Measure BH Passes, Barely; Law Firms Finance Campaign

Measure BH passed Tuesday night with 59.47 percent (2302 yes to 1569 no), as of press time.

Though passing, the measure received less than the 62 percent Measure Y received in 2016.

Campaign financial statements obtained from the Registrar of Voters related to Measure BH, a proposed school bond that appeared on Tuesday's election, indicate that law firms financed a majority of Measure BH. (See chart at left.)

The contribution report indicates that a majority of the donations came from BHUSD law firms that stand to benefit from its passage.

Of the \$57,835 total in monetary contributions, \$20,000 came from the Atkinson, Andelson, Loya Ruud & Romo and \$10,000 came from Kasowitz Benson Torres LLP law firms.

Expenditures include campaign marketing strategist Jon Gluck, of Gluck Marketing Group, who was paid three installments of \$5,000. Beverly Hills Weekly received \$1,125 and Patch, \$1,000. There were no listed payments to the Beverly Hills Courier.

Fewer than 10 school-aged parents donated to the campaign, in a district with an enrollment of approximately 4,000.

Council Approves Cartier Underground Vault

The City Council approved an encroachment permit request by Cartier to install a permanent underground vault within the sidewalk at Brighton Way adjacent to their store to access a private transformer within the basement of the proposed new building.

The request was necessary because the design of the new building and the parking configuration and accessibility from the adjacent alley relies greatly on whether this encroachment can be approved.

Therefore, the City Council considered, and ultimately decided that the requested encroachment is feasible.

Cartier is planning to demolish the current building at 370 North Rodeo Drive and replace it with a new three-story building at its current location at the corner of Rodeo Drive and Brighton Way.

The proposed location of the vault and the access hatch would require the removal and relocation of the two electric pedestals, vents and underground street light infrastructure and possible unknown utilities. The sidewalk will be temporarily closed for pedestrian use.

According to the staff report, the City requires encroachment permits for "structures or facilities associated with private property that encroach into streets, alleys, sidewalks, or other public property."

If the permit is ultimately approved, the applicant will enter into an encroachment permit agreement with the City in which the permittee agrees to "keep and maintain in good condition and repair all encroachments improvements and indemnify the City from and against any and all claims related to the encroachment improve-



ment."

All costs will be covered by Cartier.

The request will now be submitted to the Planning Commission for consideration.

A request to re-authorize a **Conditional Use Permit** previously granted by the Planning Commission to allow the continued operation of a convenience store use, and to permit the installation of two new hydrogen fuel dispensers associated with an existing vehicle fuel and service station use located at **9988 Wilshire Boulevard (Avis Union 76)**. The Applicant was previously granted a Conditional Use Permit (CUP), and is requesting modifications to the previous conditions of approval to allow:

- 24/7 Hours of Operation (currently restricted to hours of operation from 7:00 AM to 10:00 PM, daily)
- Alcohol Sales (currently prohibited from selling alcoholic beverages).

This project has been assessed in accordance with the authority and criteria contained in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.), the State CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Sections 15000 et seq.), and the environmental regulations of the City. Upon review, the project appears to qualify for a Class 1 Categorical Exemption (Existing Facilities) in accordance with the requirements of Section 15301 of the state CEQA Guidelines. This exemption is applicable to the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use. Accordingly, the Planning Commission will consider a recommendation to find the project exempt from the environmental review requirements of CEQA pursuant to Section 15301 (Existing Facilities).

Any interested person may attend the meeting and be heard or present written comments to the Commission. 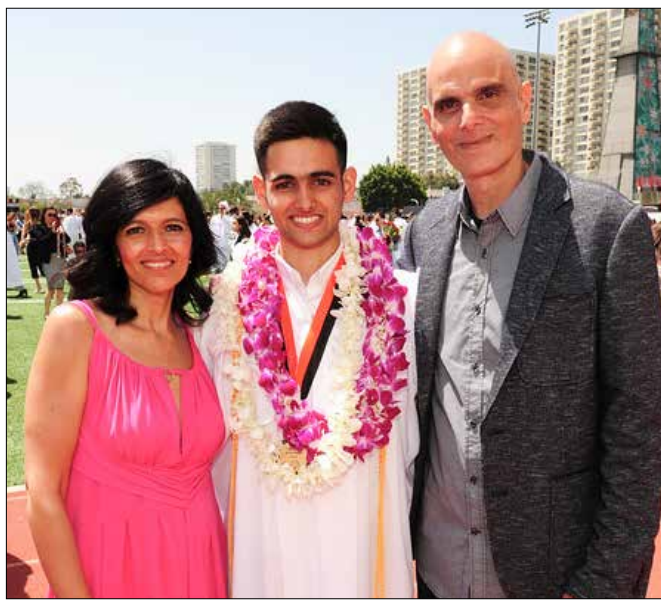

BOLD to Receive Additional Programming

The City's annual BOLD (Businesses Open Later Days) initiative will now receive additional programming, an additional program day on Thursdays, and discounted City parking on BOLD nights.

The decision follows a previous approval by the City Council on May 8 for a supplemental enhanced program for the Summer BOLD initiative. At that time the Council shared that in order to bolster the effectiveness of the program, a minimum of three days should be included.

The original program, presented by the CVB, RDC, Chamber and Next Beverly Hills, included a launch event on August 2, activities on Fridays and Saturdays from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., and a closing event on August 25.

The discounted parking program will be provided at City structures, with two-hour free parking for cars entering at 5:00 p.m. with a \$5 maximum on Thursday, Friday and Saturdays.

Last year the City offered discounted parking to encourage visitors to stay longer, however, in accounting for the City's parking structures, the revenue decline was 27 percent for a total loss of \$56,191.

Excluding City permit fees, staffing and direct costs, the City's partner organizations are projected to cover \$1,153,693 in program expenditures.

This covers highlights like dining offers, a Lyft promotion, street entertainment, a chalkboard wall, sketch artists, food trucks, a carnival on Rodeo, and more.

With the addition of Thursdays, the

overall costs of BOLD are now estimated at \$1,176,293.

City Allocates \$1M for Wallis Maintenance and Security

Although the City Council held two Budget Study Sessions to review the 2018-19 budget earlier this month, they

carved out some time during Tuesday's meeting to discuss follow-up questions regarding facilities related expenses and security assessments. One of these items included a request by the Wallis that the City to assume responsibility for the maintenance and security of the Wallis.

"As we knew long ago, generous donors and ticket sales do not fully support any performing arts center including ours," said Wallis Managing Director Rachel Fine during the request presentation.

In the presentation, Fine outlined specific reasons as to why the organization requested Council monetary support—the building itself, security and philosophy.

Because the City owns the building itself, Fine argued, it has a "vested interest" in the building's preservation. She also highlighted that support would allow the Wallis to continue with educational programs spanning from theater, to dance to film.

Fine added that the Council's financial support would also help with implementing "much-needed safeguards."

Councilmember Robert Wunderlich inquired about benchmarks for City support from comparable areas, to which Fine responded that Cerritos donated \$10 million to its art center. She said that City Councils generally fund about 30 to 40 percent, and that a \$1 million donation would cover nine percent of the Wallis' budget.

All five Councilmembers supported the request, with Councilmember John Mirisch requesting to formalize the mayor's position on the Wallis board.

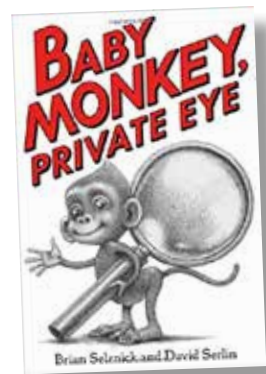
SUMMER READING

What are your neighbors reading?

Kids and Teens

Last month kicked off the start of the summer's Beverly Hills Library Summer Reading Club, which works to promote literary activities throughout the summer, including incentives for reaching reading goals.



Here's how it works: Children and teenagers can sign up for free online or at the library at any time up until the program ends in August. They are encouraged to read for 25 hours or more. The city provides children with log books to track their hours, and teenagers will rely on the honor system. After reaching a midpoint of 12.5 hours of reading, the older kids will receive a scratch-off card and the younger kids will receive an inflatable beach ball globe—in line with this year's theme of "Reading Takes You Anywhere."

Once they've read for 25 hours, every child or teenager gets to choose a free book to bring home. "After all, this is all about reading and popular choices and really just discovering how fun reading is," said Taniguchi.

Because there are many book options to choose from, Taniguchi provided some advice. For younger kids, she recommends Brian Selznick's "Baby Monkey, Private Eye," a hybrid of short simple mysteries with slapstick humor. "Brian Selznick reinvents the beginner reader. There's a lot of repetition but then there are detailed black and white drawings, and he brings in all kinds of cultural references" said Taniguchi, adding that the character of Baby Monkey solves a case each time using visual clues. "His books are great and they're innovative," said Taniguchi.

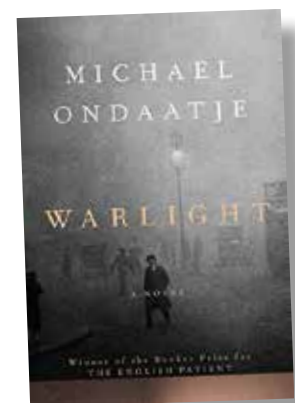
For older kids, Taniguchi recommends "Be Prepared" by Vera Brosgol, a coming-of-age story about the experience of going to summer school. "It's very funny," said Taniguchi.

Taniguchi also pointed out that this year marks the 20th anniversary of the mega-successful Harry Potter series' debut. In celebration, the American publisher is coming out with new books, which Taniguchi says the library will stock up on "as soon as we can get them," likely late June or early July.

Adults

Taniguchi also encourages adults to join the Summer Reading Club, noting that doing so provides a good example for children to do the same. Although the library does not track adults like it does the kids, they are still welcome to fill out reading logs. If adults write down three books they've read and/or listened to over the summer, they will receive coloring postcards—intended to help alleviate stress.

For adult readers, Taniguchi suggests "Warlight," a historical fiction novel written by Michael Ondaatje, who also wrote 1990's "The English Patient." "This new book is getting lots of love," said Taniguchi.



She also recommends longtime food journalist Michael Pollan's new book, "How to Change Your Mind: What the New Science of Psychedelics Teaches Us about Consciousness, Addiction, Depression, and Transcendence." The book, Taniguchi elaborates, is about the drugs and the science of psychedelics. "Whenever he has a book coming out we get multiple copies in mul-

"I very enthusiastically support this," said Councilmember Lili Bosse. "It is truly a community gem and the arts and culture is part of the heart and soul of our community. It is important to us that we maintain it and keep it secure."

Planning Commission Chair **LORI GREENE GORDON** is currently reading "A Pearl in the Storm" by Tori Murden McClure, the first woman and the first American to row across the Atlantic Ocean by herself.

Gordon was introduced to the story after her daughters heard McClure speak at a Junior League of Los Angeles event and were "blown away" by her address.

"While I'm not about to row across the Atlantic anytime soon, Ms. McClure's tale of perseverance - and the oceans some must travel to learn about themselves - is an incredible story and an exciting read," said Gordon.

Fine Art Commissioner **ALAN KAYE** is reading a "light, humorous" police thriller called "Blood Thirsty," written by Marshall Karp—a collaborator of James Patterson for the NYPD Red series of books.

"Can't wait for my download of Frenemies, the Epic Disruption of the Ad Business (and Everything Else)!" said Kaye.
