.”

Lee said it was entirely up to the school to determine consequences for his actions.

“I want to thank BHPD for being so responsive and proactive,” said board member Brian Goldberg. “When you cross that line into threatening physical violence to board members, that’s a line that we cannot tolerate in the community.”

In light of the threat and the actions taken thereafter, Beverly High student Nick Komlos followed the same path by posting another threat Tuesday.

“I say all the permit kids should burn the science building down in protest,” Komlos wrote.

After other students warned Komlos of posting such a threat, Komlos quickly responded: “Well, I’m obviously kidding.”

The Facebook pages continue to draw in traffic, as the four pages have accumulated a growing number of more than 2,000 members. And most comments have been pro-opportunity permits.

“Some of the smartest kids at BHUSD schools are on permit,” Alex Peck writes. “BHUSD is full of itself. This is a perfect example of why people think of Beverly Hills as being an area of rich snobs who think only of themselves. They are only

Fox Speaks About Pearl Harbor Day at Horace Mann

Former Beverly Hills Alumni Association President Bob Fox (*left*) spoke to eighth-grade students at Horace Mann Wednesday, Dec. 9 about his memories of Pearl Harbor Day, the 67th anniversary of which was celebrated this week.

Fox was an eighth-grade Horace Mann student at the time, and graduated in 1942. Fox gave the presentation alongside eighth-grade Horace Mann social studies teacher David Foldvary (*right*), who is a Beverly High Class of 2001 graduate.

"The kids are terrific," Fox said. "They're extremely well-mannered and very appreciative. It's a history in which they have no experience because their parents weren't even born when it happened. They're very interested in what effect it had on us when we were students and our families. It's very enjoyable, and I'm going to do it as long as they keep inviting me back."

"The board is responsible for making sure that the school district has enough money to operate, and with budget cuts, this is becoming increasingly more diffi-

cult," Charlene Kim writes. "So instead of citing how smarter non-permit students are compared to permit students or how much diversity they bring to the district, someone in this group needs to come up with a just solution that is going to address the issue of money."

Even community members, teachers and a board member have jumped into the Facebook two-way on the pages "Keep Permit Students in Beverly Hills" created by permit student Ethan Forman and "Keep Permits in the District!" created by Emily Wasserman.

"I...am the only member who will vote

to allow all permit kids to stay in our schools through high school graduation," wrote board member Myra Lurie. "The other members of the board do not agree with me and, as of Friday's meeting, appear ready to take away opportunity permits for the students currently in grades K-6, 8, and 9. Those currently in 7th grade could only stay for one more year. Please speak up — your voice is important and you can make a difference. Contact me for more information about how you can help."

The debate is far from fizzling.

The final verdict will be passed at the Jan. 12 board meeting, when the letter — and the weeding out of opportunity permits

effective June 30, 2010 — will be up for approval.

Beverly High Student Arrested for Attacking Teacher

determined that there was enough probable cause to take the juvenile into custody for battery on a school official," said Lt. Tony Lee from the Beverly Hills Police Department.

Lee said charges have yet to be filed, pending a review of the case by the district attorney, though the student was given a citation.

The misdemeanor offense holds a maximum punishment of up to a year in jail.

Maple Center Tutoring Program Saved by Beverly Hills Donors

Although the elimination of The Maple Counseling Center Tutoring Program for Beverly Hills students seemed likely, several supporters from the city have stepped up to keep the program active.

A total of \$10,000 was raised to save the program from the center's looming budget cuts. The Beverly Hills Rotary Foundation and Lee & Gail Silver contributed 10 percent of the donations, and two anonymous supporters donated the remaining 90 percent.

The tutoring program provides students from Beverly Hills' four elementary schools with additional assistance outside the classroom. It was established in 1972 as the counseling center's first program. Volunteer tutors — including senior citizens, college students, professionals and high school students — meet weekly on a one-on-one basis with their 70 students. The sessions are held in the city's elementary schools.

The annual cost for program staff, administrative support and materials is roughly \$23,000.

Strapped for funds, the counseling center has also eliminated all psychiatric services programs. Clients can no longer receive prescriptions for psychotropic medication. Next month, the center will cut a key staff position in the CRT Program, scale back on the psychology-intern training program. More services will be affected in the upcoming months.

"This is an extremely challenging time for all nonprofits, and we greatly appreciate the support of our local community to get us through this challenging time," said Marcy Kaplan, CEO of The Maple Counseling Center.

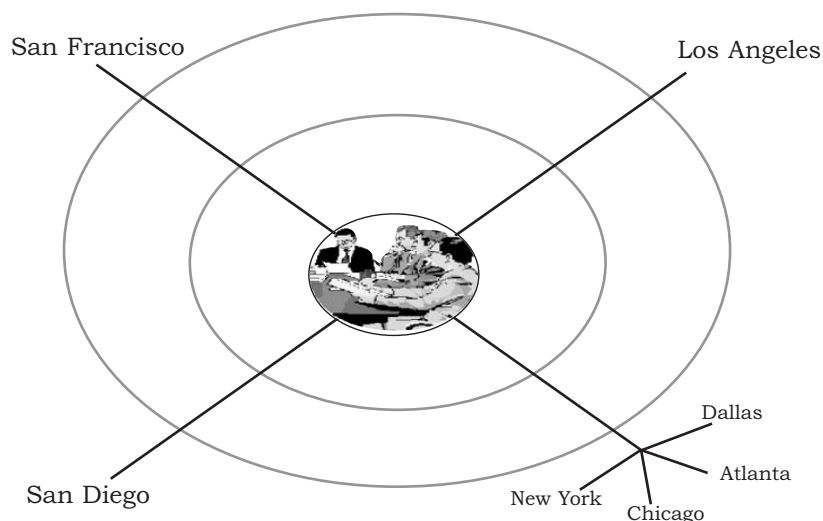

Even before the new city manager, **Jeff Kolin**, moves into his fourth floor offices at the end of January, the city's management team will have undergone some major changes.

First, there was the not so surprising resignation of Assistant City Manager **Katie Lichtig** who accepted the job of city manager of San Luis Obispo. Lichtig had been one of the top candidates for city manager of Culver City, losing, ironically, to **Mark Scott**, who had been CM of Beverly Hills before leaving for Spartanburg, South Carolina.

Departing City Manager **Rod Wood** has not filled the top assistant job, instead moving many of Lichtig's responsibilities to **Mahdi Aluzri**, who holds the title of assistant city manager for economic sustainability.

Aluzri returned to Beverly Hills after a two-year stint as deputy city manager of

Rancho Cucamonga. Before that, Aluzri had been director of building and safety, and first assistant and then director of planning in Beverly Hills. When the two departments were consolidated, he became the director of the new division, community development.

Two positions that may also be changed or even eliminated are those now held by Deputy City Manager **David Lightner** and Deputy City Manager **Cheryl Friedling**.

Lightner had been responsible for economic development. However, his background was in planning. He may be more involved on implementation of the general plan process, now under final review by the city council.

Friedling, and her public affairs department, may face the next round of cuts in funding, according to city hall sources. Friedling has been responsible for much

of the research councilmembers requested on everything from state and federal legislation, pending state ballot measures and liaisons with the city's lobbyists.

One public affairs/publicity staff member, **Cheryl Burnett**, has won the respect of reporters from both community newspapers. Her frequent press releases and press conferences and her availability as an information resource has vastly improved transparency in city government and increased public awareness of community programs.

However, one of the most important changes in city hall management will begin this month when **Steve Miller** retires and then returns next month as interim director of community services.

The Community Services Department is responsible for countless city divisions, programs and commissions including recreation and parks, human services, library and administrative support for programs, including special events, filming permits, culture and arts, and Team Beverly Hills. The department also services three city commissions: Recreation and Parks, Fine Arts and Human Relations.

Miller, who first came to Beverly Hills in January 1984 as superintendent of

recreation, became head of the department when **Rick Putnam** retired in 1992. He was appointed the first director of community services in 2004 when Wood reorganized and consolidated many city agencies.

The most logical successor to Miller would have been his longtime assistant **Pat Agnitch**, who had earned enormous respect in the department and the community, but who retired two years ago.

Now the choice is most likely to be a division director, **Steven Zoet** or City Librarian **Nancy Hunt-Coffey**.

Both are extremely well qualified and talented. Zoet has fronted much of the department's budget reports to the city council, and Hunt-Coffey has quickly led the library into award-winning status. Clearly, this is one position that should be promoted from within.

On a more personal note, I had the real pleasure of working with Miller when I was chair and member of the Recreation and Parks Commission and president of the Greystone Foundation. Always the unflappable professional, clear thinking even when there were major challenges in budget and proposed controversial improvements in the parks, few people will leave city government more highly regarded in the community and among his co-workers than Miller.

Miller and Agnitch turned many of my ideas and hopes for programs when I was the first commission chair into reality. Not one of these would ever have seen

the light of completion without their leadership: Beverly Hills Community Theatre, Beverly Hills Duplicate Bridge Club, Friends of Greystone, Youth Sports coordinating committee and our commission's involvement in state and regional associations. We even hosted a first ever meeting of a regional association of park and recreation commissioners in Beverly Hills at a dinner at La Cienega thanks to Miller. (**Lou Milkowski** and **Gloria Jennings** gave leadership to the first Community Theatre, which should be brought back, possibly through the Annenberg.)

Unfortunately, the department will also soon lose another star: **Bill Banks**, recreation and services manager. The always cheerful Banks, is highly respected in and out of city hall, and has been the public contact person at many city facilities, including La Cienega Park.

Our incoming city manager, Jeff Kolin, recently met with department heads and attended a city council priority setting session. He was careful not to offer any opinions or give any direction to the staff or at the staff-council meetings. First impression by city staff? Very positive.

Correction: The competition in Santa Rosa is not for assistant city manger but for the job of acting city manager. Thanks to our newspaper colleagues in that city for the update.

Incidentally, the priority setting meeting, is a real problem for members of the city council. They are given a certain number of markers and then asked to incrementally choose what is most important. Run out of markers, run out of goals. However, with budget "restraints" and staff cuts, it is almost impossible to act on each and every councilmember's program aspirations. Even the planning department, losing four key positions, has made it clear to city commissions that it does not have the ability to study every possible program or innovation.

Although Wood has made profound changes in the structure of city government, he also made an almost unprecedented entry into the public debate on the then Montage Beverly Hills proposal. At a time when the council vote was still in doubt, Wood gave a very detailed and comprehensive analysis of the proposed project that was extremely persuasive and analytical. Although it did not prevent a costly referendum, his supportive report resonated in the community and with the city council.

Not another report on the opportunity permit school program? It is just possible a solution could be found that would keep most of the students now in the schools through graduation. There are talks, now that some of the early emotions on the issue have played out, that might work.

A committee in support of permitting those in the program to continue has been formed and led by three former mayors: **Dr. Charles Aronberg**, **Maxwell Hillary Salter** and **Robert K. Tanenbaum**. The fourth member is **Dick**

Rosenzweig, former president of many civic groups including the Maple Counseling Center and the Chamber of Commerce. Many other former mayors and school board presidents, representing many diverse views on community and education issues, have also indicated their support for a viable compromise.

There also needs to be some clarification on our reports on the succession process and the various meetings held prior to the induction of the new officers. **Steven Fenton** was not responsible for the change of meeting dates. That was done at the request of board member **Myra Lurie** who, along with many city officials, planned to attend a dinner for Cong. **Howard Berman**. Thus, the Monday instead of Tuesday meeting. Several board members also told us that there was never any intent not to recognize outgoing board president **Nooshin Meshkaty** at the Monday meeting and that the early swearing in of newly-elected members had nothing to do with the succession discussions.

Interesting report on the contributions of permit parents to the schools — considerable. More important, the permit kids involvement in school programs and high level of academic achievements. They too are receiving support from resident classmates.

When Tiffany's and the Beverly Hilton join forces to entertain kids at a holiday program, expect a classy event. And it was.

They were entertained by high school carolers led by **Joel Pressman**. Among those attending were Tiffany's southwest regional vice president **Jonathan Brucker** and Oasis West Realty president **Ted Kahan**.

The Hilton's new pastry chef **Frانيا Mendivil** designed the ginger bread work. Frania is quite a coup for the hotel. She was among the "three elite chefs" who represented the United States at an international competition held in Tokyo earlier this year. Before coming to the Beverly Hilton, she had worked at many prestigious hotels including a Four Seasons, a St. Regis and hotels in Las Vegas. While the kids and hotel management was distracted, I swiped a small piece of the cake. Yes, I shared with my friend, health company exec **Sam Solakyan**, who was there, but not enough to bring home to the wife. That's my story, at least.

How many street associations does it take to promote business in Beverly Hills? Apparently, an infinite number.

The latest entry is the Canon Drive Association. Certainly, it has some able and dedicated members, and the street

has undergone some incredible changes, not the least of which is the Montage Beverly Hills. The hotel, combined with an explosion of eateries on North Canon, could benefit from promotion.

Obviously, the Canon Drive model is the Rodeo Drive Committee. But there is a difference. Rodeo Drive almost started from scratch, and led by the genius of **Fred Hayman** and others, it reinvented itself. It took planning and promotion to bring in all the prestigious retailers that have made the street world famous and added to our city's perceived image everywhere.

Canon Drive, although there are still many sites that could be improved, is mostly a successful gathering of restaurants. Need I add that the blank frontage of Rite Aide does little to enhance the beauty of the street. The same for the vacant former bookstores on their parking lot property.

There were valid reasons for the Rodeo committee to organize independently of the Chamber — the focus of the then-Chamber was far more on banks and real estate interests than retailing, and it did not have the expertise of the current Chamber staff — **Dan Walsh** and **Anita Zusman Eddy**.

The South Beverly Drive group stayed in the Chamber. Will other proposed organizations go independent, and there are numerous streets that are discussing formation? Is that in the city's or the business community's interests.

Inevitably, promotion-minded groups come to the city for support, as does Rodeo Drive. But the city still funds economic development through the Chamber and splintering could create costs and spreading of resources that are counter-productive. Not just cooperation, the city should insist that all groups coming for support of any kind work with and through the Chamber of Commerce.

My award for the worst commercial of the year: The AT&T spot with family members threatening each other with television remote controls. There is sufficient anger and violence in the world without a depiction of kids and their parents pointing remotes at each other in a menacing fashion.

Just one more reason to stick with Time Warner.

Norman boys' basketball team wins tournament finale.

The Beverly High boys' soccer team defeated St. Monica, 5-0, in a South Bay/Westside Tournament game at Nickoll Field last Thursday, recording its fourth shutout in four games this season, but coach Steve Rappaport wasn't fully satisfied.

"We were a little inconsistent because we really weren't being challenged," Rappaport said. "From a coach's perspective, I don't think our passing was as sharp as it's been so far this season. We were a little out of focus. It was just not a real competitive match. We just kind of skated through it."

The Normans led in shots, 24-6.

"With all the shots we had and a little better focus, it could have been a lot higher score," Rappaport said.

Josh Newman opened the scoring in the 14th minute, off an assist by Parsa Peykar. Mauricio Araujo scored his first goal of the season in the 26th minute with Elijah Lichtenberg being credited with the assist.

Jonas Brock scored his first goal of the season in the 59th minute off Newman's assist. Newman scored his second goal of the game and third of the season in the 68th minute off Taylor Offer's assist. Spencer Weissberg scored on a 40-yard free kick in the 71st minute.

Yonatan Ginsberg made two saves in the first half and Matthew Davidov four in the second, combining for their fourth shutout in four games, and drawing praise for their play from Rappaport.

Newman, midfielder Jonas Brock and defenders Shaya Noorian, Spencer Weissberg and Willy Woods also drew

praise from Rappaport.

Loyola 1, Beverly Hills 0

The Normans "played an exceptional quality game" against the third-ranked Division I team in the Southern California High School Soccer Coaches Association preseason poll, only to lose on a mistake by Ginsberg, Rappaport said.

"We controlled the flow of the game, probably 60-40 in possession," Rappaport said after Tuesday night's South Bay/Westside Tournament game at Nickoll Field. "We were disappointed with the outcome. We thought we deserved better. All it takes is one mistake against a team like that and you lose."

Rappaport annually schedules a game against the Cubs, perennially one of the best Division I teams to serve as a "measuring stick" to determine how good his team is.

What Rappaport called "probably the best game we played against Loyola," showed that "if we can play with Loyola and control the flow of the game, we can play with anybody."

"We know we have a lot of talent and a lot of potential now," Rappaport said. "It was a good sign for the season if we now get focused and take our lessons from the game."

Those lessons are to improve their play in the attacking third and on free kicks and corner kicks, Rappaport said.

"We didn't get enough people on the set pieces going into the box, put more pressure on it" Rappaport said. "We did-

n't execute those plays very well."

The Cubs (4-2) scored in the 32nd minute, as Beverly Hills (3-1-1) allowed its first goal of the season.

The Normans were out-shot, 12-7. Ginsberg made five saves in the first half and Davidov six in the second and made "four really nice plays," Rappaport said.

Beverly Hills had possession in the attacking third 29 times to 21 for Loyola, "which was an indication we were there," Rappaport said.

"We need to do better things with it when we get into the scoring zone," Rappaport said.

Rappaport said midfielder Mariano Gonzalez was his team's "outstanding player of the game for us," Offer was a "huge help to us" "off the bench," and praised the play of Brock, Caio Carvalho, Noorian, Weissberg and Woods.

The Normans have defeated the Cubs once and tied them twice since the school's boys' soccer program began in the 1973-74 season, according to Rappaport, the team's coach since the 1988-89 season.

What's Next?

The Normans are scheduled to play at Downey Warren today at 6 p.m. and play host to Lawndale Friday at 3 p.m. in non-league games.

Beverly Hills is scheduled to begin play in the South Torrance Tournament by facing South Torrance Monday at 11:30 a.m.

If the Normans win, they would face the Alta Loma-Placentia El Dorado winner in a championship bracket second-round game Monday at 7:30 p.m., while a loss would relegate them to a consolation bracket second-round game Monday at 6:10 p.m.

Beverly Hills is also scheduled to play tournament games Tuesday and Wednesday.

WHAT TO DO ABOUT THE PERMITS?

Board of Education seeks to phase out opportunity permits by June 30, but will they go quietly?

The longstanding debate on the fate of BHUSD permits hit its peak Friday after a 3-2 vote to eliminate opportunity permits was met with a boisterous crowd of permit parents who wouldn't accept "no more" for an answer.

Permit parents erupted in a slew of insults and name-calling after Board President Steven Fenton, Vice President Lisa Korbatov and member Brian Goldberg voted to give staff direction in drafting a letter notifying permit families of the non-renewal of opportunity permits effective June 30, 2010. Board members Myra Lurie and Jake Manaster dissented.

"The parents that were there were unruly, out of control and rude," Goldberg said. "Their behavior is not becoming of our community whatsoever, and it's unfortunate that a few bad apples are really poisoning the cart."

Goldberg said some permit parents equated the board to Hitler and Nazis, and were "physically getting in board members' faces."

"I was very impressed with the way in which Steven Fenton conducted the meeting," Goldberg said. "For the first time since I've been on the board, I felt like we had a president who knew how to control the meeting when it was a contentious issue. He tried to keep it as on-the-subject as possible. It was fair and firm."

Both Fenton and Korbatov were escorted to their cars by security after the meeting ended.

"I will not allow permit parents or anyone for that matter treat my colleagues with disrespect," Fenton said. "If people continue to be inappropriate and disrespectful to my colleagues, then I will continue to use the gavel, and they will be asked to leave."

The outrage of permit parents trickled down to BHUSD students, who created at least four Facebook pages in support of permit families.

The online tug-of-war turned violent after one Horace Mann student suggest-

ed in a comment bringing "machine guns and machetes" to the board's upcoming Jan. 12 meeting, when the letter for permit families is up for final approval.

"[Permit parents'] behavior is a direct reflection and correlation to the threat of physical violence from a student on a Facebook page," Goldberg said. "The fact that I had to be concerned of my

"I feel we need to have BHPD at our next meeting," Goldberg said. "I don't feel some of the permit parents can behave themselves and control themselves."

According to the proposal on the table for final approval, current opportunity permits will not be renewed next year, though seventh-grade students will be allowed to finish middle school, and

Goldberg said he encourages permit parents to move into Beverly Hills.

"It's a decision I made as a parent, and I gave up a lot to move into Beverly Hills," Goldberg said. "We're not building a wall around Beverly Hills. Everyone is welcome. I hope parents will do the right thing and move into Beverly Hills."

BHUSD is slated to become a basic-aid district this spring. Under this new format, the district will no longer receive funding for out-of-district students — which amounts to roughly \$6,500 per student — and will be funded instead by tax-paying residents.

The district spends a total of \$10,500 per student, once the Joint Powers Agreement and other support is factored in.

As future budget cuts hover over the district, the arguments of "keeping it within the community" and "putting residents first" echo the sentiments of many city residents, who are unwilling to pay for the education of non-resident students.

There are 4,891 students currently enrolled in BHUSD, 484 of which hold opportunity permits.

The four K-8 schools, as well as Beverly High, have had decreasing enrollment of permit students for the past three years, since the district hasn't issued new opportunity permits this year. K-8 schools have a permit enrollment of 368 students, down 28 students from last year. Beverly High is down 20 students from last year's 427 permit students.

Of the four K-8 schools, El Rodeo has the highest number of opportunity-permit students at 89, nearly double the number of Horace Mann's 46 opportunity students. Hawthorne has 48 opportunity permits, and Beverly Vista has 59.

Goldberg said even with the non-renewal of opportunity permits, it remains the largest permit category in the district.

two kids in the district is unconscionable. These parents should be ashamed of themselves, and this student should be ashamed of himself."

An emergency board meeting was called Sunday in conjunction with the Beverly Hills Police Department to discuss the security of board members and their children. (see the related brief on page 3)

Goldberg said the narrative surrounding the issue of permits needs to change.

"This isn't about what the board's doing to students," he said. "It's up to parents to make those decisions of what's important: their bigger home, cheaper rent or the kids' continuity of their education."

“The point [with the letter] is to give parents definitive notice to start planning for their children’s education,” Goldberg said. “Many if not most of the opportunity students’ home schools do better in many cases than our schools. So they’re being returned to very high-performing schools.”

Lurie, who voted against the proposal, had previously declared her support for all students currently enrolled in BHUSD to finish their education at Beverly High. During Friday’s meeting, Manaster voted alongside Lurie, citing the need for more information, time and discussion.

Rust said when the district accepted his children on permits five years ago, he was told by an unspecified person

“that once you’re in, you’re in.” Students could have earned magnet points had they not been accepted into BHUSD, and attended a magnet school, which they are unable to do now.

“It’s our position that the permit children should be allowed to matriculate,” Rust said. “I don’t think [board members] really have a firm idea about how little the cost savings will be, and if you weight the nominal cost savings versus the social and emotional impact on the children involved, I think it’s an easy decision to reach, and it’s contrary to the decision that they’re headed.”

If approved, the letter should be sent out soon after the Jan. 12 meeting.

Permit parent Marc Forman, who has spoken at many board meetings on the subject, declined to comment.

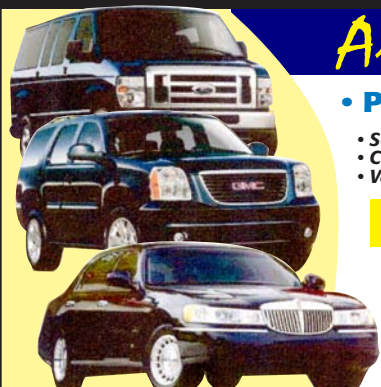

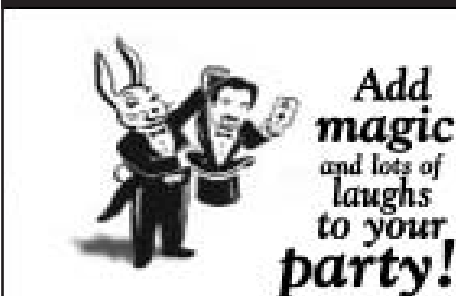
