"City Council Candidate Forums"

The Chamber of Commerce remains at its same low of always favoring business and over-development over residents' interests and orchestrating unfair council candidate forums. At their forum, their favored candidates are in the first session and the other candidates are in the second session by which time most residents leave. The Chamber is the only organization at which all candidates are not heard at the same time. This year, unlike last time, the Chamber is claiming that their group selections were random, which is doubtful.

Our city, which pays the Chamber thousands of dollars every year, should review the Chamber's efficacy and lack of fairness, and require a revamp.

At the same time, our council majority, still miffed at not being able to push the massive Cheval Blanc onto residents, has reached a new low. They are interfering with the council candidate forums of the Municipal League and the Southwest Homeowners Association. They are still so mad about Cheval Blanc that you would think they lost something personally by the project not going through.

Their rationale for interfering is that two years ago, when past mayor Robert K. Tanenbaum, representing the Beverly Hills North Homeowners Association, acted like a prosecutor when we cross-examined [Vice Mayor] Lester Friedman about his campaign's unethical photos of himself with police and fire personnel in uniform, in violation of the intent of Government Code provisions. But the cross-examination was so lengthy and repetitive that the sentiments of residents went to Lester Friedman who had responded that he thought he was coming to a forum, not an inquisition.

Even though Tanenbaum's group will not be participating in a forum this year, the council majority is refusing to allow the Municipal League [forum to be held] and [has only allowed the] Southwest Homeowners to [go on] and [be] televised from city chambers [because] the organization [agreed to] provide [a] moderator.

This conduct as well as increasing the spending limit from \$80K to \$100K per candidate shows us that the council majority wants to provide all possible advantages to like-minded pro-overdevelopment candidates who are supported by developers and will be able to get their advertisements out without the assistance of candidate forums.

Public Works Commission to Discuss Development of Tiny Forest Model

The Public Works Commission is expected to discuss the development of a Tiny Forest model inspired landscape into the design for the Cabrillo Reservoir project, at their Thursday meeting.

During the evaluation of the draft Urban Forest Management Plan (UFMP), the Commission explored practical approaches to enhance the tree canopy within the City, and proposed the implementation of the "Tiny Forest" method as a means of maximizing canopy coverage in limited spaces. The Tiny Forest concept revolves around the notion that careful planning and management of a small site, characterized by an abundance of native species, can lead to the development of a naturalized canopy within a relatively brief timeframe.

The model is intended to offer an opportunity to enhance canopy cover, aligning with the objectives outlined in the City's Climate Action and Adaptation Plan, particularly in relation to Water and Ecosystem provisions. The plan incorporates references to both the Urban Forest Management Plan and the Tiny Forest Pilot initiative.

The pilot initiative is intended to contribute to a reduction of 37 metric tons of carbon dioxide (MTCO2e). This innovative model facilitates increased canopy gains in small areas, surpassing the capabilities of traditional urban forestry methods.

According to the staff report, the development of the Cabrillo reservoir site fits the Tiny Forest concept in the following ways:

- The site retains much of its native soil profile.
- The site is fenced and not accessible to the public.
- The current landscape on the site is sparse and has never presented as a cultured garden.
- Native plants thrive on the nearby hillsides.
- There is a water source established on site.
- The site is appropriate for a multi-dimensional planting.

Staff recommended the inclusion of the Tiny Forest model into the development of the Cabrillo project to include the following elements:

- Retention of the native soil profile.
- A landscape plan that provides a species-diverse tree dimensional canopy of native overstory trees, understory trees, and groundcovers.
- Sourcing of materials from local native plant nurseries.
- A maintenance plan that retains elements of the Forest model, without varying too much from fire clearance codes.

The City's Climate Plan recom-

mends that the outcomes of an initial Tiny Forest planting be reported back to the City Council for consideration of a broader implementation if the effort proves practical and environmentally beneficial.

Cultural and Heritage Commission to Discuss Criteria for Golden Shields

The Cultural and Heritage Commission was expected to discuss the existing criteria for the placement of Golden Shields within residential zones of the City, which occurred at their Wednesday meeting after the *Weekly*'s deadline.

The City Council requested that the Commission review the current criteria due to concerns regarding privacy for the owners of the subject properties or neighboring properties.

The Golden Shield program was established to honor places of cultural or historic merit. The intent of the program is to allow the community to celebrate these places, as marked by a bronze plaque with text.

One of the first Golden Shield Awards selected by the Cultural Heritage Commission and approved by the Council in Nov. of 2019, was the Doña Maria Rita Valdez de Villa Homestead (El Rancho Rodeo de las Aguas – 1838-1854), located at the northwest corner of Alpine Drive and Sunset Boulevard. In March of 2021, the Gershwin Residence previously located at 1019 Roxbury Drive was also selected for a Golden Shield.

Last year, 12 new Golden Shield Award nominees were considered by the Council. Ten of the nominees were granted the award and two sites in the residential zone were not selected due to potential future privacy concerns. The properties were the Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz house, located at 1000 North Roxbury Drive, and the Rachmaninoff Residence located at 610 North Elm Drive.

The Council has requested review of the criteria for selection of nominees and ways that broader public outreach could be undertaken if further sites in residential zones are to be considered.

The Commission previously discussed possible revisions at their July 12 meeting. A possible recommendation that was discussed was that if the homeowner does not agree to the Golden Shield, then there is no moving forward. If the homeowner and the two neighbors agree, then the three homes directly across the street will be notified. More than 50% of these homes need to agree to the shield. Basically, the three homes directly next to each other and one of the three homes across the street.

If approved, residents near the six homes will also be notified and given a chance to voice their concerns once it has been approved by four out of the six homes.

The criteria is expected to be brought back to the landmark subcommittee be-

Comanche Appears In Las Vegas Court To Face Murder Charge

Chance Comanche, the only Beverly High alum to play in the NBA, appeared in a Las Vegas courtroom for the first time Tuesday to face kidnapping and murder charges in connection to the strangulation death of a 23-year-old woman.

Comanche, who is a 2015 Beverly High graduate and a former NBA G League player with the Stockton Kings, will face open murder charges along with a 19-year-old woman, the Las Vegas Police Department announced. He is also being charged with kidnapping and conspiracy.

According to the Associated Press, Comanche appeared in Clark County Justice Court last Tuesday, with his hands shackled in front of him. He responded, "Yes, ma'am" when the judge asked if he understood the charges levied against him.

Las Vegas Police found the remains of Marayna Rodgers, a medical assistant from Washington state, in a desert area in Henderson, Nevada.

Twenty seven year old Comanche was apprehended by FBI agents on Dec. 15 in Sacramento County and was extradited to Nevada. According to *The Daily Mail*, Comanche plotted the murder during a basketball game, posed

In recent years, state laws regarding accessory dwelling units (ADUs) have been updated to encourage ADU production amid the state-declared housing crisis. These laws have generally changed to increase the number of ADUs and size of ADUs permitted byright (through a ministerial building permit process) on any residentially zoned property in all jurisdictions in California. A draft ordinance has been prepared to update the City of Beverly Hills Municipal Code (BHMC) regulations pertaining to ADUs, which is both consistent with state law ADU regulations, and reflects direction provided by the Planning Commission during public study session discussions that occurred in 2022 and 2023. The draft ordinance includes but is not limited to amendments to the BHMC that would:

- Repeal and replace the existing ADU code sections [BHMC §10-3-409; §10-3-603.5; §10-3-702.5; §10-3-803.5; §10-3-902.5; §10-3-1002.5; §10-3-1102.5] with a new Article 50 (Accessory Dwelling Units and Junior Accessory Dwelling Units) in Title 10, Chapter 3 (Zoning) of the BHMC to comprehensively regulate single- and multi-family ADU development consistent with state law, including local standards beyond state law minimums;
- Amend the Definitions section [BHMC §10-3-100];
- Add language to various residential development standard code sections. [BHMC $10-3-2413;\ -14;\ 10-3-2509.5;\ 10-3-2610.5;\ 10-3-302;\ 10-3-401;\ 10-3-701;\ 10-3-801;\ 10-3-901;\ 10-3-1001;\ 10-3-1101;\ 10-3-1202;\ 10-3-2406];$ and
- Create a discretionary review path for ADUs located on any residential or mixeduse property that do not conform to the proposed objective standards. [BHMC §10-3-3600].

Once the Planning Commission reviews the draft ordinance and provides a recommendation, the draft ordinance will be reviewed and adopted by the City Council at a future meeting.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The draft ordinance was assessed in accordance with the authority and criteria contained in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the State CEQA Guidelines, and the environmental regulations of the City. Pursuant to §15282(h) of the CEQA Guidelines and §21080.17 of the California Public Resources Code, the adoption of an ordinance regarding accessory dwelling units to implement the provisions of Government Code §65852.1 and §65852.2 is statutorily exempt from CEQA requirements. As a result, staff recommends the Planning Commission find that the draft ordinance is statutorily exempt from any further review under CEQA.

Commission to Discuss Historic Preservation Ordinance

The Cultural and Heritage Commission was expected to discuss potential amendments to portions of the Historic Preservation Ordinance at their Wednesday meeting, after the Weekly's deadline.

In previous Commission meetings, there has been an expressed interest among commissioners to reexamine certain definitions outlined in the code, specifically those of "person of great importance," "person of great local prominence," and "exceptional work." Presently, additional modifications are under consideration and will be presented to the Commission in a phased approach. These proposed changes will be reviewed by the Ordinance Ad-hoc Committee.

Proposed continued preliminary edits to the ordinance is as follows:

- Proposed modifications regarding the term: inventory of eligible properties.
- The Ad-hoc Committee also proposed modifications regarding the initiation of proceedings, initiation by property owners, initiation by commission of city council, preliminary evaluation, notice of preliminary hearing, and preliminary hearing.
- Hold period for permits to alter certain buildings that are 45 years of age and older.
- Certificate of Appropriateness: Proposed modifications regarding the types of work that may be approved pursuant to Administrative and Commission Review criteria.
- Appeals; Finality of Decisions Regarding Certificates of Appropriateness, Certificates of Economic Hardship, and Certificates of Ineligibility: Changes would add language regarding an appeal of a commission decision.
- Enforcement and Penalties: Modifying language regarding restoration penalties.

On April 12, the Cultural Heritage Commission deliberated on the initial phase of possible revisions proposed by the Ad-hoc Committee, focusing on sections such as Definitions, Cultural Heritage Commission Regulations, Continuing Education, and Landmark Designation Criteria. Subsequent modifications were presented to the Commission on Oct. 11, but due to time constraints, a discussion on these changes was deferred to Jan. 10.

The Ad-hoc Committee is expected to continue their review of the ordinance and bring forward additional potential changes over time at future hearings.

If the Commission wishes to request changes to the ordinance, the City Council would be informed to provide direction as to next steps.

Volunteers Needed for Beverly Hills Homeless Count

Seventy five volunteers from Beverly

Hills are needed to assist in the greater Los Angeles homeless count that will occur from Jan. 23 through 25.

"The annual Homeless Count is an important tool to understand where our neighbors experiencing homelessness are located and to know where services are needed most, so we can help as many people as possible come home," said Dr. Va Lecia Adams Kellum, Chief Executive Officer of LAHSA. "However, we can't do it alone. We need thousands of people to come out and count as many census tracts as possible so we can deliver accurate results this spring."

Traveling in small groups, volunteers will tally the number of homeless individuals, tents, vehicles, and make-shift shelters they see in their assigned census tract.

The count will begin on Tuesday, Jan. 23, in the San Fernando and San Gabriel valleys. Volunteers in East and West Los Angeles will count on Wednesday, Jan. 24. The count will wrap up Thursday, Jan. 25, in the Antelope Valley, Metro, and South Los Angeles.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development requires a biennial point-in-time count of homeless people. In 2016, LAHSA started hosting the Homeless Count annually to provide improved analysis regarding the trends.

In total, the agency seeks 8,000 vol-

This will be the second year that volunteers will use Esri's Homeless Point in Time App to tally the number of people and makeshift dwellings they find during. LAHSA is piloting geofencing within the Point in Time App to alert volunteers when they have moved outside their assigned census tract's boundaries.

The count includes the Youth Count and the Housing Inventory Count. LAHSA will conduct the Youth Count from Jan. 22 through 31 and the Housing Inventory Count on Jan. 24.

EIGHT QUESTIONS WITH THE CITY COUNCIL CANDIDATES - PART II

Why are you running for City Council?

Nooshin Meshkaty: I am running for City Council to bring a fresh perspective informed by my experience as a Technol-



ogy Engineer NASA, at JPL, and an activist in and for our community. My consistent community involvement has ranged PTA, from to service on Beverly Hills

Unified School District Board member and President, to sitting on various commissions to list a few.

I would love to lead Beverly Hills into the age of technology and to bring innovative ideas on how to better our community. More importantly, I would want to do so in such a way that is rooted in the voices of our residents and transparency of information; increases safety of our community members; and attracts new families and businesses to Beverly Hills.

Hamid Omrani: I have been fortunate to live, work, and raise a loving family in Beverly Hills.

I love Beverly Hills like my kids.For



many years I worked very hard and as a result of my job, I was a contractor and design builder. I worked and built more than Two h u n d r e d s projects and

projects and I talked with my clients regarding many issues including their problems in this city. I deal with Many departments of the city of Beverly hills and I know their problem in the management or budget or blames to their management. I worked with many of my client business owners and their employees and knew their problems. They were angry for paying too much money to the city and the city

I knew two hundred thousands of peo-

ple who work or visit Beverly Hills every day, how they are unhappy with the shortage of services.

According to the building zoning code, no one can open a fast food business. Where can employees buy food? They do not have too much money to go to restaurants. They have to eat their lunch in allies

When I am running for city council, I have a chance to express my feelings about Beverly Hills whether I will be the winner or loser. If I am elected I can do what residents want.

Sharon Persovski: I am running for office because we need a strong leader who finds creative solutions to complex problems. The City Council makes deci-



sions that will impact future generations of residents in the City. I will work very hard to make our community stronger, improve our business environment, bolster public

safety, embrace new technologies, develop urban infrastructure, encourage smart transportation and combat climate change. My experience with many aspects of city governance will inform my decision making. As a former commissioner and active participant on many city committees, I am well-prepared to provide the leadership that is needed.

Russell Stuart: I am running for City Council because I believe in proactive

How would you evaluate the job the current City Council is doing?

Meshkaty: The current City Council as have demonstrated dedication and have worked hard through unprecedented times including the pandemic. As representatives of our community they have done a good job recruiting an excellent City Manager, Police and Fire chiefs; all in efforts to maintain quality of life for our residents and businesses. Meanwhile Council needs to allow the professionals who they have hired to do what they are hired to do. The fact that the General Plan's Housing Element has been rejected several times by the state demonstrates that we need to improve our relationship with our higher governing offices, county, and state, and offer approaches with sufficient detail. Considering the lawsuits that the city has faced in the past, it's clear that departments need to have a better guideline to be trained in state and federal laws to help ensure the city is protected against lawsuits. Moreover, proactively complying with state and federal laws in a timely manner will be critical.

Omrani: Very bad, many times they approve a case that will be rejected, going to a special election and it will be rejected.

They will forget voters after the election. They do not talk or meet any of them.

Many of them do not work in the city and only sleep over. They have not any experience in management or to be in the city.

(For example Mayor Gold is MD. He is everyday all day in surgery room for thirty years. He has not any employee, doing any contract to sign, no meeting with anyone there. How can he deals with many top lawyers in Cheval Blanc?)

They elect only people who help them in their campaigns who have not any profession or experience for that commission, (a psychiatrist for traffic commision_ then commision to other commission the same story.)

Persovski: They are all working hard for the betterment of the residents of Beverly Hills, but I also believe the current Council needs to work more on being transparent in making decisions. When difficult decisions need to be taken, they need to listen to the opinions of residents -- all residents, and not just a select few. They need to be more approachable.

The Council needs to rely more on the knowledge of the people that serve on city commissions, many of whom have highly-focused professional experience on the topics of their expertise. This is critical when it comes time to address difficult issues.

Stuart: The current City Council has made commendable efforts in certain areas but there's always room for improvement, particularly in terms of transpar-

ency and engaging with community concerns more directly. I intend to bring a fresh perspective to these areas.

Did you support the Cheval Blanc project?

Meshkaty: Yes. Ultimately, I believe the benefits of this project for our community outweighed the cost. Was it perfect, no. With that said, I saw demonstrated effort to improve and respond to concerns that were vocalized. In fact, when I was informed about the project, I expressed my own concerns about the parking and traffic impacts in the area. My concerns were heard, and adjustments were made to the plans. This included: increases to the number of guest and visitor parking spaces; a shift to the access point of the hotel to reduce the overflow of traffic to the street; and the offering of public access to select restaurants on property. Of course as a Councilmember, I would promote better communication channels with our residents to ensure they understand overall plans and have enough opportunity to voice concerns and participate in solutions well before a plan is approved.

Omrani: No. They approved that without knowing zoning codes.

Applicants can build 80,000 square feet, they increase it to 210,000 square feet, why? They bought seven lots and paid \$750,000,000. They have to buy 14 more lots and pay one and a half billion dollars to build +210,000 S.F.- why did it without any benefit for the city? They depend on the traffic commissioner who does not have any knowledge in traffic, or Planning Commission who can not read the plans.

Persovski: No, I did not. Beverly Hills should encourage development, but it has to be the right project for the right place and time. This particular project would have produced very disruptive traffic issues, located as it was at the intersection of two very narrow streets in a busy area. It would have created additional stresses related to noise, public safety and parking. We can have a luxury hotel -- just not where they proposed it.

Stuart: My stance on the Cheval Blanc project was a carefully considered one. Recognizing its potential benefits for Beverly Hills, such as economic growth and modernization, I did lean towards support. However, I was equally mindful of the concerns surrounding changes to our city's skyline and the potential for increased traffic. My decision to support was not taken lightly; it was made with a view towards the future of our city while respecting the concerns of our long-standing residents.

The Housing Element has been rejected for a third time. What do you propose should be done about this?

Meshkaty: The General Plan's Housing Element was rejected four times. Since there is a lawsuit in place, we only have access to a limited amount of information. Our rapport with state and county level officials is seemingly strained.

For that reason, our City must do all its due diligence when submitting our plans, with appropriate detail and through the proper channels of communication with all stakeholders. It is important that all details are covered and if our City is being held to a different standard than other cities such as Atherton, La Canada or other small historic cities, we must take the appropriate channels to dispute the assessment. If we are unable to secure a certified housing element, we may get a mandate to discard all our residential and mixed used zones and builders would be able to get their building permits approved by the state, avoiding local standards that preserve the historic charm of our City, and approving changes that may not be in the benefit of our residents and business owners.

Omrani: Housing is a very serious misfortunate statewide situation that is put on local municipalities by the state of California as a result of poor planning and diminished foresight. Nevertheless, this major challenge is here upon us.

The proposed projects were not close to the metro station. projects were in narrow streets.

Persovski: First, I think it is really embarrassing that a city like Beverly Hills, which stands out as an example in so many ways, can not get their Housing Element right after three attempts. Clearly, there is a lack of understanding with regard to housing policies and its place in overall city planning.

We must review everything that has been submitted, including the elements that have been approved and those that must be changed.

Second, select a group of professionals that speak the language of development: architects, design planners, urban designers, other professionals with experience in strategic planning and design. Lawyers are a critical part of the process, but subject matter experts need to be included too.

Stuart: The repeated rejection of Beverly Hills' housing element by the state presents a critical opportunity to reassess our approach to housing development. It's essential to find a balance between meeting state housing mandates and preserving the unique character of our community. My focus would be on fostering constructive dialogue with the state, while ensuring any housing strategy reflects the needs and values of Beverly Hills residents. Collaborative, innovative solutions are needed to address this complex issue, aligning with state requirements without compromising our city's identity.

The Wilshire/La Cienega Metro station is scheduled to open next year. How do you plan to address concerns about safety around the station?

Meshkaty: As a resident who completed and graduated from the Police Citizens Academy and as a community member who has been closely following Metro and concerns surrounding it, I have been in communication with com-

munity members, some council members and our Police Department. This has help me understand the issues and the best way forward for the collective safety of our City and our community at large—both our residents and our businesses. I would encourage assignment of a Beverly Hills Metro Police Unit, to stations in the City. I would advocate using technology to monitor the stations in the city, also bolster coordination with our neighboring cities to expand the security enhancements. The use of artificial intelligence and facial recognition software is only as strong as the analytical expertise of the monitoring unit. We must invest in the tech, the skills, and appropriately resourced PD units.

Omrani: Police presence and reliable surveillance present considerable possibilities for keeping our community safe. In addition to a quality surveillance system, it is imperative to allocate sufficient resources for a police precinct in the area.

Persovski: We must have a strong presence of police officers in the new Metro stations, in addition to cameras, drones and other technologies. Crime prevention and public safety begin with increased vigilance.

Stuart: Safety at and around the new station is paramount. The number one mission is an enhanced police presence, including the addition of a new sub-station... also improved lighting, cameras and community outreach programs to ensure the station's integration enhances both the utility and safety of the area.

How would you evaluate the job City Manager Nancy Hunt-Coffey is doing?

Meshkaty: As I am not a sitting Councilmember nor a City employee, I cannot fully speak to the performance of any city staff. What I can speak to is my direct experience as a member of the community and former city commissioner - when interacting with City Manager, Nancy Hunt-Coffey. My questions and requests have always been answered in a timely manner, thoroughly, and respectfully. I am grateful to the dedicated services that our City Manager and city staff have been providing.

Our City Manager is meant to manage the day to day operations of the City but it is not in a silo. Our City Council is meant to give general direction in line with the goals for a better Beverly Hills. At times, however, we have seen City Council over direct course of action, which may result in underutilizing the skill set of our City staff.

Omrani: As a new City manager, it would be more than reasonable for any capable City Manager to first improve any existing issues.

There are many shortcomings and oversights that our City has been encountering, Ms. Hunt could use more support offered by knowledgeable city staff, and an engaged council with a deep understanding of the community's needs which would willingly and effectively bring new solutions to old problems. Our community deserves a proactive and result-oriented City Council, and City

manager more than ever before.

Persovski: I have known Nancy for a long time, working with her on the Art Centennial (2014), and other cultural programs that were presented to the Art Commission while she was the Community Services Director. Nancy was always very helpful in explaining the process of navigation through City government processes and approvals.

If she didn't know the answer, she was always prompt to find out the right information. I found Nancy to be a hard working person that has ample experience and understanding of the entire scope of City issues, with strong management skills.

Stuart: Nancy Hunt-Coffey's leadership as City Manager has been exemplary, contributing significantly to our city's progress. I am eager to work closely with her, aligning our efforts to ensure that her strategies not only resonate with the City Council's vision but also effectively address the needs of our community. My role on the council will be to foster a collaborative relationship that underscores our shared commitment to Beverly Hills' continued growth and well-being.

What would you say is the biggest issue facing the City now?

Meshkaty: There are multiple issues facing our city that concern the community. However, the City's safety and security is the top priority for its residents and businesses. This is especially true given the current landscape of surge in crime, surge in hate crimes (especially on places of worship), and the soon to be opening Metro stations within Beverly Hill, when there is suggested evidence that metro access contributes to the mobility of and distribution of crime.

As I mentioned before, a dedicated Beverly Hills Metro PD Unit, technology enhancements (AI software and hardware like High Res cameras), and dedicated analytics expertise and support to monitor the traffic will be critical.

Another area of equal concern is the Builder's Remedy that is pushing hard since we have not been able to secure a certified Housing Element. Establishing a coherent, sufficiently detailed plan that would be agreeable by the state to remedy the issue as soon as possible before jeopardizing the neighborhood conformity.

Lastly, our city's infrastructure is outdated and in need of immediate attention. This includes everything from our electric grid, to alternative energy, water conservation, sewer system, fiber to the premise and technology enhancement to allow fast wireless access throughout the city.

Omrani: City will have 10,000 new residents including 5,000 low income per state mandate. As a result of their incomes they have not too much income or business to create income for the city.

But the city has to pay 30% more for expenses including the police. The city has to deal with 30% more traffic- crime including the Metro problem. Average of education in Beverly Hills is a Master 's degree, which will reduce to a college

degree. Beverly Hills known as a rich city including Rodeo Dr. Are the new resident afford to buy in Beverly Hills? Is there a possibility, some residents leave the city? Can the city government, including the City Council, resolve the problem?

HOW BEVERLY HILLS CAN INCREASE THE INCOME?

Persovski: Public safety is a concern that needs to be improved with more presence of police officers, so people can feel more secure in the City. Ask any resident -- they are all concerned about having a City where it is safe for families and businesses. This issue is a priority.

A related issue, the rise of anti-Semitism, is concerning as well. We must do more to protect our community. This means more safety measures around synagogues, schools, and surrounding areas.

Housing is another large issue. We must determine how we are going to allocate the 3104 units required by the State of California.

Addressing climate change is also important. We must lead the way in reducing gas emissions, promoting clean energy and transportation, water conservation, and waste management.

Stuart: The paramount concern for Beverly Hills is undoubtedly public safety. In recent years, our community has faced unprecedented challenges, making the strengthening of our police and fire departments more crucial than ever. With new California laws in 2024 impacting citizen personal protection, my campaign is firmly centered on bolstering our public safety infrastructure. A robust police force and a well-equipped fire department are essential to ensuring the security and well-being of our residents. As a council member, I vow to prioritize and champion these critical services, safeguarding the safety and peace of our beloved city.

What one thing do you want the voters to know about you before they cast their ballot?

Meshkaty: I have lived in this City more than ²/₃ of my life. I graduated from Beverly Hills High School, I raised my family here in Beverly Hills and started my efforts in public and community service as soon as my daughter (my firstborn) started kindergarten at El Rodeo. I have worked diligently to successfully advocate for my family and our community for years. I know what it is to roll up my sleeves and get the job donewhether graduating high school as an English-second language learner; or bagging groceries and teaching classes to pay for college; or navigating a successful career in the male-dominated field of engineering while also being a mother of three and ensuring my children received a quality public education, were fed and felt safe in our community; or training for the marathon seven times; or surviving breast cancer while maintaining the normalcy of life. I'm not a politician, I'm a fierce advocate of community voices. I'm not one to give up easily.

Omrani: I am a person who was in the

city for 40 years and worked six days, 10 hours working in the city, drives, talking to residents and business owners and their employees and who visited Beverly Hills. Worked as an applicant for city customers fives days a week for 40 years. Who brings million dollars investment in the construction industry and paid millions of dollars to the city for building

permits by clients. Who built a part of the city as his dream. Loves city like his kid.

Persovski: It is important to choose a strong leader with city government experience. I have that experience, and I pledge to be approachable and a good listener.

I strive for excellence in what I do, and I always go the extra mile. I am disci-

plined, and have a history of doing things right. I will listen to residents and use my judgment making fair, informed, and thoughtful decisions.

Stuart: Before casting your ballot, know that my commitment goes beyond just words; it's a pledge to 'Protect Our Future'. This isn't only about enhancing public safety, crucial as that is. It's about

creating a secure environment for our children, bolstering our local businesses, and safeguarding the financial robustness of Beverly Hills. My vision encompasses a holistic approach to safety and prosperity, ensuring a future where our community thrives in every aspect. Your vote for me is a vote for a secure, prosperous, and resilient Beverly Hills.
