

Chamber Holds City Council Candidate Forum

The Chamber of Commerce hosted a City Council Candidate Forum on Jan. 11 in an effort to have the community understand the candidates vision for Beverly Hills as they vie for the two open seats.

The forum was split up into two separate parts, with five candidates each.

The first question was asked in two parts in regard to crime in Beverly Hills. The moderator asked what crime reduction policies the candidate may propose if elected and their stance on Los Angeles County District Attorney George Gascon.

Nooshin Meshkaty said that the increase in crime was a direct result of policies put forward by Gascon. However, she did state that the police department was doing a great job at responding to crime, especially with the Real Time Watch Center. She said that it is ultimately up to the voters as the city has already done all that it can as they are at the behest of his policies.

Craig Corman said that crime is a regional problem and that the City Council can only focus on its own city limits. He said that the best policy is one that deters crime and also praised the police department for the great job they have done catching criminals. But he noted that that is only the first part of the equation and that the second part was making sure that those convicted were held accountable for their actions.

Tiffany Davis agreed that Gascon has contributed to a major increase in crime and stated several ways the city can help combat it. One way is to have private security engage in more foot patrol, as well as more police officers in general.

Alissa Roston also said that she does not support Gascon and said an effective way to deter crime was to make it clear that the City will arrest suspects and that it will help if more officers were patrolling and seen by the public. She also said that salary and benefits are another way that could attract qualified police officers.

Mary Wells emphasized the increasing concern from residents in regards to public safety and anti-Semitism and that she would continue to support the police department and its technology, such as drones. She also stated how an important factor in combating crime was electing a district attorney that is harder on crime. She also suggested that having more armed Guard presence in the triangle may help.

The next question asked candidates their current viewpoint on the business climate in Beverly Hills.

"I think it's important that we, especially in today's retail environment, which is driven by ecommerce, that we have some kind of an identity and the identity can be best driven by hav-

ing more unique stores that are homegrown," Corman said. "If we enter into some profit sharing arrangement with some up and coming restaurants, we can hope to bring in younger and more interesting restaurants."

Davis focused on the struggling mom and pop shops and their frustration with the lack of support, as well as an increase in rent

"We need to act as a community, but also as a council to come to the table and really talk to the landowners and all stakeholders about something that makes sense so that we can protect those mom and pop shops," Davis said. "I agree 100% that there needs to be a better vision. I don't know that we have a clear vision as to what we really want Beverly Hills to look like. We talk about what it used to look like and we want something that kind of resembles that. But we really need to dig deep and figure out what that means now going forward."

Roston said that the City needs to do better to ensure that it is doing everything it can at the council level, the community level and the chamber level to support all of the businesses in the community.

"It's very difficult in our city to open a new business and even to keep on going because of the permit process and what goes into planning. We have to go through multiple commissions. When I talk to people [when] I go out to Larchmont or Silver Lake or [other cities], and I want to know why aren't [they] coming to Beverly Hills - oftentimes because it's just too hard. I think we need to do an operational review of the Planning Department to see what we can do to ease the entry into our city, not to take away oversight, but to make it easier for businesses to come and to stay," Roston said. "It shouldn't require months of oversight. It shouldn't require huge permits to make that happen. We want our city to look refreshed and oftentimes, to be honest, it doesn't."

Wells agreed that there is a lot more that the City needs to do and that it begins with having a vision for what the city should look like.

"Beverly Hills has a reputation for being difficult to bring your business to Beverly Hills. That brings up our planning department and how do we make that process for getting permits and inspections easier for our businesses? We have to look at our planning department and see what resources do they need or do we need to restructure how we support businesses coming in?" Wells said.

Meshkaty said that the City needs to focus on elevating its community and businesses by enhancing the local experience. She also said that effective communication is crucial for connecting the community with businesses.

"We have apps in the city that are not complete. We need to make our apps complete so that we can have interactive experiences using the technology, allowing our tourists and our community members to understand where everything is and where everything is happening," Meshkaty said. "We need to stay ahead of the curve. We need to make sure we are always at the leading edge of technology. We should not be losing businesses to our nearby shopping centers. We need to be able to give that feeling of walking in our city, dine in our city, spend money in our city, shopping in our city. We have to give that feeling to our community."

The third question asked whether candidates will accept funding from any labor unions.

Davis said her primary source of funding is friends, family, and residents.

Roston said her donations come from friends, family, and people in the community. She also said her donations were anywhere from \$5 and up to \$500.

Wells said she is self-funded and also accepts donations from the community.

Meshakty said she also has accepted donations anywhere from \$5 and up to \$500

Corman said he never wishes to be in a position where he has to recuse himself due to accepting contributions from a developer. He is the only candidate that has not accepted the campaign limit, which means he may only accept contributions of \$125.

All five candidates said they would not accept any funding from any labor union.

All candidates ultimately supported the Cheval Blanc project.

Unfortunately, due to technical difficulties the Chamber experienced at the time of the forum, the *Weekly* was unable to cover the other candidates in the last half.

New Ad Campaign Calls on City to Expand Abortion Access

The National Institute for Reproductive Health and the Los Angeles Abortion Support Collective began an ad campaign in Los Angeles County Jan. 11, calling on the public to help expand access to abortion.

Specifically, the campaign is focusing on DuPont Clinic, an abortion provider that planned to open a clinic in Beverly Hills.

DuPont previously filed a suit against Beverly Hills and the landlord Douglas Emmett, Inc., alleging Douglas Emmett colluded with the City to delay DuPont's opening and then attempted to "baselessly" rescind DuPont's lease.

"The right to abortion only exists if every person can meaningfully access abortion care at any point during pregnancy. Elected leaders in California cannot claim to be pro-abortion champions while remaining silent and complicit when abortion clinics are blocked from opening. We call on the city of Beverly Hills to expand access to Californians and any person seeking care in this critical access state," Vice President of Communications Bonyen Lee-Gilmore said.

The clinic claims that City officials met with pro life activists, shared Du-Pont's private information, and "directly and intentionally" interfered with its permits. City Officials named in the suit



include Mayor Julian Gold, City Manager Nancy Hunt-Coffey, Deputy City Manager Keith Sterling, and City Attorney Larry Wiener.

DuPont Clinic offers elective abortions during the third trimester through 31 weeks and six days gestation. Prolife activists previously petitioned the City Council last year in an effort to prevent DuPont from opening.

"Douglas Emmett's shameful cowardice in the face of protestors and politics has given DuPont no choice but to resort to legal action," the complaint states.

Next month, communities in LA County will see five billboards, a weeklong mobile billboard truck, sidewalk decals and digital ads urging people to take action.

According to the complaint, On June 30, 2022, DuPont sent a Letter of Intent to Douglas Emmett summarizing its offer to rent the Premises. The Letter identified the nature of the proposed use of the building as follows: "Use: The Dupont Clinic is a private referral center for all-trimester abortion care and ultrasound-guided procedures, primarily for management of abnormal and high-risk pregnancies."

The City received correspondence on June 12 from the attorney for the landlord at the property notifying them that DuPont Clinic would no longer be tak-

lord's notice of rescission of the lease. DoPont states that the lease does not give the landlord the right to issue a rescission notice. The letter did not attempt to offer a return for the benefits conferred by DuPont, according to the complaint.

"The June 12 Letter did not properly rescind the lease – it simply sets forth Douglas Emmett's improper grounds for breaching the ease," the complaint states

The clinic would have opened at 8920 Wilshire Blvd.

Planning Commission to Discuss ADU Ordinance

At its Jan. 25 meeting, the Planning Commission is expected to discuss a draft ordinance on accessory dwelling unit (ADU) regulations in single family residential areas.

In recent years, state laws regarding ADUs have been updated to encourage production amid the state-declared housing crisis. These laws have generally changed to increase the number and size of ADUs permitted by-right on any residentially zoned property in all jurisdictions. A draft ordinance has been prepared to update the Municipal Code.

On March 10, 2022, the Planning Commission received a report that provided an overview of current regulations

and indicated general support for introducing more flexible regulations into the ordinance, and directed staff to further engage with the community.

On Aug. 10, 2022 a

ing occupancy and the lease had been rescinded, according to Deputy City Manager Keith Sterling.

According to the complaint, in late April 2023, the City asked Douglas Emmett for a meeting to discuss DuPont's permits. During the meeting, DuPont believes City officials directly asked Douglas Emmett representatives if there was any way to avoid the opening of the clinic. Douglas Emmett informed the City that it had already signed the lease.

"Emmett representatives later told Du-Pont that the City officials were visibly upset upon learning that Douglas Emmett could not simply prevent DuPont from opening its clinic on the premises. In other words, the City had already decided that it did not want DuPont to open its clinic and in April 2023 was acting to prevent it from happening. The City hoped that Douglas Emmett would do their dirty work," the complaint further alleges.

DoPont is alleging the City purposely delayed issued permits to the clinic, which resulted in "significant time and money and pushed back DuPont's opening date."

On June 12, DuPont received the land-

community meeting on ADUs was held in order to receive feedback about appropriate regulations to facilitate the development of ADUs. The feedback received generally focused on the following:

- A strong interest to develop ADUs that exceed 16' in height, particularly south of Santa Monica Boulevard, in order to accommodate a two-story structure:
- Support for greater height to build above garage structures;
- Request for flexibility on landscape requirements in the front yard to be able to accommodate parking in that location:
- Concerns about privacy, noise, and shade; and questions about fees, property assessment implications, and permit parking.

As part of the Housing Element process, the City conducted an online survey for feedback on developing ADUs. Respondents indicated that they would be interested in developing an ADU on their property in order to gain additional space and for property value, and were mostly likely to rent it to a family mem-

ber at reduced or no rent, or a tenant at market rate, or use it at a guest house.

The State legislature also adopted ad-

ditional regulations that cities must allow for the development of ADUs. The following changes are in effect: The minimum height that cities must allow is 16' in any area. However, if the lot is located within a half mile walking distance of a major transit stop, the minimum height requirement is 18'.

The draft ordinance includes the following amendments to the municipal code that would:

- Repeal and replace the existing ADU code with a new Article to comprehensively regulate single- and multi-family ADU development consistent with state law, including local standards beyond state law minimums;
- Add language to various residential development standard code sections.
- Create a discretionary review path for ADUs located on any residential or mixed-use property that does not conform to the proposed objective standards.


Once the Planning Commission provides a recommendation, the draft ordinance will be reviewed by the City Council at a future meeting.

City Installing HAWK Signals

The City will soon complete construction of its first pedestrian hybrid beacon or "HAWK" signal at the intersection of Wilshire Boulevard and South Palm Drive as part of the grant-funded pedestrian crossings project. This device is intended to make it safer and easier for pedestrians to cross the street without impeding traffic.

Unlike traditional traffic sig-

nals, HAWK signals only light up when a pedestrian triggers the crossing button. The HAWK signal op-

City to Begin Installing Six Month Traffic Calming Demonstration

The installation for a six month demonstration of traffic calming devices on Clifton Way between Robertson and La Cienega Boulevards as part of the Clifton-Le Doux Corridor Mobility Study, is set to begin this month.

This project is exploring the feasibility of a range of traffic calming and active mobility enhancement options for consideration by the community to implement the Complete Streets Plan and Action Plan.

To solicit public feedback, the City

organized a "pop-up" event on Saturday, March 25, 2023 from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM to demonstrate what traffic calming features requested by the community could look and feel like on the study corridor. Using temporary materials, the City installed a traffic circle at the intersection of Clifton Way/Le Doux Road and curb extensions at Clifton Way/Stanley Drive, and invited the community to test the infrastructure and communicate their preferences to staff. The majority of participants indicated support for traffic calming in the area.

As a follow-up to the pop-up event, the City distributed an online survey to obtain more specific feedback from the community. One of the questions asked if respondents would support a longer term demonstration of traffic calming on Clifton Way, between Robertson and La Cienega Boulevards, as some attendees of the pop-up event suggested it would be helpful to experience the demonstration during weekday peak hours. Respondents overwhelmingly supported a six month term.

City staff previously installed a traffic circle at Clifton Way/Le Doux Road and curb extensions at Clifton Way/Stanley Drive and invited the community and emergency responders to test the infrastructure.

Residents confirmed that vehicles use Clifton Way and Le Doux Road to bypass arterial streets, leading to speeding and congestion during peak hours, according to the staff report. Most residents thought that the calming options would help address these issues. Generally, residents liked the curb extensions because they would narrow the roadway and slower speeds.

Several residents expressed concerns that the devices, especially traffic circles, may worsen congestion by limiting the number of vehicles moving through an intersection during peak hours.

Representatives from the Fire Department reported no issues around the circle due to the 20-foot travel lane widths on either side and were able to make a complete U-turn. They also noted that in the event of an emergency, they would travel on Wilshire Boulevard or Burton

City staff proposed the segment of Clifton Way between Robertson and La Cienega Boulevards because it includes multiple blocks between two major streets that are likely to contribute to speeding cut-through traffic.

The draft demonstration design includes traffic circles at Clifton Way/ Arnaz Drive and Clifton Way/Le Doux Road. It also includes curb extensions at Clifton Way/Hamel Drive, Clifton Way/ Willaman Drive, Clifton Way/Carson

The Council of the City of Beverly Hills, at its regular meeting to be held on Tuesday, February 6, 2024, at 7:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, 455 N. Rexford Drive, Beverly Hills, CA 90210, will hold a public hearing to consider:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING TITLE 10, CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 12 OF BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE TO ALLOW FOR THE EXPANSION OF EXISTING RESTAURANT USES AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW RESTAURANT USES WITH ROOFTOP OUTDOOR DINING FOR EXISTING LEGALLY NONCONFORMING HOTELS LOCATED IN THE R-4 MULTIPLE RESIDENTIAL ZONE

The proposed Ordinance would amend the Section 10-3-1207 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code to allow for the expansion of bar and dining areas of an existing ground floor hotel restaurant and the establishment of new restaurant uses with outdoor dining and bar areas that are open to the public on the rooftop of existing legally nonconforming hotels located in the City's R-4, Multiple Residential Zone with established rooftop uses. The expansion and establishment of such restaurant uses would require the issuance of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) by the Planning Commission. The proposed Ordinance is related to a request for amendments to existing CUP, Development Plan Review (DPR), and Extended Hours Permit (EHP) approvals to allow continued operation of existing restaurant and rooftop uses at the L'Ermitage Hotel, located at 9291 Burton Way (the "project site"), as well as to allow the expansion of the dining and area within the ground floor restaurant and establishment of a new rooftop restaurant with outdoor dining and bar area. The Planning Commission considered this ordinance at its meeting on December 14, 2023, at which time it recommended that the City Council adopt the amendments.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This project has been assessed in accordance with the authority and criteria contained in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.), the State CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Sections 15000 et seq.), and the environmental regulations of the City. Upon review, the project appears to qualify for a Class 5 (Minor Alterations in Land Use Limitations) in accordance with the requirements of Sections 15305 of the state CEQA Guidelines. Therefore, the City Council may find the project exempt from further review under CEQA.

tural Heritage Commission approved three new Golden Shield Award nominees to recognize sites and buildings that have cultural significance within the City.

Specifically, the Commission recommended La Dolce Vita Restaurant, Dolores Drive-In, and Wonderbread Bakery.

La Dolce Vita, which was located at 9785 South Santa Monica Boulevard, had its inaugural opening in 1966. The establishment was founded by former waiters Jimmy Ullo and George Smith, who previously worked at the "Villa Capri" Restaurant in Hollywood. Original investors included Frank Sinatra and George Raft. The interior, characterized by windowless spaces and red leather booths, was designed by Lyle Wheeler, a set designer from 20th Century Fox and a five-time Oscar-winner for set design. This venue attracted celebrities such as Clark Gable, Marilyn Monroe, Elizabeth Taylor, Lauren Bacall, Sammy Davis Jr., Gregory Peck, and even hosted President and Mrs. Reagan.

"The restaurant's romantic old-world atmosphere, impeccable service, and sumptuous New York style Italian cuisine were a perfect match for Holly-wood's glittering stars, who came to indulge in the restaurant's delicious food and bask in its old-world glamor," according to the staff report.

Delores' Drive-in Restaurant made its debut in 1946 at 8531 Wilshire Boulevard, embracing and celebrating Los Angeles' car culture by offering fast food served conveniently in customers' cars. The initial Restaurant was founded in 1930 in Oklahoma, situated along Route 66. Established by Amanda and Ralph Stevens, who relocated from Oklahoma to Los Angeles in 1944, they set up the first drive-in location in Hollywood. The Beverly Hills branch opened in 1956 but closed its doors in 1981 to make way for the construction of a new office complex.

While no longer in existence, Holsum Bakery commenced operations in 1924 at the intersection of Alpine Drive and North Santa Monica Boulevard. The bakery factory stood as one of the more notable industries in the region during that era, according to the staff report. The building was characterized as "attractive and harmonious," featuring a finish in a (plaster color with warm red tile trim

Holsum Bakery also operated plants in downtown Los Angeles and Long Beach. An advertisement after the Beverly Hills plant was completed stated, "Today, Holsum Twin-Loaf – the newest member of the Holsum family - makes its initial bow to the people of Southern California...The completion of the new Holsum bakery at Beverly Hills makes it possible for us to offer you this twin loaf...with our capacity greatly enlarged by the opening of one of the largest bakeries in the country," according to the staff report.

Holsum bread became known as "The Wonder Bread" and was purchased by Continental Baking Company in 1925.

Wonder Bread was among the first sold pre-sliced in the 1930s, which arguably shifted America's consumption of bread.

Other sites that were not approved included Arturo Shoe Fixx, Beverly Hills Garage, the Beverly Hills Athletic Club.

Upon final approval by the Cultural Heritage Commission, the nominees will move forward for review by the City Council.

City Council Approves POA Side Letter of Agreement

The City Council approved a Side Letter of Agreement with the Beverly Hills Police Officers' Association, the union representing BHPD officers, for a mental health evaluation team at last Thursday's meeting.

On May 24, 2022, the City Council approved the formation of the BHPD Mental Health Evaluation Team (MHET). Through this program, the BHPD and Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health (DMH) partnered to establish a team that will provide outreach for mentally ill people.

BHPD MHET provides field crisis intervention and psychiatric placement in some instances. The team consists of two officers and two social workers.

The goal of this model is to "provide comprehensive alternatives for mental health assistance and options other than incarceration for severely mentally ill persons, and to reduce incidents of use of force. MHET also attends and provides training for de-escalation, crisis negotiations during major incidents, averting use of force and reducing incarceration of the mentally ill," according to the staff report.

In order to attract interest among officers, the police department recommended a 5.5% bonus pay for officers selected for the assignment.

City to Kickoff 2024 Transportation Safety Campaign

The City will be kicking off the 2024 transportation campaign.

The City has previously completed various safety campaigns as part of events or projects that focused on transportation. For example, in 2019, city staff produced the Bicycle and Pedestrian Awareness Campaign meant to bring attention to traveling safely as cyclists and pedestrians.

This year's campaign is set to incorporate quarterly messages derived from the calls to action established in the 2023 campaign themes. The aim is to broaden the reach of the messaging strategies beyond those employed in the previous year.

In addition to traditional channels, the campaign will also utilize unconventional platforms like elevator clings, A-frames, streetlight banners, window decals, and more.

Under the campaign slogan – Traffic Safety Starts with Me – this campaign aims to teach all road users how to travel safely and keep each other safe on streets. The calls to action will feature first-person messages in an effort to help

inspire residents on how to make safer behavior choices when driving.

The winter message is, "I respect pedestrians and give them time to cross." State law has made it so that all intersections are legal crossing points with or without a marked crosswalk, according to the staff report. The campaign intends to remind drivers and cyclists to look for people crossing at intersections so they can yield to them. Drivers and cyclists should also come to a complete stop when exiting alleys and look for pedestrians before crossing over the sidewalk, according to the campaign.

Human Relations Commission to Revise Election Civility Statement

The Human Relations Commission is expected to discuss updating the Election Civility Statement, at its Thursday meeting.

At the Oct. 2023 Human meeting, Chair Noelle Freeman requested to add to the Nov. agenda a discussion of updating the Election Civility Statement. This was due to the fact that social media was not a political tool when this statement was created and adopted in 2010, and the Commission agreed that it should be updated to reflect the status quo.

If approved, the statement is expected to add the following:

- "We recognize the significant role of digital media and all online platforms in shaping public discourse. We encourage all community members to engage in online discussion with respect and empathy, fostering an environment where diverse perspectives are valued."
- "We believe that the examination of diverse candidates and challenging issues can be conducted with great civility, without resorting to personal attacks or the spread of misinformation."
- "We emphasize the importance of honesty and integrity in all aspects of civic engagement. Honesty builds trust, and integrity ensures that our community's values are upheld. Together let us exemplify the values of transparency, fairness, and ethical conduct to inspire the next generation of civic leaders."

If the commission recommends approval, it will be reviewed by City Council Liaisons.

City Council Approves Public Safety Grant

The City Council approved an appropriation of \$364,000 from the Law Enforcement Grant Fund, specifically the Citizens Option for Public Safety program account to fund purchases for the Police Department, at last Thursday's meeting.

The City receives a minimum of \$100,000.00 annually under the state grant program.

The Police Department has identified the need for additional qualified expenditures, according to the staff report. These purchases will be made in Fiscal Year 2023/2024 with funds acquired under the program.

WHERE WERE YOU DURING THE NORTHRIDGE EARTHQUAKE?

Thirty Years Later, the Weekly Looks Back

January 17, 1994

LINDA BRISKMAN FORMER MAYOR



We were at our weekend home in Palm Springs. I remember the jolt literally jarred us out of bed so we were sure the desert was near the center

of the quake. One of our daughters was back home in Beverly Hills so as soon as we heard it was in Northridge, we called home and found she was not hurt but cornered for a bit in our guest house surrounded by broken glass with no shoes close by. We left Palm Springs and headed right back home to find so much damage all over the city

ROSE KAISERMAN HUMAN RELATIONS COMMIS-SIONER



I happened to be on the All Cal ski trip in Squaw Valley at the time when the 1994 Northridge Earthquake hit. I recall some of

some of my friends

banging on our hotel door early in the morning after they heard the news. It was horrible not knowing if my family members were okay and what made it worse was that the telephone lines were tied up for hours. Luckily, aside from a few broken dishes and frames, there was no serious damage.

MYRA LURIE RECREATION AND PARKS CHAIR

I recall waking up to the sound of exploding transformers outside of my bedroom window. My husband and I each grabbed one of our two small kids and took refuge in our Toyota van along with our calico cat. On re-entering our house, I was relieved to find most of it



intact, except for the kitchen floor which was covered with a broken glass and sticky, salty, goopy combination of teriyaki sauce and other unknown liquids.

At 4:31 a.m., I, as most people, [was] sleeping. I was [also] halfway between graduating cum laude from my USC Master's program and meeting my future wife, Laura. I had

just started drumming with The Tokens, was gainfully employed by the City of Beverly Hills Recreation and Parks Department and besides the lack of seasons, the shaker was the first real reminder that I was truly living in Los Angeles.

I awoke at about 5 am to give a warm send- off to my son's then-fiancée about 10 of her family members. Most were from Cleveland, and all had staved with us in our

Beverly Hills home for pre- wedding festivities centered around a wedding shower. My house still overflowed with joy that early morning as everyone rushed to pack last-minute items and get to the airport in time for their respective flights.

The bride's brother was in the middle of putting in his contact lenses. He needed to get back to Columbia for the start of

the semester. With one contact lens in and the other perched on his finger, the earth started shaking and rolling. He froze, not wanting to lose the lens or his balance.

My husband rolled over in bed. "Just an earthquake," he called out, as he went back to sleep. Our Cleveland houseguests disagreed. EARTHQUAKE!!! Suddenly, they were delighted to be headed for the airport and home to terra firma. Until they heard news reports that the airport had closed down...

The Columbia student said he'd take his chances, and my son and he set out for the airport. And then they were back. No one was going anywhere that day. The earthquake turned out to be a great bonding experience, and everyone still comes back for at least one visit each year. And the wedding shower, already a spectacular and memorable event to us, became monumental --a true California experience.

I was at home on Alta Drive. The shaking was not that bad. I was "shocked" that the damage was so significant — e.g. the [collapse of the] 10 Freeway.

The shaking

was not nearly what I am currently experiencing as we cruise through the icefields to the Ross Sea, [Antarctica].

LILLIAN RAFFEL ROTARY PRESIDENT




I was President of the Board of Education during that time. When it was light (the power was out in our area) I headed over to the schools to assess the situation. I first

visited El Rodeo, where I found the maintenance team already present. Water was gushing out of broken pipes into the basement area below the main building and damaged the HVAC system. Next, I went to Beverly Vista, where the older buildings didn't look too bad from the outside. However, we found out later that the integrity of the older buildings was severely damaged. Structural engineers deemed it dangerous to inhabit. Board members went to the other schools to assess the damage. Superintendent Sol Levine drove in from Thousand Oaks to coordinate things.

It was a heartbreaking situation in many ways, especially because we had recently passed a bond measure to update all the schools, but the funds were barely enough to cover the modernization. With this extensive damage, we had to divert the money for earthquake repairs instead. It was the beginning of a long road to recovery for the schools. We were grateful that the school was not in session during the earthquake, so no students or staff were at risk.



My wife and I were in bed at home on South Oakhurst Drive. We quickly discovered that the kitchen was a mess, tiles and stucco walls were cracked and

that we would need a new chimney. Surprisingly we did not lose a single bottle of wine

I was awakened around 4:30 a.m. with the kind of earthquake I never felt before. It was as though nature had lifted our house off of its foundation and then dropped it

back. Dishes were crashing in the kitchen and glass was breaking throughout the house. My kids sprinted from their bedroom into our bed. We immediately turned on the TV to follow events through the calming voice of Lucy Jones of Caltech. After everyone in the house was settled down, I got dressed and drove over to my mother-in-law's house a few minutes from our house. She was fine. From there I drove over to Sherman Oaks, which was then in my council district and where considerable damage, and one fatality, had occurred. The Ralph's at Ventura Blvd. and Hazeltine was on fire. It was a mess. The response was immediate and robust. President Clinton arrived at Burbank Airport two days later with what felt like half of the United States Government. We toured the damage in Northridge and the collapse of the Simi Freeway/I-5 interchange. We gave the President and his team a full briefing of the region-wide damage. Clinton was determined to differentiate this response from the fiasco of the Hurricane Andrew response in Florida a little over a year before. Governor Pete Wilson expedited the repair of the collapsed Santa Monica Freeway between La Cienega and Robertson. The President, the Governor, Mayor [Rick] Riordan, and the City Council worked seamlessly to get L.A. back on its feet. It was emergency response at its best.


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
